Remember that the day starts from 6pm for the next 24 hours. If you are in Britain for instance the time will be early hours of the next day in Hong Kong @ your 6pm.
3. This document may seem lengthy, but it shows the effort that was generated in prayer. You can keep it and save it for use in a good way.

Pray that your prophetic faculties will be on the rise and be enlarged and sharp...visions; dreams; interpreting symbols; applying parables; riddles; revelation and predictions; accurate delivery of words of wisdom and words of knowledge; intercessions; interaction with heaven etc.. Rewire Systems for Divine Order: Restoring God's Pattern in Christian Families

Introduction: A Cry for Alignment

We are living in a time where the foundational unit of society—the family—is under intense pressure and fragmentation. Divorce, broken communication, absentee parenting, and reversed roles have become increasingly normalized, even within Christian homes. Yet God's design for family has never changed. He is calling us to rewire our systems—to realign our thinking, structures, and priorities to reflect divine order.

To rewire something means to reconnect, restructure, and realign the internal framework to function correctly. In the context of Christian families, this involves a complete spiritual and practical renovation of how we view marriage, parenting, roles, discipline, legacy, and love. Divine order is not rigid control—it is heaven's blueprint for flourishing relationships rooted in Christ.

The Blueprint: God's Original Design for the Family

From the very beginning, God instituted the family as a divine construct (Genesis 2:18–24). Adam and Eve were not just the first couple—they were the first family unit, charged with stewarding creation, multiplying godly offspring (Malachi 2:15), and walking in fellowship with God.

Key Elements of God's Family Blueprint:

- Christ-Centred Leadership (Ephesians 5:23): The man as the servant-leader, reflecting Christ's sacrificial love.

- **Mutual Submission and Honor (Ephesians 5:21):** Love and respect flowing in both directions.
- **Spiritual Nurturing (Deuteronomy 6:6–7):** Parents teaching children God’s Word in daily life and showing them things to come.
- **Generational Blessing (Psalm 112:1–2):** Obedience to God producing lasting legacy

When these components are disrupted, disorder sets in. Marriages become competitive rather than complementary, children grow up without spiritual direction, and families crumble under cultural confusion.

Systemic Dysfunction in Today’s Christian Homes

Modern Christian families often carry inherited dysfunctions. These could be cultural norms, emotional wounds, or broken models passed from generation to generation. For instance:

- A father raised in a home without affection may struggle to affirm his children.
- A mother who never saw partnership in decision-making may overcompensate in control.
- Children raised on screen-based babysitting may lack identity, discipline, or faith formation.

This is illustrated by Sarah and James, a Christian couple, who found themselves constantly fighting. James, a pastor’s child, had learned to suppress emotions. Sarah came from a single-parent home and never saw healthy conflict resolution. Their marriage suffered until they began a 6-month discipleship program that rewired their thinking and healed their past. Today, they lead a marriage support group in their church.

Biblical Models of Rewiring Family Systems

Joshua: “As for Me and My House” (Joshua 24:15). Joshua, though surrounded by idolatrous nations and compromised Israelites, made a bold declaration to rewire his family system. He didn’t wait for consensus; he established a godly standard. ***“2 And Joshua said unto all the people, Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Your fathers dwelt on the other side of the flood in old time, even Terah, the father of Abraham, and the father of Nachor: and they served other gods.” (Joshua 24:2, AV).*** The children of Israel themselves served other gods. But Joshua would not follow compromised Israel and the corrupt nations that surrounded them.

Abraham is another example in ***“the Journey of Obedience (Genesis 18:19)”***. God trusted Abraham with generational influence ***because he would command his children and household after him***. Divine order involves teaching and modelling faith consistently—not perfectly, but persistently. Many years ago a particular model school invited me to minister to some unruly children. It was in the course of that ministration that I learned that these were children of disciplined Christian parents who with intention sent their children back to Nigeria from the United States of America to be given a solid basic education and discipline and then return them to the USA.

The scriptures record the pattern in Eli vs. Samuel (1 Samuel 2–3) family. Eli, though a priest, failed to discipline his sons, and it cost him his legacy. Samuel, who grew under Eli, rewired the system and corrected the pattern by disciplining his own children and maintaining reverence for God.

We have to do the same rewiring in our modern age as many families are filled with stories of transformation. *Bishop Uzo and his wife Mary* once struggled with balancing ministry and parenting. Their three children began drifting from faith, feeling “neglected by God and by dad.” The Uzors paused international ministry for a season, initiated daily family worship, open talks, and intentional mentoring of each child. Today, all three are leaders in their generation—one a worship leader, one a missionary doctor, and one an education reformer.

John and Alicia were both successful professionals, John and Alicia outsourced much of their parenting to schools and church programs. When their teen was caught with drugs, it was a wake-up call. Through counselling and prayer, they rewired their home: reduced outside commitments, began praying together, introduced boundaries with love, and rebuilt emotional bridges. Healing came, and today their son leads a youth outreach program.

Practical Steps to Rewire for Divine Order

I. Conducting a Family Audit: A Step Toward Divine Order

A family audit is a prayerful, honest evaluation of your home’s spiritual, emotional, and relational health. It helps uncover where your family is aligned—or misaligned—with God’s original design.

Key Questions:

- What values are currently shaping our home?
- Is Christ at the centre of our decisions and priorities?
- Are roles being honoured in love and humility?
- Is there unresolved hurt, dysfunction, or spiritual neglect?
- Are we disciplining our children intentionally?

Action Step:

Gather as a family. With openness and love, ask these questions together. Invite the Holy Spirit to lead. Write down areas needing attention—and commit to rebuilding, one step at a time. “Let all things be done decently and in order.” – 1 Corinthians 14:40.

II. Restoring the Family Altar: Reclaiming the Heart of the Home

The family altar is not just a place—it is a daily habit of worship, prayer, and the Word that centres the home around God. It is where families meet with the Lord together, just as Abraham did (Genesis 12:7–8). In many homes, this altar has been neglected—buried under busyness, distractions, or disunity. But restoration is possible.

How to Begin:

- Set a consistent time (morning or evening).
- Keep it simple: Read a passage, pray together, share thoughts.
- Let everyone participate: From toddlers to teens, include every voice.
- Make it sacred: Remove distractions, honour the moment.

Result:

Restoring the family altar brings divine presence, unity, and generational faith. It becomes a well of peace and power in your home. “The fire shall ever be burning upon the altar; it shall never go out.” – Leviticus 6:13.

Isaiah 51:16...Looking at present truth apostolic thought, this verse is often seen as a divine strategy for kingdom restoration:

- “Put my words in thy mouth” = Commissioning leaders (Parents, CEO etc..) with revelation and authority.
- “Covered thee...” = Empowering them with divine backing and spiritual protection.
- “Plant the heavens...” = Establishing Kingdom order in the spirit realm—shifting atmospheres and principalities. Affect the created order.
- “Lay the foundations of the earth...” = Rebuilding societies, systems, and institutions in alignment with God’s justice.
- “Say to Zion...” = Restoring identity and purpose to God’s people.

This view sees prophetic utterance, spiritual covering, and societal transformation as being linked, that is to change the conditions of your family and street and church..

III. Redefining Family Roles: Returning to God’s Design

In a world of shifting norms, families thrive when each member embraces their God-given role with humility and grace. Redefining roles doesn’t mean enforcing hierarchy—it means restoring harmony.

Biblical Roles in Brief:

- Husband – Servant-leader, protector, priest (Ephesians 5:25)
- Wife – Wise builder, nurturer, strength bearer (Proverbs 14:1, Titus 2:4–5)
- Children – Honourable learners and joyful contributors (Ephesians 6:1–3)

Why It Matters:

When roles are neglected, confusion, conflict, and competition arise. But when embraced, roles produce order, love, and legacy. When roles are reversed or neglected the church does not grow or it becomes unhealthy.

Action Point:

Pray together as a family. Recommit to honouring each other’s roles—not by culture’s definition, but by Scripture’s example. “Let each one of you in particular so love... and let the wife see that she respects...” – Ephesians 5:33

IV. Establishing Kingdom Culture in the Family: Raising a God-centred Standard

Culture isn’t just what we say—it’s what we live daily. A Kingdom culture in the family is one where Christ’s values govern how we think, speak, love, and lead at home.

It’s seen in:

- Kindness over criticism
- Forgiveness over grudges
- Purpose over pressure
- Worship over worry
- Service over selfishness

How to Cultivate It:

- Be intentional with your words, traditions, and time.
- Let the fruit of the Spirit guide your reactions (Galatians 5:22–23).
- Celebrate growth, grace, and godliness more than achievements.

Remember:

You don't raise a godly generation by accident—you do it by living out a visible, consistent Kingdom culture.

Breaking Generational Curses, Addictions, Fatherlessness, and Undermining Spirits

A. Generational Curses

Definition:

Patterns of sin, affliction, or dysfunction passed down through family lines (Exodus 20:5).

Examples:

- Cycles of poverty, divorce, rage, barrenness, or untimely death.
- Repeated patterns despite repentance or effort.

Biblical Insight:

Christ became a curse for us (Galatians 3:13) so we can walk free from inherited bondage.

Action Point:

Renounce ancestral covenants, declare God’s promises, and walk in new identity.

Prayer & Action:

Father, I renounce every ungodly pattern in my bloodline. I break all inherited curses by the blood of Jesus. I declare a new cycle of blessing begins with me. Amen.

B. Addictions

Definition:

Compulsive dependencies that enslave the body, mind, or spirit (Romans 6:16).

Types:

- **Substance (alcohol, drugs)**
- **Behavioural (pornography, gambling, screens)**
- **Emotional (approval, anger)**

Biblical Insight:

Jesus came to set captives free (Luke 4:18). His truth breaks the power of strongholds (John 8:32).

Action Point:

Expose the root, seek healing, engage accountability, and replace bondage with truth and discipline.

Prayer & Action:

Lord, I confess all addictive behaviours and break their hold over my life. I receive your power to live in freedom. I replace every addiction with the joy of your presence.

C. Fatherlessness (an orphan spirit)

Definition:

Absence (physical or emotional) of a father, leaving a void in identity and security.

Effects:

- **Rebellion, insecurity, mistrust of authority**
- **Struggles with identity, especially in sons**
- **Emotional gaps in daughters, risk of premature attachments**

Biblical Insight:

God is “a father to the fatherless” (Psalm 68:5). In Christ, we are adopted into divine family (Romans 8:15).

Action Point:

Heal the wound through the Father’s love, raise up spiritual fathers, and restore generational blessing.

Prayer & Action:

Father, heal the wound of fatherlessness in my life. Fill every void with your love and restore my identity as your child. Raise me as a vessel of generational healing.

D. Undermining Spirits**Definition:**

Subtle forces or attitudes that weaken God’s order—often through rebellion, dishonour, or division.

Forms:

- **Speaking against authority**
- **Secret resistance in marriage or leadership**
- **Cultural compromise that weakens biblical standards**

Biblical Insight:

Satan’s first tactic in Eden was to undermine God’s Word (Genesis 3:1). Kingdom culture thrives on alignment, not sabotage.

Action Point:

Discern and address attitudes that resist divine order. Restore truth, honor, and unity.

Prayer & Action:

Lord, expose and remove every spirit of dishonour and rebellion in me. I choose truth, humility, and honour. Let your order and peace reign in my life and family.

Steps:

- * **Repent: For past disobedience or neglect.**
- * **Renounce: Patterns of dysfunction, fear, and bitterness.**
- * **Restore: Through forgiveness and reconciliation.**
- * **Rebuild: New systems based on love, truth, and accountability.**

Prayer Declaration:

“Lord, restore divine order in our home. Let Jesus be the center, let love be the culture, let truth be our foundation, and let legacy be our reward.”

Rewiring for Legacy

The goal isn't just a peaceful home—it's a generational legacy. A family in divine order is a seed of revival. Your obedience today affects unborn generations.

2 Timothy 1:5 (NKJV): "I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also." Timothy's legacy was faithfulness, not fame.

Definition:

To rewrite for legacy means to intentionally break destructive cycles and begin a new script—one that honours God and blesses generations.

Why It Matters:

Your obedience today rewrites the story of tomorrow. Legacies are not built by wishful thinking but by deliberate choices rooted in God's truth.

Biblical Insight:

"A good man leaves an inheritance to his children's children..." – Proverbs 13:22

Action Point:

Identify negative patterns in your lineage. Break them in prayer. Build new values, disciplines, and testimonies that your children will celebrate and continue.

Declaration:

I am the pivot point in my bloodline. By God's grace, I write a new legacy of faith, favor, and fruitfulness.

Conclusion: The Call to Rebuild:

Every Christian family must take the call to rewire seriously. The world offers noise, confusion, and false freedom—but God offers divine order, peace, and purpose.

Definition:

The call to rebuild is heaven's invitation to rise from ruins—whether in family, ministry, community, or personal identity—and restore God's order. Your home can become: A revival center. A healing room. A leadership academy. A generational gate of righteousness. But it begins with a decision. Like Joshua, say: "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."

Biblical Insight:

Nehemiah wept over broken walls and responded with courage, strategy, and prayer (Nehemiah 2:17–18). God is still calling rebuilders today.

Why It Matters:

What you rebuild becomes a refuge for others. Rebuilding isn't just about restoring what was lost—it's about aligning with what God always intended.

Action Point:

Ask: What part of my life or family needs rebuilding? Pray, plan, and act with heaven's backing.

Declaration:

I accept the call to rebuild. I rise with wisdom, boldness, and faith to restore what the enemy tried to ruin.

Experience has shown that if we just count on our love and passion to make inroads in the mission field or as pastors or in ministry, we'd likely become burnt out and quit very soon. Instead, God gave us the wisdom to prepare. The interest you expressed at the AWMC24, must remain burning and you have opportunity to be trained.

If you just show up in ministry, hearts full of love for God and eager to make big changes for His Kingdom, you will likely be back home early, burnt out and disappointed.

Instead, God gives us the wisdom to slow down and discover how we could effectively work on His behalf, using the talents, skills, and education He blessed us with.

God cut us out for this work, but we are presently rough and unpolished. **Fullstature College of the Bible and Missions (FCBM) will help take out the raw edges, sand out the splinters and prepared you for God to add the varnish, readying us to begin your work. *Don't get us wrong we have always been a little unfinished, but God has helped us to help others since 1994. In this work, we will always need to be learning, growing, and adapting.***

The countries that have received the greatest amount of Western missionary attention over two centuries contain the greatest number of unreached and unreached people groups: China and India (which once included Pakistan and Bangladesh).

PROPHETIC PRAYER FOR THE MONTH OF MAY 2025

David and others prophesied often in the Psalms about the whole earth experiencing salvation. These were prophecies about the kingdom. David, who was a king, prophesied often about the greater kingdom of his Seed, Christ, the Messiah. Some of those prophecies in the Book of Psalms are shown below:

- *“You are My Son ... I will give You the nations for Your inheritance” (Ps. 2:7–8).*
- *“All the families of the nations shall worship before You” (Ps. 22:27).*
- *“The earth is the LORD’S” (Ps. 24:1).*
- *“According to Your name, O God, so is Your praise to the ends of the earth” (Ps. 48:10).*
- *“You who are the confidence of all the ends of the earth” (Ps. 65:5).*
- *“All nations whom You have made shall come and worship before you, O Lord” (Ps. 86:10).*
- *“The nations shall fear the name of the LORD, and all the kings of the earth Your glory” (Ps. 102:15).*
- *“Be exalted, O God, above the heavens, and Your glory above all the earth” (Ps. 108:5).*

The vision of the prophets was always global. The kingdom would not be limited to Israel but would encompass all nations. The scribes and teachers understood this but did not understand how it would be accomplished. It would come through the death of the Messiah, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the preaching of the gospel.

When reading these scriptures there should be no doubt of the plan and purpose of God. This purpose comes through the church, the new-creation people, who will become a global phenomenon. The church could not be limited to Jerusalem. The Book of Acts is the story of the church and kingdom breaking out of the framework of the old covenant and breaking forth throughout the whole earth.

Adopt-A-Missionary- A Missions’ Strategy

Adopt-A-Missionary is a mission strategy that has gained momentum in missions over the years. What makes this strategy different is its focus. Historically, churches have focused on countries, and mission agencies have focused their attention on people groups. Adopt-A-Missionary focuses ***on missionary families, or what we can call message bearers.***

For 5 years, my wife (of blessed memory) and I served as missionary representatives to the Kenyan peoples of East Africa. We divided the nation of Kenya into 6. Working with the missionary on ground we had a plan to evangelise the nation. We raised teams of two by two from Nigeria and planted 6 churches throughout the country. In the last 29 years + the FMI missionary teams have been helped by God to open the gospel among 40 unreached people groups. Our FMC churches faithfully prayed and the missionaries that we served with, and the church has supported them financially.

In 1990 for example, we were relocated to Kano with two major tribes- the Kanawas and Magusawas. We were led of the Lord to pay more attention ***to tribal missions in 1993, where the gospel has never been heard while maintaining a church base.*** Thankfully, our churches have continued to pray for and support the mission's effort with this strategic ministry.

ADOPT-A-Missionary Defined

What then does it mean to Adopt-A-missionary? It means committing yourself as an individual, fellowship group, local congregation, denomination, or mission agency to pray for and commit resources to win souls, establish believers, administrate the work within a specific people group through a missionary family or families. This commitment is continued until the believers in that people group can reach the rest of their people without outside (cross-cultural) assistance.

We are agents of God praying, giving, and serving to see an adopted family reach out to bring sinners into God's family. This is the true meaning of Adopting a missionary family. One day this will be accomplished, and every tribe, tongue, people, and nation will give glory to God around His throne (Rev. 5:9).

Adopt a Missionary Family

Fullstature Missions International is committed to the work of missions and has developed a ministry to bring into focus the Great Commission (Matt 28:19-20) set forth by Christ and to support missionary families need. We ask that your family prayerfully consider adopting a missionary family to be a blessing and to be blessed. After you have made an adoption, we encourage you can send your missionary family an email to share about your family and to ask them to share with you. The FMI becomes a bridge to help people you may never know or meet. You can reach out to the missionary during Holidays, birthdays, or anniversaries or just at any time. Commit to lift your missionary up in prayer. (Phil 6)

It is also our desire to support more missionaries through our ministry budget than we currently can do. The missionaries we support currently are under-supported. In other words, the support we grant is not adequate. In most cases, we are nearly able (with Naira) to provide what will keep body and soul together leaving projects in the field undone. This is where you pause and do something.

It is our goal to ensure that every Missionary, supported through, (what we call) the General Fund which includes the “Faith Promise Offering” (FPO), are missionaries we, as a ministry want to support.

The money these Missionaries receive is totally dependent on what is given by the individual or families who have adopted them.

Example: Missionary “Felix” may have two families in First Baptist Church which chose to adopt him. They do so for a combined support of \$200 per month, one for \$75 per month and one for \$125 per month. Should the family who chose to support Missionary “Felix” for \$125 per month be unable to do so for any reason, Missionary “Felix” would only receive \$75 for that month. There will be a “shortfall” and the family who was unable to give what they had purposed to give would not be contacted and asked, “Where is your contribution”.

If you have a desire to support a Missionary, please feel free to fill out a “Adopt-A-Missionary Request Form” and return it to our ministry office.

Build a Relationship

Develop a relationship with your adopted missionary family. Learn about their ministry and their ups and downs so that you know when to Praise God with them and when to lift them up in prayer. 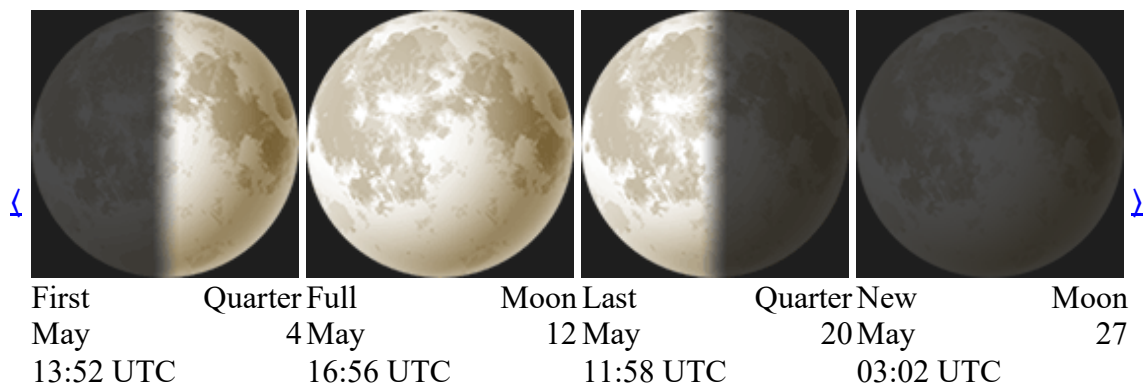

IS THIS THE MONTH OF YOUR BIRTH? **USE REVELATION KNOWLEDGE WELL (AND** **AGAIN) !!**



Even if this is not your month of birth, pray into the day of your birth on a weekly basis (that is the weekday in which you were born). Take time at regular basis to be praying for yourself and prophesying over your own life. Speak into the foundations of your life and prophesy good things.

Thank Him for your specific day of birth. Declare that day blessed.

- Thank Him that He ordained that you will be made manifest on earth on a specific day in that month at a specific hour and minute.
- Thank Him that He has a purpose for your life, and it will be fulfilled.
- Ask Jehovah to forgive you where you have for one reason or another, ignored or rejected to recognize your day of birth.
- Thank Jehovah for the day of your conception. (Psa 139:13)
- Thank Jehovah that when He thought of you, he already thought of your entire life. Thank Him that He did not leave anything to chance. (Isa 49:1)
- Thank Him that he knew exactly what your redemptive purpose was going to be. (Psa. 139:16)
- Pray that He will reveal the original you more and more as you enter another year of your life. (Psa 139:13-15)
- Pray that He will restore the heavenly label, and the heavenly name He gave you before you were conceived. (Jer 1:5).

FOUNDATIONS OF ORDER & HARMONY

THURSDAY, MAY 1:

LABELS OF WORTH, BUT LANES OF RESPONSIBILITY

Key Verse: Genesis 2:18 – “It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him.” From the beginning, gender roles were not about superiority or subjugation but about divine order and functional harmony. The term “helper” (‘ezer) in Hebrew refers to someone who brings strength, often used of God Himself. In this light, the man was incomplete without the woman—not just emotionally, but in terms of mission.

The home is a sacred ecosystem where roles are not *labels of worth, but lanes of responsibility*. Husbands lead with sacrificial love, wives with strategic wisdom and honor—and both submit to Christ.

Sameness and equality are often confused — especially in churches and families — because people tend to think that being *equal* must mean being *identical* in roles, gifts, or functions. But biblically and practically, equality means equal worth, dignity, and value, *not* identical function or assignment. Sameness is different from equality

Sameness	Equality
Assumes everyone must do the same thing, have the same role, express the same gifts.	Recognizes everyone is equally valuable, even if they have different roles or gifts.
Leads to rigid uniformity — no room for diversity of calling or individuality.	Celebrates diversity within unity — different callings working together.
Can cause frustration, competition, or suppression of unique abilities.	Honors the different strengths, contributions, and callings of each person.
Example in family: Expecting every child to have the same interests, careers, or personalities.	Example in family: Valuing each child uniquely, even though their talents and callings differ.
Example in church: Pressuring everyone into identical ministry roles.	Example in church: Allowing various gifts — teaching, helps, evangelism, administration, etc. — to flourish equally.

FRIDAY, MAY 2:

SERVANT LEADERSHIP IN THE HOME

Key Verse: Ephesians 5:25 – “Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her.” The model of male leadership in the Bible is not authoritarian—it’s cruciform. Jesus leads by laying His life down. In the home, this means a husband’s authority is only valid if it is drenched in service, intercession, and self-denial. Wives are called to honor—not because the man is perfect, but because honor releases influence, while criticism shuts it down. This is mutual submission in action.

In Church Life:

- Sameness mindset says, “If you don’t preach or lead worship, you’re less important.”
- Equality mindset says, “Whether you clean the church, pray behind the scenes, or preach to thousands, you are equally precious and necessary.”

Scriptural backing:

- *1 Corinthians 12:14-20 — Paul explains the church as a body: many different members (eye, hand, foot) but all vital.*
- *Galatians 3:28 — In Christ, we are all one — no one is superior, but roles and functions still differ.*

In Family Life:

- Sameness mindset says, “All sons must be pastors; all daughters must be nurses.”
- Equality mindset says, “Each child can uniquely follow God’s call, and their worth is not tied to replicating each other’s path.”

Scriptural backing:

- *Genesis 1:27 — God made male and female in His image — equal dignity, different roles.*
- *Ephesians 5:21-33 — Husbands and wives have different responsibilities, but are equal before God.*

Leadership Application:

Leaders in ministry must reflect this same servant posture. Whether in marriage or ministry, true headship is covering, not control.

Prayer:

“Lord, teach me to lead like You—by dying to self and living for others.”

SATURDAY, MAY 3:

PARENTING IN UNITY

Key Verse: Proverbs 1:8 – “Listen, my son, to your father’s instruction and do not forsake your mother’s teaching.”

In the divine structure, parenting is a shared, interwoven task:

- Fathers give identity, strength, and direction.
- Mothers give nurture, wisdom, and interpretation.

A child grows whole when both voices are present. When one role dominates or withdraws, imbalance enters.

Parenting in unity is a powerful foundation.

Here is a structured view, and a short story to make it vivid:

Parenting in unity means:

- **Two parents working together with shared purpose, vision, and agreement, even if their personalities or styles differ.**

- Presenting a united front before the children — so the children don't exploit or get confused by division.
- Honouring each parent's unique strengths but still pulling in the same direction.
- Resolving disagreements privately, not in front of the children.
- Agreeing on values, discipline, rewards, and boundaries — even if one parent is more lenient and the other is stricter.

Short Story: Unity That Saved a Son

Dan and Sonia had a teenage son, Jonathan, who began struggling with peer pressure at school.

Dan was tough — he believed in strict consequences.

Sonia was tender — she believed in patient listening and slow correction.

At first, they argued constantly about how to help Jonathan:

- Dan wanted to ground him immediately.
- Sonia wanted to sit him down and talk gently.

One evening, after another argument, they realized:

“We’re fighting each other instead of fighting for our son.”

They prayed together, agreed on a plan:

- First, they would listen carefully to Jonathan (Sonia's strength).
- Then, they would set clear boundaries and consequences (Dan's strength).

David, seeing his parents united — firm but loving — realized he couldn't play them against each other.

He opened up about his struggles, apologized, and began to change.

Their unity provided security and clarity — and it *rescued their son* from drifting further. *Unity between parents creates a safe fence for children to grow inside. Disunity creates gaps that danger can slip through.*

Summary:

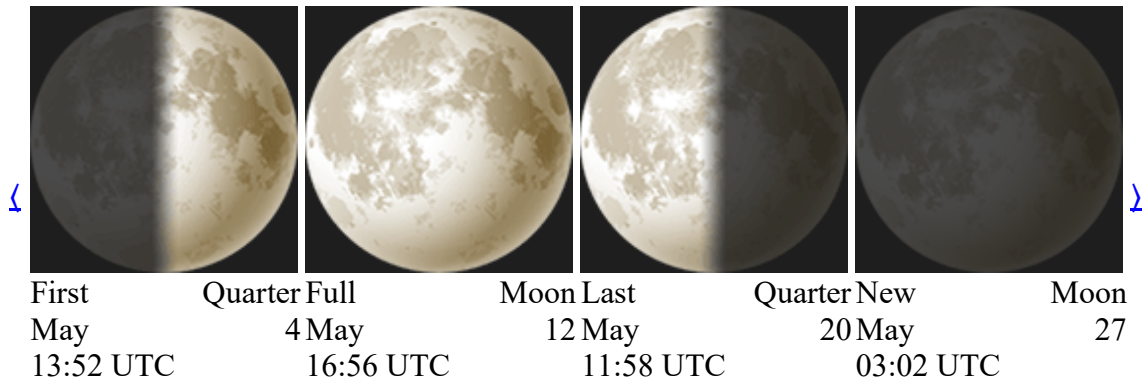
Parenting in unity means two hearts in one direction, raising children who can walk securely into their destiny.

Crescents and Quarter Moons

When the moon is shaped like a C or its mirror image (Sickle), it is considered a crescent moon. The quarter moon is shaped like a D or its mirror image and considered to be a bow.

The occult will use the bow shaped moon to shoot arrows of wickedness to the unsuspecting in order to draw unfair advantage in various areas of life. The occult uses the crescent moon as sickles (e.g. Hecate's sickle), for harvesting the gains of the ignorant and for demonic strength and fortification with intense enchantments.

- Proclaim Psalm 148 and command all creation especially the crescent and Quarter moons to praise GOD as instructed in Psalm 19.
- Proclaim Psalm 64 and fasten that judgment into the heavens.
- Proclaim Isa 26:1-9 and command the heavens to receive this instruction and reject every other voice of destruction; pray for strength and fortification "Trust in the LORD forever: for in the LORD JEHOVAH is everlasting strength". Isa 26:4
- GOD abhors enchantment so He warned His people not to be involved in enchantment. (Lev 19:26b)
- Pray that the occult, involved in intense enchantment will equally and certainly face the fierce wrath of GOD. Is 13:9

SUNDAY, MAY 4:

GENDER ROLES IN CHURCH WORK

Key Verse: Romans 16:1-2 – "I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon of the church... she has been a benefactor of many people, including me."

The New Testament is full of women who led, taught, hosted churches, and moved apostolically (e.g., Junia, Priscilla, Lydia, Deborah in the Old Testament). Yet, these women served within the context of honor and order. God is not limited by gender—but He is glorified when we serve according to grace and gifting.

Biblical Foundation for Gender Roles:

- **Both men and women are called to serve God and build His Kingdom.** (*Galatians 3:28 — "There is neither male nor female: for you are all one in Christ Jesus."*)
- **God gives spiritual gifts without gender bias — teaching, prophecy, leadership, hospitality, evangelism, wisdom, healing, and more (1 Corinthians 12).**

- **But roles and functions in the church may reflect God’s order of creation, leadership, and servanthood — not inferiority.**

MONDAY, MAY 5:

RESTORING BROKEN ORDER

Key Verse: Malachi 4:6 — “He will turn the hearts of the fathers to their children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers.”

Many homes and churches are out of order because the roles have been wounded, reversed, or abandoned. God’s end-time move includes restoration of family structure, generational alignment, and authority rooted in love.

Where there is competition instead of cooperation, healing is needed.

Common Errors Churches Make in Handling Gender Roles:

Error	What Happens	Why It’s a Problem
Suppressing women’s gifts completely	Women are told they cannot teach, lead, or prophesy even when gifted by God.	It wastes God-given talents and crushes part of the Body of Christ. (See Joel 2:28 — “your sons and daughters will prophesy.”)
Erasing gender distinctions Altogether	Some churches reject any Role differences, treating men and women as identical.	It ignores the beauty of Complementarity that God designed (Genesis 2:18-24).

Exalting one gender over the other	Men dominate in pride or women lead in rebellion without balance or respect.	It creates division and dishonors God's order of mutual submission and love (Ephesians 5:21).
Overemphasizing rules instead of gifts	More focus is placed on "who should not" serve rather than "who is gifted" to serve.	It quenches the Spirit and leads to legalism instead of Spirit-led ministry (1 Corinthians 12:4-7).
Handling disagreements without grace	Churches split or accuse each other over gender role interpretations.	It damages the testimony of unity in Christ and weakens the church's witness (John 17:21).

Quick Examples in Real Church Life:

- A woman called to missions is blocked because she's female, and a whole people group misses hearing the gospel.
- A church ordains leaders without wisdom, erasing biblical order, and confusion reigns in leadership.
- In family ministries, fathers are discouraged from active roles, leading to spiritually passive men.

Define leadership roles biblically, not culturally	Guards against copying worldly patterns (either hyper-patriarchy or radical sameness) and stays faithful to Scripture (Romans 12:2).
Develop mentorship for both genders	Equips both men and women to mature, serve, lead, and disciple others with wisdom (Titus 2:3-6).
Resolve differences with humility and biblical dialogue	Prevents divisions, promotes learning, and preserves the spirit of unity (Ephesians 4:2-3).

Create pathways for women to serve meaningfully	In churches that reserve elder/pastor roles for men, still empower women in areas like teaching, prophecy, missions, counselling, hospitality, worship, children's ministries, administration, and leadership under oversight (Romans 16:1-2 — Phoebe served as a deacon).

TUESDAY, MAY 6:

SHARED DOMINION, DISTINCT FUNCTIONS

Key Verse: Genesis 1:27-28 – "Male and female He created them... and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it.'"

In creation, God gave both male and female the same command—fruitfulness, multiplication, dominion. Their identity is equal, their function is complementary. The distortion of gender roles happens when sameness is confused with equality.

Shared Dominion, Distinct Functions: God's Design for Church, Family, and Life

Shared Dominion means:

- Both men and women are entrusted by God with authority to steward the earth, families, and the Church.
- Equal in calling, dignity, and responsibility before God.

Distinct Functions means:

- While dominion is shared, the way men and women operate, serve, lead, and express their gifts can differ, by God's wise design.
- These differences are complementary, not competitive.

Biblical Foundation:

- **Shared Dominion:**
Genesis 1:26-28 — "Let them have dominion..." (both male and female are addressed.)
God blessed both Adam and Eve and gave them joint authority over creation.
- **Distinct Functions:**
Genesis 2:18, 21-24 — Adam was formed first, Eve was fashioned to complete and help him — a divine partnership with different entry points into the same mission.
- **In the New Covenant:**
Galatians 3:28 — In Christ, distinctions of value between male and female are abolished, but distinct callings still exist within order, such as spiritual headship, nurture, leadership, and service.

Practical Picture:

- **Marriage:** Husband and wife rule over their family together — but the husband leads sacrificially (like Christ), and the wife strengthens the home (like the Church responds to Christ).
- **Church:** Men and women lead, teach, prophesy, disciple — but with biblical order respected and gifts fully released.
- **Society:** Both men and women serve in leadership, innovation, and mission, bringing different facets of God's image to the world.

Real-Life Example:

In a vibrant church:

- The lead pastor (male) leads with vision and spiritual fatherhood.
- A female prophet ministers alongside, bringing accurate words and intercessory breakthroughs.
- Male and female deacons organize administration and hospitality together.
- Youth ministry is jointly led — a strong male mentor and a nurturing female leader.

Result: Each serves in their strength; no rivalry, no erasure — one dominion, many functions, one Kingdom advance.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 7:

WHEN ROLES ARE MISUSED

Key Verse: Colossians 3:19 – “Husbands, love your wives and do not be harsh with them.”

Misuse of roles leads to emotional scars. Authority without love becomes abuse, and submission without respect becomes resentment. God never ordained dominance but Christlike headship and Spirit-filled submission.

Examples of when a Role can be Misused:

- **A husband demands unquestioning obedience from his wife without mutual love or honour.**
- **A pastor uses the pulpit to build his personal empire instead of serving the people.**
- **A church glorifies public speakers but ignores those in prayer ministry, causing division.**
- **Parents refuse to correct their children properly, leaving emotional gaps that Satan exploits.**
- **Women called to missions are denied opportunities purely because of gender bias.**

What Happens When Roles Are Misused?

- **Relationships break down (church splits, family conflict).**
- **Gifts are buried (people withdraw in pain or frustration).**
- **Rebellion grows (people reject leadership altogether).**
- **The enemy gains footholds (confusion, hurt, injustice).**
- **The witness of Christ is damaged (outsiders see hypocrisy, not love).**

THURSDAY, MAY 8:

STRENGTH IN DIFFERENCE

Key Verse: 1 Peter 3:7 – “Husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way... as heirs with you of the gracious gift of life.”

Understanding the emotional, spiritual, and practical differences between men and women is not a weakness—it’s wisdom. Many homes suffer not from rebellion, but from ignorance and assumption.

“We celebrate our differences, we honour each strength, and together we display the fullness of Christ's wisdom on the earth.”

FRIDAY, MAY 9:

STRENGTH IN DIFFERENCE

(1 Corinthians 12:17-18, ESV)

SATURDAY, MAY 10:

MOTHERS AS PROPHETIC VOICES

Key Verse: 2 Timothy 1:5 – “I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice.”

Timothy’s spiritual strength came through the influence of godly women. In many cultures and homes, mothers have shaped destinies by the words they spoke, the prayers they offered, and the atmosphere they carried.

Biblical Foundation:

- *Proverbs 31:26* —
“She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue.”
(A mother’s words shape generations.)
- *Judges 5:7* —

SUNDAY, MAY 11:

God the Father gives His Son three things every father should give:

1. Identity (“My Son”)

2. Affirmation (“Whom I love”)

3. Validation (“In whom I am well pleased”)

The absence of fatherhood creates identity confusion. Fathers—biological and spiritual—must take up their role as blessers and builders.

Fathers as Identity Givers

Biblical Foundation:

- *Genesis 2:23* —

Adam names Eve — affirming her identity (“bone of my bones, flesh of my flesh”).

- *Matthew 3:17* —

When Jesus is baptized, the Father speaks:

“This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.”

(Identity and affirmation come from the Father’s voice.)

- *Proverbs 17:6* —

“The glory of children is their fathers.”

MONDAY, MAY 12:

Meaning of building a house and not a stage.

- **A Stage symbolizes a place of performance, applause, image management, competition, and temporary fame.**

God’s desire is that His people build a house — not a place where people perform for approval, but a place where people become family under His Fatherhood.

“But Christ is faithful as the Son over God’s house. And we are His house, if indeed we hold firmly to our confidence and the hope in which we glory.”

Deepen your private walk with God more than seeking public recognition.

Reflection Thought:

**A stage impresses for a moment; a house shelters for a lifetime.
God is looking for houses of glory, not stages of performance.**

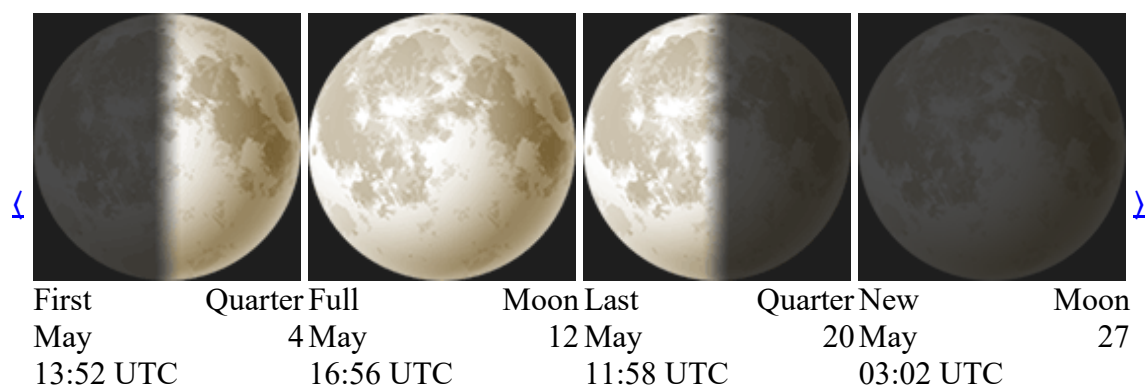
Action Step for Today:

Praise GOD for the full moon this month.

Every enemy instruction for the full moon to strike the righteous by night will be returned to sender as the moon rejects every other instruction except that which is from the LORD Psa 45.3-6
- During full moon seasons the gravitational pull of the moon on the earth causes an ebb and flow of waters resulting in tidal action and instability of the waters on earth even in bodies of all creatures.
- Pray that the waters of your body will stabilize and be still during the full moon season when the waters ebb and flow, and body fluids are also affected adversely.
- Ask the LORD to be the stability of your times.

Pray this for your economy and for the political landscape in your territory

TUESDAY, MAY 13:

THE POWER OF AGREEMENT IN MARRIAGE.

Key Verse: Matthew 18:19 – “If two of you agree on earth... it will be done by My Father in heaven.”

Agreement in marriage brings supernatural momentum. Disunity between a husband and wife can stall not just personal peace but prophetic purpose. Your greatest prayer partner should be your spouse.

Biblical Foundation:

- **Amos 3:3 —**
“Can two walk together, except they be agreed?”
- **Matthew 18:19-20 —**
“If two of you agree on earth concerning anything that they ask, it will be done for them by My Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am there in the midst of them.”
- **Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 —**
“Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their labor.”

What Agreement Means in Marriage:

Aspect	What It Looks Like

Many people come from broken homes, absent fathers, or dominating leadership. But God is a Restorer. He redeems not only time, but roles. You may not have seen the right model, but you can become the right model.

Redeeming the Broken Roles

What It Means:

- **In life, family, church, and society, roles (father, mother, leader, husband, wife, son, daughter, pastor, etc.) are God-ordained.**
- **But because of sin, human weakness, and pain, roles often get broken — abandoned, abused, distorted, or neglected.**

FRIDAY, MAY 16:

ORDER INVITES GLORY

Where there is divine order, there is divine glory. In homes where the husband leads with humility, the wife honours with grace, and the children obey in love, God’s presence is tangible. This doesn’t mean perfection—but alignment.

Order Invites Glory

Meaning:

- **Order in God’s kingdom is not rigid control — it is divine alignment: Everything in its proper place, purpose, and priority under God’s authority.**
- **Glory — the manifest presence, power, beauty, and weight of God — comes when there is heavenly order.**

(Paul’s instruction to maintain spiritual order in the church to allow the Spirit to move properly.)

Simple Picture:

Imagine a beautifully tuned orchestra.
If every instrument plays at random, the result is noise.
But if each instrument follows the conductor and their place in the score —
glory emerges as breathtaking music.

Order creates an environment where glory can manifest and be experienced.

Why Order Matters:

Without Order	With Order

SATURDAY, MAY 17:

ROLES AND SPIRITUAL WARFARE

Key Verse: Ecclesiastes 4:12 – "A cord of three strands is not quickly broken."

Satan attacks family roles because he knows they carry covenantal power. A united marriage is a fortress. Divided roles weaken defense.

Roles and Spiritual Warfare

Key Insight:

- In spiritual warfare, knowing your God-given role — whether in family, church, ministry, or society — is part of your armour.
- Confusion, neglect, or abuse of roles weakens spiritual authority.
- Rightly walking in your role strengthens your position in the spirit realm and gives you territorial, relational, and generational influence.

Simply:

Roles define ranks. Ranks determine reach. Reach determines results in spiritual warfare.

Biblical Foundation:

- *Ephesians 6:10-18* — The Armor of God — Paul speaks to *positions* (e.g., righteousness, peace, faith) that reflect *standing firmly in assigned spiritual roles*.
- *Genesis 2:15* — Adam was given a role (to work and guard the Garden). His failure in role opened the door to the serpent.
- *Numbers 16:1-35* — Korah rebelled against Moses' God-given leadership role — *result: spiritual warfare erupted, and Korah was judged for stepping outside of God's order.*
- *Luke 4:18* — Jesus declared His role and authority at the beginning of His ministry: "*The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me because He has anointed Me...*" (This announcement of role preceded His spiritual victories.)

Simple Picture:

In an army:

- Soldiers have different ranks and roles — general, captain, foot soldier.
- If they abandon their role, the enemy finds a breach.
- If they function in role, the army is unstoppable.

Likewise in the Spirit:

Order in roles is key to victory in warfare.

Common Role Failures that Open Doors to the Enemy:

Role	Common Warfare Breach
Father	Abdicating spiritual leadership in the home — leaves family uncovered.

Mother	Nurturing from a place of fear or control — invites anxiety and confusion.
Pastor/Leader	Neglecting the flock or manipulating the people — weakens spiritual covering.
Husband/Wife	Operating in competition instead of covenant — weakens spiritual agreement (Matthew 18:19).
Intercessor	Growing weary or distracted — opens gaps in prayer walls.

How Walking in Right Roles Strengthens Warfare:

Right Role	Spiritual Impact
Fathers leading in prayer and love	Builds a strong hedge of protection over the family.
Mothers nurturing in faith and wisdom	Stabilizes emotional and spiritual atmosphere of the home.
Husbands and wives walking in unity	Multiply authority in prayer and warfare (agreement releases power).
Pastors shepherding in humility	Strengthens the corporate armor of the church.
Believers operating in gifting and callings	Expands Kingdom territory and binds enemy activity.

Reflection Thought:

If you don't know your role in the battle, you might be fighting from the wrong position — or worse, leaving a gate unguarded.

Action Step for Today:

- **Ask the Lord:**
“What role have You assigned me in this season — at home, in church, in ministry, in the Spirit?”
- **Strengthen that role with prayer, humility, and obedience.**

SUNDAY, MAY 18:

RAISING SONS AND DAUGHTERS IN ORDER.

Key Verse: Luke 2:51-52 – “He was obedient to them... and Jesus grew in wisdom, stature, and favor.”

Even Jesus submitted to earthly parents. Children thrive under structure, loving correction, and godly modelling.

**We are not raising sons and daughters just to survive life -
We are raising them to be equipped, positioned, and released into their God-ordained destinies.**

We raise them in order to:

Goal	Meaning
Reflect Christ’s image	Sons and daughters who look like Jesus in character, heart, and power.
Advance God’s Kingdom	Not just to live a nice life — but to expand the reign of God’s truth, justice, love, and glory.
Carry generational blessings	Breaking cycles of curse, carrying blessings forward for generations to come.
Guard and steward spiritual gates	Being watchmen over their homes, communities, nations.

MONDAY, MAY 19:

Key Verse: Judges 4:4 – “Deborah, a prophetess, the wife of Lapidoth, was leading Israel at that time.”

Deborah was a prophet, judge, and leader, but also a wife. Her husband’s name is barely mentioned—but his support enabled her national leadership. This speaks to silent strength and trust in God’s calling.

Deborah and Lapidoth — A Powerful Balance

Who Were They?

- **Deborah — Prophetess, Judge, Mother in Israel, a national leader chosen by God. (*Judges 4:4*)**
- **Lapidoth — Deborah’s husband, quietly mentioned, but very significant. (*Judges 4:4* says, “*Deborah, a prophetess, the wife of Lapidoth...*”)**

Even though Lapidoth doesn’t say a word in the biblical account, his presence and support represent a key dimension of strength and balance in Deborah’s life and calling.

Key Picture:

Deborah	Lapidoth
A public leader, visible in battle and judgment.	A private strength, invisible but essential for stability.
Bold, prophetic, nurturing national destiny.	Trusting, secure, enabling her full expression without control or insecurity.
Actively fighting in public spiritual warfare.	Actively keeping peace at home and honouring the call without jealousy or rivalry.

Their partnership reveals:

When there is mutual honour and spiritual balance in marriage, destinies flourish, and nations are impacted.

Biblical Lessons from Their Balance:

Action Step for Today:

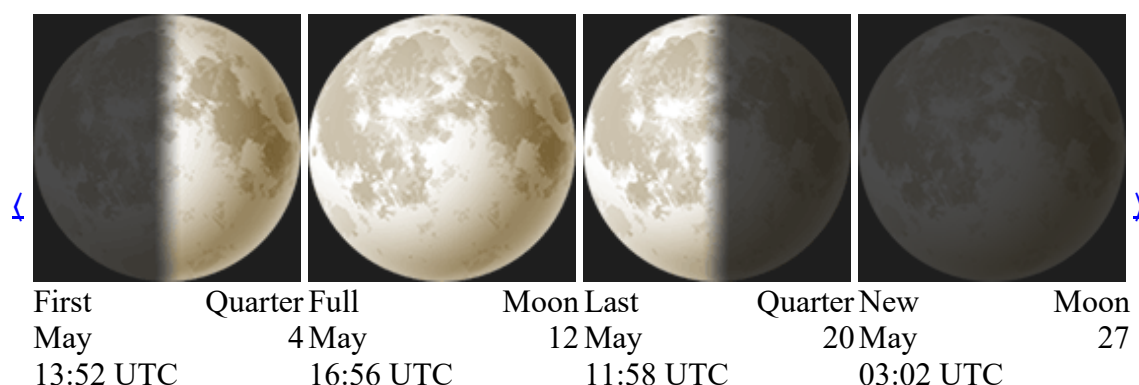
- **Ask God:**

Crescents and Quarter Moons

When the moon is shaped like a C or its mirror image (Sickle), it is considered a crescent moon. The quarter moon is shaped like a D or its mirror image and considered to be a bow. The occult will use the bow shaped moon to shoot arrows of wickedness to the unsuspecting in order to draw unfair advantage in various areas

of life. The occult uses the crescent moon as sickles (e.g. Hecate's sickle), for harvesting the gains of the ignorant and for demonic strength and fortification with intense enchantments.

- Proclaim Psalm 148 and command all creation especially the crescent and Quarter moons to praise GOD as instructed in Psalm 19.
- Proclaim Psalm 64 and fasten that judgment into the heavens.
- Proclaim Isa 26:1-9 and command the heavens to receive this instruction and reject every other voice of destruction; pray for strength and fortification "Trust in the LORD forever: for in the LORD JEHOVAH is everlasting strength". Isa 26:4
- GOD abhors enchantment so He warned His people not to be involved in enchantment. (Lev 19:26b)
- Pray that the occult, involved in intense enchantment will equally and certainly face the fierce wrath of GOD. Is 13:9.

TUESDAY, MAY 20:

ZACHARIAS AND ELIZABETH – A PRIESTLY HOME

Key Verse: Luke 1:6 – “They were both righteous before God... walking in all the commandments.”

Zacharias and Elizabeth created an environment of holiness. Their barrenness didn't stop their faithfulness, and God honored it with a miracle son—John the Baptist.

Zacharias and Elizabeth — A Priestly Home

Who Were They?

- **Zacharias — A priest serving in the temple of the Lord, from the division of Abijah. (Luke 1:5)**
- **Elizabeth — A descendant of Aaron (the first high priest), righteous before God, walking blamelessly. (Luke 1:5-6)**
- **Together, they formed a priestly, prophetic home — a household through which John the Baptist, the forerunner of Christ, was born!**

Key Characteristics of Their Priestly Home:

Aspect	How Zacharias and Elizabeth Lived

Words frame the climate of a home. Honour is spoken. Peace is preserved by how we communicate.

The Blessings of Ordered Speech

What It Means:

- **Ordered speech means speaking words that are aligned with God’s truth, character, and purpose — not careless, emotional, fleshly, or destructive words.**
- **Our words can either build or break, release life or invite death.**
- **When our speech is brought into divine order, we unlock blessings, protection, and fruitfulness over our lives, families, ministries, and destinies.**

WHEN THE CHURCH MODEL BREAKS THE FAMILY

Key Verse: Mark 7:13 – “You nullify the word of God by your tradition.”

- God established the family first (Genesis 1–2) — before He established Israel, before He established the Church.
- Family is God's first training ground for love, leadership, stewardship, worship, and covenant.
- The Church is meant to strengthen families, not replace them.
- When the church model elevates performance, programming, or organizational demands above family health, it breaks what God intended to build.

2. What Happens When the Church Model Breaks Families?

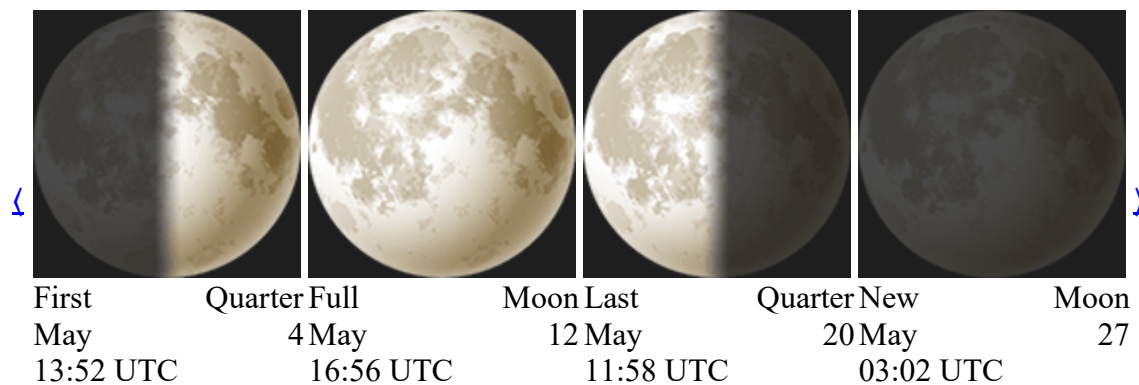

- *“I endure offense, grow through it, and emerge stronger.”*

10. Final Charge:

Offense is Satan’s trap to derail your destiny. Guard your gate.

Your heart is too valuable, your assignment too critical, and your legacy too precious to surrender to offense.

Choose daily to:

- Stay soft before God.
- Stay strong in your calling.
- Stay free from bitterness.

You were not called to be a prisoner of offense — you are called to be a gatekeeper of life, love, and legacy.

THE FAMILY ALTAR — RESTORING DAILY WORSHIP

Building God’s Presence, Voice, and Covenant in the Home

1. Introduction: Why Restore the Family Altar?

Before there were temples, synagogues, or churches, the home was the center of worship. A family altar is a place where family members meet God together daily — through Scripture, prayer, worship, thanksgiving, and declarations.

Offense and Disunity	Offense between family members closes spiritual gates.
Overcomplication	Thinking it must be long, formal, or perfect, leading to discouragement.

Set a Time and Place	Choose a consistent time — morning, evening, or both.

- *“Our children are taught by the Lord, and great is their peace.” (Isaiah 54:13)*
- *“No weapon formed against our family shall prosper.” (Isaiah 54:17)*
- *“We serve the Lord with gladness and faithfulness all our days.” (Joshua 24:15)*
- *“The generations after us will know the Lord and do exploits in His name.”*

Closing Exhortation:

When you restore the family altar, you rebuild the gates of your household. You re-establish God’s rule, peace, and prophetic voice over your lineage. A few minutes of daily worship can change the spiritual climate of your entire family and future generations.

Small daily flames become great fires of generational revival.

Start today. Build the altar. Watch God dwell among you.
