May the Lord grant you understanding of this prayer journal as you pray, consequent upon which there will be changes in your life or your prayer group or Family, Church, Nation, and Continent. <u>What is presented are not</u> Jewish Dates or the Jewish calendar but what the LORD instituted which we all see manifested in the movement of the Moon every month. The enemy has always manipulated these bodies for which believers are just becoming aware. This season is also a special edition of revelation which brings a new breath of fresh air without adding to the word of God but confirms it and makes our faith stronger.

You may wish to pray in two ways:-

- 1. You can pray using the whole journal to pray into the womb of time according to the authority level granted to you by your appointment in the Lord. Expect the prophetic germination [as you saturate the ground and the womb of time with God's ordination] to happen. In any case ensure your seed remains in the ground as investment for the coming year. Determine, and command what this month should deliver to you and what it should not and must Not.
- 2. You can also use this daily for your prayers AND DEVOTION to prevail at the gate of each day, especially on critical days of intense warfare in the heavens. Remember that the day starts from 6pm for the next 24 hours. If you are in Britain for instance the time will be early hours of the next day in Hong Kong @ your 6pm.
- 3. This document may seem lengthy, but it shows the effort that was generated in prayer. You can keep it and save it for use in a good way.

Pray that your prophetic faculties will be on the rise and be enlarged and sharp...<u>visions;</u> dreams; interpreting symbols; applying parables; riddles; revelation and predictions; accurate delivery of words of wisdom and words of knowledge; intercessions; interaction with heaven etc.. Divine decrees to cause the future and many other such faculties.

SHAPE YOUR DAY, MONTH AND CONSEQUENTLY YOUR YEARS

Ignorance of what every month holds for you, your family, community, nation, the church and the continent at large has caused many to perish, miss out or not fully access what God has in store for them.

Understanding the heavens and what they signify every month is another very key aspect as we enter this new level of our assignments among the nations. While the kingdom of darkness has used astrology, prognostications, and all manner of demonic methods to control the activities on earth using the heavens, the church continues in ignorance. They have even employed materialism to blind believers in Jesus Christ, whereas <u>all things are yours</u>

We thank God for the many people whom He is raising in different parts of the world to understand what the heavens hold for us every month. As you seek deeper understanding, the Holy Spirit will guide you into greater revelations. Amen.

<u>Redemption Lift – Rising into Purpose,</u> <u>Destiny and Dignity</u>

Introduction: The Lifting Power of Redemption

Imagine being stuck in a deep pit—miry clay clinging to your feet, no way out on your own. Then someone reaches down, pulls you up, and sets you on solid ground (Psalm 40:2). That is what <u>Redemption Lift</u> means: redemption through Christ does not just wipe away our past sins; it lifts us into a brand-new life. When Jesus redeems us, He raises us from the lowest places and seats us in heavenly places with Him (Ephesians 2:6). We are not only forgiven—we are elevated into purpose, destiny, dignity, and fruitfulness as beloved children of God.

In this lead article, we will explore how Christ's redemption lifts us in our identity, legacy, purpose, influence, and spiritual authority. Along the way, reallife stories from different cultures and rich biblical promises will show that this hope is universal.

Lifted Identity: From Orphan to Child of God

One of the first things redemption lifts is our identity. We go from being spiritual orphans—lost and defined by sin—to being called sons and daughters of the King. In the Old Testament, God spoke tenderly to Israel: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are Mine" (Isaiah 43:1). To be redeemed is to be claimed by God. He knows your name and gives you a new identity. In the New Testament, we see this truth fulfilled: "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!" (1 John

3:1). Through Christ, we are adopted into God's family with the full rights of sons and daughters (Galatians 4:7).

Consider the transformation of a young woman from a low caste in India. *Priya* grew up labeled as "untouchable" in her society, carrying shame and feeling worthless. When she encountered Jesus, she learned that He gives dignity to the despised. Scripture revealed she is "fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psalm 139:14), and that in Christ, social divisions are removed — "you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:28). *Priya* realized God calls her His daughter. No longer an outcast, she now walks with confidence as a beloved child of God. Christ's redemption lifted her identity from shame to dignity.

Action Points – Embracing Your New Identity:

• Meditate on who God says you are: Read Ephesians 1:3-6 and list the identity words (chosen, adopted, loved, etc.) that apply to you. Let these truths replace any negative labels you've believed about yourself.

• Declare it daily: Each morning, affirm: "In Christ, I am God's beloved child— I have worth and purpose." Let this truth renew your mind (Romans 12:2) so you live confidently in your God-given identity.

Lifted Legacy: Changing Generations to Come

Redemption doesn't just change your life—it can lift future generations and those connected to you. When God redeems, He often sets off a chain reaction of blessing that forms a new legacy. Think of Rahab in the Old Testament: once a prostitute in Jericho, she chose to trust the God of Israel and helped the Hebrew spies. God not only spared her life but brought her into Israel's community. Rahab even became an ancestor of Jesus – a life of shame turned into a legacy of honour by God's grace.

In Africa, there's a true story of a man named Kwame who was trapped in alcoholism and despair, following the same broken path as his father. Kwame found Christ and everything changed. God lifted him out of addiction— "He raises the poor from the dust and lifts the needy from the ash heap" (Psalm 113:7). Kwame became a new man and now leads his family with love. Today his children are growing up in a stable Christian home with hope for the future. The cycle of brokenness was broken by redemption, just as "the Lord's love is with those who fear Him, and His righteousness with their children's children" (Psalm 103:17).

God promises in Joel 2:25 to restore the years the locusts have eaten. What was lost or destroyed in past generations can be restored when God's redemption

enters the story. Your family history may be full of pain or failure, but you can be the turning point. Like Abraham, who by faith became a blessing to all nations (Genesis 12:2-3), your step of faith can start a new legacy in your family line.

Action Points – Building a Godly Legacy:

• Pray for your family: Whether or not your family believes yet, pray for each relative by name. Ask God to redeem and bless them. Your prayers lay a foundation for their salvation.

• Invest in the next generation: Invest in the next generation—your kids, relatives, or youth in your community. Share with them what God has done in your life and teach them Scripture. Even if you have no children of your own, be a mentor or spiritual parent to someone younger to pass on a legacy of faith.

Lifted Purpose: From Wandering to Divine Destiny

Another dimension of Redemption Lift is purpose. We are lifted from aimlessness into God's destiny for us. Without Christ, we often wander, unsure of why we're here. But salvation infuses our lives with meaning. "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). God has specific plans for each of us – a calling to fulfil, a role in His Kingdom. When He redeems us, He sets us on that path.

Consider the apostle Paul: he was hunting Christians one day, but after encountering Jesus, he was commissioned as "a chosen instrument to carry My name before Gentiles and kings" (Acts 9:15). Paul went from persecutor to preacher in a moment—lifted into a world-changing mission by Jesus! In the same way, God takes our broken pieces and gives us a purpose beyond ourselves.

One living example comes from East Asia. Lee was climbing the corporate ladder in his city but felt empty inside. After he encountered Christ, he realized his career was part of a higher calling. Lee began to mentor his coworkers and even started a Bible study during lunch at the office. Eventually, he changed careers to help underprivileged youth. He says he went from "making a living" to making a difference. That's the power of redemption—God <u>repurposing our talents for</u> <u>His glory</u>.

Even if we don't change jobs or move to another country, redemption gives us a new perspective right where we are. Your workplace, school, home or community becomes a mission field. A schoolteacher might realize her classroom is a place to show God's love. A retiree might find new purpose in mentoring young believers. No life is too small to be significant in God's plan. When Jesus restores us, "all things work together for good for those who are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). We start living intentionally, knowing our lives matter in God's grand story.

Action Points – Stepping into Your Purpose:

• Seek God for direction: Take time this week to pray about your purpose. Ask God, "What have You called me to do right now? Who can I impact?" Then listen for His guidance through prayer and Scripture (see Proverbs 3:5-6, James 1:5).

• Take a step of faith: Purpose is fulfilled one step at a time. If you feel God nudging you to serve or start something, take the first step this week—whether volunteering, sharing your testimony with a friend, or something else. Trust that God will guide you as you move forward.

Lifted Influence: Shining in the Marketplace and Society

Redemption doesn't remove us from the world; it sends us back in with a greater influence. Jesus said to His followers, "You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:13-14). Salt preserves and light illuminates. A "lifted" life means we carry Kingdom values into our workplaces, schools, and communities, becoming agents of change. Christ's redemption lifts our influence in the marketplace and society so we can point others to Him.

The Bible gives us inspiring examples. Joseph was sold into slavery, but God's favor lifted him to become prime minister of Egypt, saving many lives during a famine (Genesis 41). Daniel, a Jewish exile in Babylon, likewise stayed faithful and was promoted to high office, leading even kings to honour God (Daniel 6). <u>These men didn't preach sermons from a pulpit</u>, but their integrity and God-given wisdom in secular positions brought glory to the Lord. Their redemption stories affected entire nations.

In modern times, consider a story from South America. A businessman in Brazil named Antonio came to Christ in the middle of his career. After he met Jesus, Antonio began to run his company by biblical principles—<u>honesty</u>, <u>fairness</u>, <u>generosity</u>. Some predicted his profits would fall, but instead his business thrived and gained respect. He even launched a job-training program for unemployed youth. People noticed the change and asked about his faith. Antonio's transformed business shines the light of Christ in a practical way.

You might be a student, a taxi driver, an office worker, or a stay-at-home parent – wherever you are, Jesus calls you to be a "letter from Christ" that others can read (2 Corinthians 3:3). Your work done "as unto the Lord" (Colossians 3:23) becomes both worship and witness. By our integrity, kindness, and excellence, we earn trust and opportunities to share Christ. This is how redemption lifts our

societal influence: we become ambassadors for Christ (2 Corinthians 5:20) in every sphere of life, demonstrating His love and truth in the public square.

Action Points – Being Salt and Light in Your World:

• Identify your mission field: List the main places you spend time (work, school, neighbourhood, home). Identify one practical way to reflect Christ in each—whether through kindness, integrity, or speaking about your faith.

• Stay accountable to integrity: Decide to maintain honesty and Christ-like character in all your dealings (no cheating, gossip, or cutting corners). Consider partnering with a Christian friend to pray for each other about workplace or school challenges. Remember Proverbs 11:3: "The integrity of the upright guides them." Your consistent integrity will make you stand out and shine for God's glory.

Lifted Authority: Victory in Spiritual Battles

Finally, redemption lifts us into spiritual authority. Before Christ we were slaves to sin and vulnerable to the enemy, but through Jesus we become victors. He gives us authority over "all the power of the enemy" (Luke 10:19). God has even raised us up and seated us with Christ above every spiritual power (Ephesians 2:6; 1:20-22). We are no longer victims of spiritual darkness.

This means we can pray with confidence, resist temptation, and overcome oppression by the power of the Holy Spirit. Scripture says we overcome the accuser "by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of our testimony" (Revelation 12:11). Because of Jesus' blood, even the weakest believer can say to Satan, "I belong to Jesus now—you have no claim on me." When Christ lifts you, He gives you His name and His authority to rebuke fear, bind demonic influence, and claim freedom for yourself and others.

A dramatic testimony comes from one of our missionary fields in West Africa. A man named Samuel was long tormented by evil spirits—his family had been involved in witchcraft for generations. When Samuel accepted Christ, he finally experienced peace. One night an evil presence tried to attack him in his sleep. Instead of cowering, Samuel called on Jesus' name and renounced all ties to darkness. The oppression fled! Later, Samuel even led his mother—a witch doctor—to Jesus. Now they help others find freedom in Christ.

Walking in spiritual authority doesn't mean life will be easy, but we now face challenges from a position of victory. God gives us spiritual armour for battle (Ephesians 6:10-18), so we can pray boldly, stand on truth against Satan's lies, and intercede for others. A lifted life pushes back darkness and advances God's light.

Action Points – Exercising Your Spiritual Authority:

• Know your weapons: Each day, put on the spiritual "armour of God" (Ephesians 6:10-18) – *truth, righteousness, the gospel of peace, faith, salvation, God's* <u>*Word, and prayer*</u>. Identify which piece you need to strengthen (maybe growing in faith, or spending more time in Scripture, etc.).

• Stand with others: *Don't battle alone. Find a prayer partner or small group at church to pray with regularly.* "For where two or three gather in My name, there am I with them" (Matthew 18:20). Praying together strengthens your faith and multiplies courage in spiritual battles. Remind each other of your identity and authority in Christ.

Conclusion: Living the Lifted Life

The "**Redemption Lift**" is not just a theory—it's a living reality we are called to walk in every day. Jesus has lifted us from despair and death to a life of hope and purpose. Our response is to live as people whom He has set free and lifted up by His grace. That means embracing our new identity as God's children, building a legacy of faith and blessing, pursuing our God-given purpose, influencing our world for good, and standing strong in spiritual authority. It's a life rich with hope and dignity, no matter what our past looked like.

You might ask, "Can this lifted life be mine? I've made so many mistakes, or I feel so low right now." Yes, it absolutely can be yours—because it depends not on you, but on Jesus who will lift you up. The Bible assures us, "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" (Romans 10:13). Jesus Christ has already paid for your redemption by His death and resurrection. He extends His hand to you today.

If you haven't yet experienced this redemption, you can start now. In a quiet moment, talk to Jesus in prayer. Admit your need for Him, ask for His forgiveness, and invite Him to take charge as your Saviour and Lord. It's as simple as saying, "Jesus, I give You my life. I believe You died for me and rose again. Please forgive my sins and lift me into the new life You have for me." He will hear you. Just as He lifted people up in Scripture—like the prodigal son who went from a pig-pen back to the father's house (Luke 15:20-24)—He will lift you up and give you a new start.

If you already know Christ, make it your aim to live out your lifted life to the fullest. Don't settle for a shallow faith—press into all that redemption means. Let

gratitude overflow and share your testimony so others can have hope. Day by day, Jesus will keep lifting you toward greater maturity and fruitfulness (Philippians 1:6).

Wherever you are in the world, anywhere globally, this truth stands: Redemption in Christ lifts you. It lifts you out of sin and despair into a life of hope and purpose. Embrace the upward call of God (Philippians 3:14) and experience the joy of a life raised by His grace. May your lifted life shine so that others are drawn to Jesus, the Redeemer who lifts us all. Amen.

We must think deeply about making Jesus known. He has given us the Holy Spirit, the Bible and many preachers but we need to be trained in our minds on how to be effective for the Lord.

Experience has shown that if we just count on our love and passion to make inroads in the mission field or as pastors or in ministry, we'd likely become burnt out and quit very soon. Instead, God gave us the wisdom to prepare. The interest you expressed at the AWMC24, must remain burning and you have opportunity to be trained.

If you just show up in ministry, hearts full of love for God and eager to make big changes for His Kingdom, you will likely be back home early, burnt out and disappointed.

Instead, God gives us the wisdom to slow down and discover how we could effectively work on His behalf, using the talents, skills, and education He blessed us with.

God cut us out for this work, but we are presently rough and unpolished. Fullstature College of the Bible and Missions (FCBM) will help take out the raw edges, sand out the splinters and prepared you for God to add the varnish, readying us to begin your work. Don't get us wrong we have always been a little unfinished, but God has helped us to help others since 1994. In this work, we will always need to be learning, growing, and adapting.

Missionary Challenge

The countries that have received the greatest amount of Western missionary attention over two centuries contain the greatest number of unreached and unreached people groups: China and India (which once included Pakistan and Bangladesh).

PROPHETIC PRAYER FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL 2025

David and others prophesied often in the Psalms about the whole earth experiencing salvation. These were prophecies about the kingdom. David, who was a king, prophesied often about the greater kingdom of his Seed, Christ, the Messiah. Some of those prophecies in the Book of Psalms are shown below:

- "You are My Son ... I will give You the nations for Your inheritance" (Ps. 2:7-8).
- "All the families of the nations shall worship before You" (Ps. 22:27).
- "The earth is the LORD'S" (Ps. 24:1).
- "According to Your name, O God, so is Your praise to the ends of the earth" (Ps. 48:10).
- "You who are the confidence of all the ends of the earth" (Ps. 65:5).
- "All nations whom You have made shall come and worship before you, O Lord" (Ps. 86:10).

• "The nations shall fear the name of the LORD, and all the kings of the earth Your glory" (*Ps. 102:15*).

• "Be exalted, O God, above the heavens, and Your glory above all the earth" (Ps. 108:5).

The vision of the prophets was always global. The kingdom would not be limited to Israel but would encompass all nations. The scribes and teachers understood this but did not understand how it would be accomplished. It would come through the death of the Messiah, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the preaching of the gospel.

When reading these scriptures there should be no doubt of the plan and purpose of God. This purpose comes through the church, the new-creation people, who will become a global phenomenon. The church could not be limited to Jerusalem. The Book of Acts is the story of the church and kingdom breaking out of the framework of the old covenant and breaking forth throughout the whole earth.

Adopt-A-Missionary- A Missions' Strategy

...a strategy for loving the missionary family as well as the people groups, they serve

Adopt-A-Missionary is a mission strategy that has gained momentum in missions over the years. What makes this strategy different is its focus. Historically, churches have focused on countries, and mission agencies have focused their attention on people groups. Adopt-A-Missionary focuses *on missionary families, or what we can call message bearers*.

For 5 years, my wife (of blessed memory) and I served as missionary representatives to the Kenyan peoples of East Africa. We divided the nation of Kenya into 6. Working with the missionary on ground we had a plan to evangelise the nation. We raised teams of two by two from Nigeria and planted 6 churches throughout the country. In the last 29 years + the FMI missionary teams have been helped by God to open the gospel among 40 unreached people groups. Our FMC churches faithfully prayed and the missionaries that we served with, and the church has supported them financially.

In 1990 for example, we were relocated to Kano with two major tribes- the Kanawas and Magusawas. We were led of the Lord to pay more attention to *tribal missions in 1993, where the gospel has never been heard while maintaining a church base.* Thankfully, our churches have continued to pray for and support the mission's effort with this strategic ministry.

ADOPT-A-Missionary Defined

What then does it mean to Adopt-A-missionary? It means committing yourself as an individual, fellowship group, local congregation, denomination, or mission agency to pray for and commit resources to win souls, establish believers, administrate the work within a specific people group through a missionary family or families. This commitment is continued until the believers in that people group can reach the rest of their people without outside (cross-cultural) assistance.

We are agents of God praying, giving, and serving to see an adopted family reach out to bring sinners into God's family. This is the true meaning of Adopting a missionary family. One day this will be accomplished, and every tribe, tongue, people, and nation will give glory to God around His throne (Rev. 5:9).

Adopt a Missionary Family

Fullstature Missions International is committed to the work of missions and has developed a ministry to bring into focus the Great Commission (Matt 28:19-20) set forth by Christ and to support missionary families need. We ask that your family prayerfully consider adopting a missionary family to be a blessing and to be blessed. After you have made an adoption, we encourage you can send your missionary family an email to share about your family and to ask them to share with you. The FMI becomes a bridge to help people you may never know or meet. You can reach out to the missionary during Holidays, birthdays, or anniversaries or just at any time. Commit to lift your missionary up in prayer. (Phil 6)

It is also our desire to support more missionaries through our ministry budget than we currently can do. The missionaries we support currently are under-supported. In other words, the support we grant is not adequate. In most cases, we are nearly able (with Naira) to provide what will

keep body and soul together leaving projects in the field undone. This is where you pause and do something.

It is our goal to ensure that every Missionary, supported through, (what we call) the General Fund which includes the "Faith Promise Offering" (FPO), are missionaries we, as a ministry want to support.

The money these Missionaries receive is totally dependent on what is given by the individual or families who have adopted them.

Example: Missionary "Felix" may have two families in First Baptist Church which chose to adopt him. They do so for a combined support of \$200 per month, one for \$75 per month and one for \$125 per month. Should the family who chose to support Missionary "Felix" for \$125 per month be unable to do so for any reason, Missionary "Felix" would only receive \$75 for that month. There will be a "shortfall" and the family who was unable to give what they had purposed to give would not be contacted and asked, "Where is your contribution".

If you have a desire to support a Missionary, please feel free to fill out a "Adopt-A-Missionary Request Form" and return it to our ministry office.

Build a Relationship

Develop a relationship with your adopted missionary family. Learn about their ministry and their ups and downs so that you know when to Praise God with them and when to lift them up in prayer. Being a missionary can have very hard times and there is great comfort when a missionary knows that God is always there and that there are people supporting them at every step.

Faith Promise

In addition to your commitment to get to know and pray for your adopted missionary, you may consider supporting your missionary financially. Among some of the greatest difficulties that missionaries face is having their financial needs met. Missionaries typically spend a significant amount of time raising monies to support their ministries which in turn reduces the amount of time out in the field.

TUESDAY, APRIL 1: The Power of Redemption

Declaration: I have access. Nothing is withheld from me in Christ. I walk in divine revelation and provision.

WEDNESDAY APRIL 23: Redeemed to Carry Fire

Scripture: "He makes His ministers a flame of fire." – Hebrews 1:7

Inspiration: Redemption lifts you into a life of spiritual power. You are not saved to be passive—you are called to burn with holiness, intercession, and revival fire. The redeemed are not cold—they are ablaze for God.

Historical Testimony: John Wesley, a once lukewarm person, had a personal encounter with the Holy Spirit that lit a fire in his bones. He went on to lead one of the greatest revivals in England and America. "My heart was strangely warmed," he said—and so was history.

FRIDAY APRIL 25: Redeemed from the Pit

Scripture: "He lifted me out of the pit of despair, out of the mud and the mire; He set my feet on solid ground." – Psalm 40:2 (NLT)

Declaration: I am not rejected—I am redeemed. God delights in me, and I am deeply loved.



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SUNDAY APRIL 27: Redemption Transforms Pain into Power

Scripture: "What you meant for evil, God meant it for good..." – Genesis 50:20.

Inspiration: Every scar can become a symbol of strength. Redemption turns trauma into triumph, pain into power, and betrayal into birthing. What the enemy meant to destroy you becomes the very fuel that launches your destiny. God wastes nothing.



Instruction to Access Redemption Lift:


- Begin every day with thanksgiving and prophetic declarations.

Declaration: I walk in Redemption Lift daily. I am loaded with divine benefits and heavenly help.



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


Medical view of His suffering by G. Bradley, M.D.


