What is presented are not Jewish Dates or the Jewish calendar but what the LORD instituted which we all see manifested in the movement of the Moon every month. The enemy has always manipulated these bodies for which believers are just becoming aware. This season is also a special edition of revelation which brings a new breath of fresh air without adding to the word of God but confirms it and makes our faith stronger

You may wish to pray in two ways:-

1. You can pray using the whole journal to pray into the womb of time according to the authority level granted to you by your appointment in the Lord. Expect the prophetic germination [as you saturate the ground and the womb of time with God's ordination] to happen. In any case ensure your seed remains in the ground as investment for the coming year. Determine, and command what this month should deliver to you and what it should not and must Not.
2. You can also use this daily for your prayers AND DEVOTION to prevail at the gate of each day, especially on critical days of intense warfare in the heavens. Remember that the day starts from 6pm for the next 24 hours. If you are in Britain for instance the time will be early hours of the next day in Hong Kong @ your 6pm.
3. This document may seem lengthy, but it shows the effort that was generated in prayer. You can keep it and save it for use in a good way.

Pray that your prophetic faculties will be on the rise and be enlarged and sharp...visions; dreams; interpreting symbols; applying parables; riddles; revelation and predictions; accurate delivery of words of wisdom and words of knowledge; intercessions; interaction with heaven etc.. Divine decrees to cause the future and many other such faculties.

SHAPE YOUR DAY, MONTH AND CONSEQUENTLY YOUR YEARS

Ignorance of what every month holds for you, your family, community, nation, the church and the continent at large has caused many to perish, miss out or not fully access what God has in store for them.

Understanding the heavens and what they signify every month is another very key aspect as we enter this new level of our assignments among the nations. While the kingdom of darkness has used astrology, prognostications, and all manner of demonic methods to control the activities on earth using the heavens, the church continues in ignorance. They have even employed materialism to blind believers in Jesus Christ, whereas *all things are yours*

We thank God for the many people whom He is raising in different parts of the world to understand what the heavens hold for us every month. As you seek deeper understanding, the Holy Spirit will guide you into greater revelations. Amen.

Kingdom Alignment Requires A **Genuine Relentless Pursuit**

(Exploring the Call to Holy Living, Power Manifestation, and Radical Love)

Introduction: The Cost of Alignment

Kingdom alignment is the active synchronization of your life with God's design, timing, and authority.

It is heaven's will to be manifested on earth: Meaning: This captures the core idea of alignment—bringing your will, relationships, and purpose under the rule and reign of God, so heaven's agenda becomes your reality.

"Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." — Matthew 6:10

Living Under the Government of Christ.... Meaning: Kingdom alignment means living under the leadership, discipline, and values of Jesus—where every sphere of life reflects His lordship.

"Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end..." — Isaiah 9:7

Kingdom alignment is not a light touch or a weekend hobby—it is a whole-life pursuit. The life, teachings, and ministry of Jesus Christ are not merely theological blueprints; they are divine benchmarks for every believer. But the Kingdom will not conform to the lukewarm or the lazy. It responds to relentless pursuit, not casual observance.

From the fiery prophets of old to the apostles who turned cities upside down, every person who truly aligned with God's Kingdom pressed in with holy

desperation. Today, we are called to do the same—not just in theology, but in holy living, in the manifestation of power, and in love that overcomes darkness.

I. Holy Living: The Unyielding Pursuit of Purity

Holiness Is the Highway of Kingdom Alignment

Isaiah 35:8 declares, *“A highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called The way of holiness.”*

Holiness is not legalism; it is alignment. It is not separation for separation’s sake, but a separation unto the purposes and presence of God. The call to holiness is not optional for those who wish to carry Kingdom authority.

Jesus said, *“Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God”* (Matthew 5:8). The implication is clear: only those who pursue purity can walk in the clarity and authority of Kingdom vision.

There are Ancient Examples like Joseph in Egypt

Joseph’s refusal to compromise with Potiphar’s wife (Genesis 39) was not a prudish act—it was a decision to remain aligned with divine destiny. His private purity led to public promotion. His ability to interpret Pharaoh’s dreams came not just from a gift, but from a life of holy surrender.

Practical Pursuit of Holiness

- Audit your lifestyle: Are there places, habits, or digital engagements misaligning you with holiness?
- Daily sanctification: Set aside intentional time for repentance, renewal, and Scripture-based meditation. Wash your feet (walk, interactions) daily.
- Build holy community: Walk with people who provoke you toward purity, not compromise.



Holiness is the absence of sin by the blood of Jesus and the presence of divine focus. Pursue it relentlessly.

II. Manifestation of Power: From Theory to Tangible Impact

Power Is a Kingdom Expectation, Not a Luxury

Jesus never preached a powerless gospel. He taught, healed, delivered, raised the dead, and then commissioned His disciples to do the same. *“You shall receive*

power after the Holy Spirit comes upon you...” (Acts 1:8). Kingdom alignment without the manifestation of power is incomplete.


The apostles didn’t settle for explanation—they offered and added demonstration. Paul boldly stated, *“My speech and my preaching were not with persuasive words...but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power”* (1 Corinthians 2:4).

Ancient Example: Elijah at Mount Carmel

Elijah didn’t call Israel back to God with a lecture. He called down fire from heaven (1 Kings 18). That manifestation turned a nation’s heart. His power was not magic—it was the fruit of relentless pursuit, private prayer, and public boldness.

Practical Pursuit of Power

- **Cultivate intimacy:** Power flows from communion. Jesus rose early to pray before performing miracles (Mark 1:35-39).
- **Act on faith:** Faith is knowing the word and acting on the word. Lay hands on the sick like Jesus did. Speak to storms like Jesus did. Testify boldly like Jesus did. Power is activated through obedience the word.
- **Fast and pray:** Jesus told His disciples, *“This kind goes not out but by prayer and fasting”* (Matthew 17:21). Some alignments require deeper pursuit.

 Power is not a badge of pride but a tool for freedom. Pursue it not for fame but for impact.

III. Love: The Highest Proof of Kingdom Alignment

Love Is the Fulfilment of the Law- Jesus said the greatest commandments are to love God and love neighbour (Matthew 22:37–40). Paul reinforces this: *“If I have all faith... but have not love, I am nothing”* (1 Corinthians 13:2). Love is not sentimental; it is spiritual warfare.

To walk in Kingdom alignment without love is to misrepresent the very nature of the King.

Ancient Example: Stephen the Martyr: Stephen, full of grace and power, did mighty works. But what stood out was his love—even while being stoned, he cried, *“Lord, lay not this sin to their charge”* (Acts 7:60). That radical love mirrored Jesus on the cross and aligned him with heaven’s heartbeat.

Practical Pursuit of Love

- **Forgive actively:** Don't just let go—release blessings over those who hurt you.
- **Serve sacrificially:** Real love inconveniences itself. Find a way to serve someone who can't repay you.
- **Rebuke in truth:** Love doesn't avoid confrontation—it does it redemptively (Ephesians 4:15).



Love is not weakness. It is the **strongest force** in the Kingdom because it never fails.

Conclusion: Relentless, Not Religious. There is no Kingdom alignment without pursuit. Casual observance leaves us on the sidelines of divine purpose. The Kingdom is for those who violently press in (Matthew 11:12). Jesus is not returning for a passive church but for a radiant Bride—burning in holiness, walking in power, and overflowing in love.

This pursuit isn't driven by works-based insecurity—it's fueled by longing. True sons and daughters want to look like their Father. They want to see Christ formed in them (Galatians 4:19), not just in doctrine but in lifestyle, miracles, and compassion.

Final Charge: Three Questions for Reflection

1. Where have I become casual where Christ demands pursuit?
2. What do I need to cut off or step into to walk in alignment?
3. Who around me is waiting for the Christ in me to manifest—in purity, in power, and in love?

We must think deeply about making Jesus known. He has given us the Holy Spirit, the Bible and many preachers but we need to be trained in our minds on how to be effective for the Lord.

Experience has shown that if we just count on our love and passion to make inroads in the mission field or as pastors or in ministry, we'd likely become burnt out and quit very soon. Instead, God gave us the wisdom to prepare. The interest you expressed at the AWMC24, must remain burning and you have opportunity to be trained.

If you just show up in ministry, hearts full of love for God and eager to make big changes for His Kingdom, you will likely be back home early, burnt out and disappointed.

Instead, God gives us the wisdom to slow down and discover how we could effectively work on His behalf, using the talents, skills, and education He blessed us with.

God cut us out for this work, but we are presently rough and unpolished. **Fullstature College of the Bible and Missions (FCBM) will help take out the raw edges, sand out the splinters and prepared you for God to add the varnish, readying us to begin your work.** *Don't get us wrong we have always been a little unfinished, but God has helped us to help others since 1994. In this work, we will always need to be learning, growing, and adapting.*

Missionary Challenge

The countries that have received the greatest amount of Western missionary attention over two centuries contain the greatest number of unreached and unreached people groups: China and India (which once included Pakistan and Bangladesh).

PROPHETIC PRAYER FOR THE MONTH OF JULY 2025

David and others prophesied often in the Psalms about the whole earth experiencing salvation. These were prophecies about the kingdom. David, who was a king, prophesied often about the greater kingdom of his Seed, Christ, the Messiah. Some of those prophecies in the Book of Psalms are shown below:

- *“You are My Son ... I will give You the nations for Your inheritance” (Ps. 2:7–8).*

- *“All the families of the nations shall worship before You” (Ps. 22:27).*
- *“The earth is the LORD’S” (Ps. 24:1).*
- *“According to Your name, O God, so is Your praise to the ends of the earth” (Ps. 48:10).*
- *“You who are the confidence of all the ends of the earth” (Ps. 65:5).*
- *“All nations whom You have made shall come and worship before you, O Lord” (Ps. 86:10).*
- *“The nations shall fear the name of the LORD, and all the kings of the earth Your glory” (Ps. 102:15).*
- *“Be exalted, O God, above the heavens, and Your glory above all the earth” (Ps. 108:5).*

The vision of the prophets was always global. The kingdom would not be limited to Israel but would encompass all nations. The scribes and teachers understood this but did not understand how it would be accomplished. It would come through the death of the Messiah, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the preaching of the gospel.

When reading these scriptures there should be no doubt of the plan and purpose of God. This purpose comes through the church, the new-creation people, who will become a global phenomenon. The church could not be limited to Jerusalem. The Book of Acts is the story of the church and kingdom breaking out of the framework of the old covenant and breaking forth throughout the whole earth.

Adopt-A-Missionary- A Missions’ Strategy

...a strategy for loving the missionary family as well as the people groups, they serve

Adopt-A-Missionary is a mission strategy that has gained momentum in missions over the years. What makes this strategy different is its focus. Historically, churches have focused on countries, and mission agencies have focused their attention on people groups. Adopt-A-Missionary focuses *on missionary families, or what we can call message bearers.*

For 5 years, my wife (of blessed memory) and I served as missionary representatives to the Kenyan peoples of East Africa. We divided the nation of Kenya into 6. Working with the missionary on ground we had a plan to evangelise the nation. We raised teams of two by two from Nigeria and planted 6 churches throughout the country. In the last 29 years + the FMI missionary teams have been helped by God to open the gospel among 40 unreached people groups. Our FMC churches faithfully prayed and the missionaries that we served with, and the church has supported them financially.

In 1990 for example, we were relocated to Kano with two major tribes- the Kanawas and Magusawas. We were led of the Lord to pay more attention *to tribal missions in 1993, where the gospel has never been heard while maintaining a church base.* Thankfully, our churches have continued to pray for and support the mission’s effort with this strategic ministry.

ADOPT-A-Missionary Defined

What then does it mean to Adopt-A-missionary? It means committing yourself as an individual, fellowship group, local congregation, denomination, or mission agency to pray for and commit resources to win souls, establish believers, administrate the work within a specific people group through a missionary family or families. This commitment is continued until the believers in that people group can reach the rest of their people without outside (cross-cultural) assistance.

We are agents of God praying, giving, and serving to see an adopted family reach out to bring sinners into God's family. This is the true meaning of Adopting a missionary family. One day this will be accomplished, and every tribe, tongue, people, and nation will give glory to God around His throne (Rev. 5:9).

Adopt a Missionary Family

Fullstature Missions International is committed to the work of missions and has developed a ministry to bring into focus the Great Commission (Matt 28:19-20) set forth by Christ and to support missionary families need. We ask that your family prayerfully consider adopting a missionary family to be a blessing and to be blessed. After you have made an adoption, we encourage you can send your missionary family an email to share about your family and to ask them to share with you. The FMI becomes a bridge to help people you may never know or meet. You can reach out to the missionary during Holidays, birthdays, or anniversaries or just at any time. Commit to lift your missionary up in prayer. (Phil 6)

It is also our desire to support more missionaries through our ministry budget than we currently can do. The missionaries we support currently are under-supported. In other words, the support we grant is not adequate. In most cases, we are nearly able (with Naira) to provide what will keep body and soul together leaving projects in the field undone. This is where you pause and do something.

It is our goal to ensure that every Missionary, supported through, (what we call) the General Fund which includes the "Faith Promise Offering" (FPO), are missionaries we, as a ministry want to support.

The money these Missionaries receive is totally dependent on what is given by the individual or families who have adopted them.

Example: Missionary "Felix" may have two families in First Baptist Church which chose to adopt him. They do so for a combined support of \$200 per month, one for \$75 per month and one for \$125 per month. Should the family who chose to support Missionary "Felix" for \$125 per month be unable to do so for any reason, Missionary "Felix" would only receive \$75 for that month. There will be a "shortfall" and the family who was unable to give what they had purposed to give would not be contacted and asked, "Where is your contribution".

If you have a desire to support a Missionary, please feel free to fill out a "Adopt-A-Missionary Request Form" and return it to our ministry office.

Build a Relationship

Develop a relationship with your adopted missionary family. Learn about their ministry and their ups and downs so that you know when to Praise God with them and when to lift them up in prayer. Being a missionary can have very hard times and there is great comfort when a missionary knows that God is always there and that there are people supporting them at every step.

Faith Promise

In addition to your commitment to get to know and pray for your adopted missionary, you may consider supporting your missionary financially. Among some of the greatest difficulties that missionaries face is having their financial needs met. Missionaries typically spend a significant amount of time raising monies to support their ministries which in turn reduces the amount of time out in the field.

Thank Him for your specific day of birth. Declare that day blessed.

- Thank Him that He ordained that you will be made manifest on earth on a specific day in that month at a specific hour and minute.
- Thank Him that He has a purpose for your life, and it will be fulfilled.
- Ask Jehovah to forgive you where you have for one reason or another, ignored or rejected to recognize your day of birth.
- Thank Jehovah for the day of your conception. (Psa 139:13)
- Thank Jehovah that when He thought of you, he already thought of your entire life. Thank Him that He did not leave anything to chance. (Isa 49:1)
- Thank Him that he knew exactly what your redemptive purpose was going to be. (Psa. 139:16)
- Pray that He will reveal the original you more and more as you enter another year of your life. (Psa 139:13-15)
- Pray that He will restore the heavenly label, and the heavenly name He gave you before you were conceived. (Jer 1:5).
- Speak into the foundations of your life and prophesy good things.
- Prophecy that you will live and not die prematurely in any area of your life. Your family will live, the work of your hand will live and grow from strength to strength. Deut. 33:6, Psa. 27:13, 118:17
- Prophecy and proclaim the blessing of Levi upon your life as a priest unto Jehovah (2 Pet 2:9, Deut 33:8-11)
- Prophecy and proclaim the blessing of Benjamin upon your life Deut. 33:12

 **TUESDAY, JULY 1**

Christ Is the Standard, Not the Exception

Scripture: John 14:12 “He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also...”





Insight: Jesus didn’t live as a superhero inaccessible to His followers. He modelled what a Spirit-filled life could look like. This verse is not a poetic exaggeration; it’s a call to a new normal.

Ancient Story -: The early disciples healed the sick with such intensity that Peter’s shadow healed people (Acts 5:15). They walked in Jesus’ outcomes because they believed His promise.

Modern Story -: John G. Lake, missionary to South Africa, walked in divine healing so profoundly that government health departments recognized it. He saw miracles because he contended for the Christ-standard.

Practical Application:

- Memorize John 14:12.
- Write down areas in your life or ministry where you’re not yet seeing “Christ-level” outcomes.

 **WEDNESDAY, JULY 2**

Conformed, Not Just Converted

Scripture: Romans 8:29 “Predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son...”

Insight: Salvation is the doorway; transformation is the journey. Being conformed to Christ means both character and capability are being shaped.

Ancient Story –: Stephen, though a deacon, moved in signs and wisdom so strong that no one could refute him (Acts 6:10). He wasn’t an apostle—but he reflected Christ.

Modern Story –: Brother Yun (“The Heavenly Man”) in China was imprisoned, tortured, and yet walked in supernatural escape, endurance, and forgiveness—evidence of Christ’s image forged in fire.

Practical Application:

- Identify one character flaw or fear that Christ would not carry—submit it in prayer.
- Begin journaling how Christ would behave, speak, and respond in your current season.
- ***Have ever been reading scripture or you saw a publication that challenged your faith, and you felt intimidated?*** You have to become immune to shame and fear. The scriptures declare that both are not in the Father’s house.



THURSDAY, JULY 3

Pressing On with Purpose

Scripture: Philippians 3:12–14 “I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me...”

Insight: Paul admits he hasn’t “arrived,” but he refuses to settle. Kingdom alignment requires relentless pursuit, not casual observance.

Ancient Story –: Elisha pursued Elijah which brought a resolve, passing through multiple cities while others remained behind. His pursuit a double portion (2 Kings 2).

Modern Story –: Smith Wigglesworth, a plumber who couldn’t read until adulthood, pressed into God’s power so much that he raised over 20 people from the dead. **He never coasted—he contended.** We must contend for the faith once delivered to the saints

Practical Application:

- Set a 3-day fast (can be partial) to seek greater alignment with your calling.
- Ask: What must I press past—comfort, fear, comparison, shame?



FRIDAY, JULY 4

Walking as Jesus Walked

Scripture: 1 John 2:6, “Whoever claims to live in Him must walk as Jesus did.”

Insight: This is not about sandals and robes; it’s about living out His compassion, accurate revelation from the word, boldness, prayer life, and miracle ministry. It’s a whole-life alignment.

Ancient Story —: Jesus withdrew often to pray—sometimes all night. So did the apostles. This walk wasn’t just public—it was cultivated in secret places.

Modern Story —: Heidi Baker in Mozambique walks among the poorest, healing the blind, raising the dead, and loving children with Jesus’ heart. Her secret? Intimacy with Christ.

Practical Application:

- Choose one practice of Jesus (e.g., prayer early in the morning, healing the sick, showing compassion) **and imitate it for 7 days**

Apostolic believers don’t just recognize the gap—they mobilize to close it. They understand the Kingdom is advanced not by comfort but by transformation. The apostles pressed forward despite resistance because they were driven by alignment with Christ’s fullness.

Modern Example: Many examples abound today who are leading with apostolic clarity—they model obedience and establish Kingdom order without compromise, urging others to rise to their God-given potential.

Action Step:

- Identify one area in your life or leadership that is below Christ’s standard.
- Write a Kingdom action plan to grow into that standard this month. For example.

KINGDOM ACTION PLAN

To Grow in the Boldness of Christ

SCRIPTURES

Acts 4:29 “Grant to your servants to continue to speak your word with all boldness.”

2 Timothy 1:7 “For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control.”

Ephesians 6:19 “That words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel.”

PRAYERS

Ask God to fill me with the Holy Spirit and make me bold

Pray for God’s love to cast out every fear in my heart

Seek the Lord for courage to speak the gospel clearly

ACTIONS

Purpose to obey God rather than man

Look for opportunities to share my testimony boldly

Stand firm in the truth of God’s Word when challenged

Be willing to suffer for the sake of Christ and the gospel

Prayer Declaration: “Lord, grant me apostolic boldness to confront the gap and build according to Your pattern. I refuse stagnation—I grow until Christ is fully formed in me and through me.”



SATURDAY, JULY 5

The Gap Is a Divine Invitation

Theme: “Prophetic believers don’t run from discomfort—they lean into the refining fire.”

Scripture: Malachi 3:3 – “He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver...”

Devotional Insight: Prophets see what others avoid—the holy tension between what is and what should be. When God exposes the gap, it’s not rejection—it’s a

divine invitation to become the message. The prophetic life demands courage to be transformed before declaring transformation.

Biblical Example: Isaiah saw the Lord and cried, “Woe is me!” before he heard “Whom shall I send?” (Isaiah 6). Prophets are first purified, then commissioned.

Action Step:

- Set aside 30 minutes in stillness. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you a part of your life not aligned with heaven.
- Write the vision of who you are becoming in that area.

Prayer Declaration: “Lord, I welcome Your refining fire. Expose what hinders me. Align me with heaven’s vision and let my life prophesy what You desire to see on earth.”



SUNDAY, JULY 6

Pursued to Pursue

Theme: “The gospel saves us, yes—but it also transforms us daily into His image.”

Scripture: Philippians 3:12-14 – “I press on to take hold of that for which Christ took hold of me...”

Devotional Insight: Evangelists know: salvation is just the beginning. People are drawn not to perfection, but to progress in Christ. True witnesses don’t pretend to have arrived—they testify that they are pressing in. This honesty draws the hungry.

Modern Example: Todd White, once a drug addict, now lives as a bold evangelist. His transformed life—not just his message—has brought multitudes to Christ.

Action Step:

- Share with someone today how God is still transforming you.
- Invite someone into the journey—salvation is the first step, not the finish line.

Prayer Declaration: “Jesus, You didn’t just save me—you’re shaping me. Let my life be a living witness of transformation. I will testify of Your work in me, and call others to walk the same path.”

MONDAY, JULY 7

From Knowledge to Transformation

Theme: “Teaching brings understanding—but transformation demands application.”

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 3:18 – “We are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory...”

Devotional Insight: Teachers equip others to grow by making truth understandable and practical. True discipleship doesn’t excuse the gap—it explains it, applies Scripture to it, and models how to grow through it. Alignment is progressive and Spirit-led.

Historical Example: Watchman Nee’s teaching ministry impacted generations because he taught not just ideas, but transformation—he lived what he taught.

Action Step:

- Study 2 Corinthians 3:17–18 in multiple translations.
- Teach one person what it means to be “transformed from glory to glory.”

Prayer Declaration: “Holy Spirit, be my teacher and my transformer. I won’t settle for knowing truth—I will apply it. Shape me into Christ’s image day by day.”

TUESDAY, JULY 8

Guiding Others to Grow

Theme: “Pastors don’t shame the gap—they shepherd others across it with love and truth.”

Scripture: Colossians 1:28 – “We proclaim Him, admonishing and teaching everyone...so that we may present everyone fully mature in Christ.”

Devotional Insight: A pastoral heart sees where people are, but also where they could be. It gently but firmly walks with them across the gap. True shepherds don’t ignore immaturity—but neither do they condemn it. They lead others into Christ-likeness by love, example, and encouragement.

Modern Example: Jack Hayford modelled this pastoral grace—he was deeply biblical, profoundly loving, and always urging others toward Christ-likeness with

patience. Our great patriarch. Prof. Anthony Uwaifo once attended where Jack Hayford was pastor in California. He told me one day the pastor came to church and said he would not preach because he just had an argument with his wife. The church was so encouraged.

Action Step:

- Identify one person in your circle who needs encouragement to grow.
- Offer a listening ear and a Scripture-based encouragement today.

Prayer Declaration: “Lord, make me a shepherd after Your heart—full of grace and truth. Help me guide others with patience and grow with them as we press into Christ together.”

Contending for Christ-Level Outcomes

“Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do...” — John 14:12 (ESV)



Overview: This devotional series is for believers frustrated or hungry for more—those who know Christ has promised more fruit, more power, more purity, more clarity, more authority—but aren’t yet experiencing it. It’s a daily call to contend, align, grow, and refuse to normalize subpar spiritual results.



WEDNESDAY, JULY 9

Admit the Gap Without Shame

Scripture: Romans 3:23, Philippians 3:12–14

Key Thought: Recognizing we’re not yet seeing “Christ-level” fruit is not defeat—it’s the beginning of spiritual honesty and maturity.

Reflection: Don’t spiritualize stagnation. Jesus healed all. He walked in unbroken fellowship with the Father. He exercised authority over nature, demons, and disease. Are you? If not, admit it. Not with condemnation—but with courage.

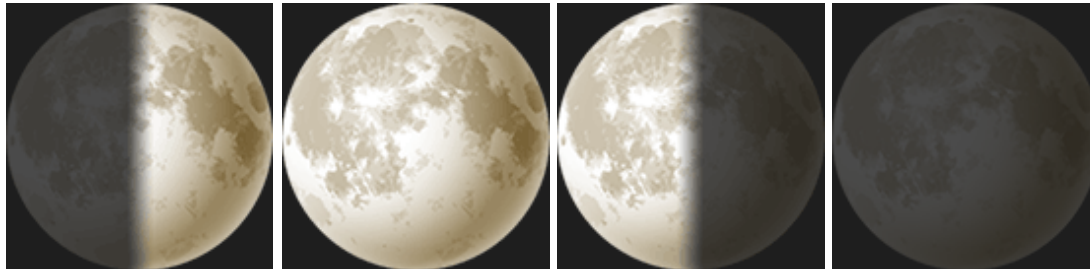

THURSDAY, JULY 10

Let the Promise Confront You

Scripture: John 14:12, 1 John 2:6

Key Thought: Jesus said believers would do what He did. He wasn't exaggerating.

Reflection: Most read John 14:12 like it's poetic. But Jesus meant it literally. It should confront us. His words expose how normalized unbelief has become in Christian culture.

Action Step: Read John 14:12 out loud 10 times today. Let it burn away unbelief.

Prayer: “Jesus, Your words confront my small thinking. I receive them as truth. Teach me to live like You.”

FRIDAY, JULY 11

Refuse to Excuse Carnal Results

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 3:1–3, Romans 8:6–11

Key Thought: We often explain away powerlessness with religious-sounding excuses. Stop.

Reflection: Some blame “God’s mysterious will” for what is actually spiritual immaturity, compromise, or lack of intimacy. Paul called this “fleshly.” Jesus never blamed the Father for His failures—because He didn’t have any.

Action Step: List any religious excuses you’ve used to justify lack of results. Renounce them. **Kill your sacred cows and roast them forever.**

Prayer: “Father, expose where I have cloaked unbelief in spiritual language. I choose truth over excuse.”



SATURDAY, JULY 12

Hunger is Holy

Scripture: Matthew 5:6, Psalm 63:1–3

Key Thought: Deep hunger for Christ-likeness is not pride—it’s a gift from God.

Reflection: You’re not greedy when you long for more of Jesus in your life. Jesus called hunger blessed. It drives you to seek, knock, and contend. Hunger is the womb of transformation.

Action Step: Fast once or twice a week. Use that time to cry out for deeper hunger.

Prayer: “Lord, make me unsatisfied with shallow living. Increase my hunger for Your glory.”



SUNDAY, JULY 13

Dig Into Christ’s Pattern

Scripture: Luke 5:16, Mark 1:35, John 5:19

Key Thought: Jesus walked in power because He lived in intimacy and obedience.

Reflection: Jesus didn’t just perform miracles—He prayed often, listened constantly, and obeyed perfectly. If we want His results, we need His rhythms.

Action Step: Study one day in Jesus' life (e.g., Mark 1). Note how He lived before He ministered. Journal what habits you need to adopt.

Prayer: "Jesus, I want to walk as You walked. Teach me Your rhythms of intimacy."



MONDAY, JULY 14

Power Flows Where Purity Reigns

Scripture: Matthew 5:8, Hebrews 1:9, 2 Timothy 2:21

Key Thought: Purity isn't optional for power—it's the pipeline

Reflection: Jesus saw the Father clearly because His heart was pure. When we tolerate sin, we blur our spiritual vision and short-circuit divine power. God anoints clean vessels.

Action Step: Ask the Holy Spirit to search your heart. Repent where compromise has dulled your authority.

Prayer: "Holy Spirit, purify me. I want clean hands and a pure heart—not for pride, but for power."



TUESDAY, JULY 15

Train for Greater Capacity

Scripture: Hebrews 5:14, 1 Timothy 4:7–8

Key Thought: Maturity requires intentional training. You don't drift into Christ-level outcomes.

Reflection: Jesus grew in wisdom and stature. Paul trained like an athlete. Spiritual capacity expands through discipline—word, prayer, fasting, fellowship, obedience etc..

Action Step: Set a training goal (e.g., praying 30 mins daily, fasting weekly, memorizing Scripture). Start today.

Prayer: "Lord, stretch me. Make me strong for the assignment You've placed on my life."

WEDNESDAY, JULY 16

Take Authority—Don't Just Observe

Scripture: Luke 10:19, Acts 3:6, Mark 11:23

Key Thought: Jesus didn't just endure darkness—He confronted it. So must you.

Reflection: Many believers admire Jesus' boldness but live passively. Christ-level living involves speaking to mountains, rebuking spirits, and declaring the Word.

Action Step: Identify one situation today where you need to exercise authority. Do it—speak, declare, bind, release.

Prayer: “In Jesus' name, I step into the authority You've given me. I declare Your kingdom come in my world.”

THURSDAY, JULY 17

Partner with the Spirit, Not Flesh





Scripture: Galatians 5:16–25, Acts 1:8

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is your source of supernatural results, not your effort.

Reflection: Jesus ministered “by the Spirit.” We often strive in the flesh—straining, not flowing. True fruit comes from abiding and obeying in partnership with the Spirit.

Action Step: Pause before each major activity today and invite the Holy Spirit to lead.

FRIDAY, JULY 18

Keep Pressing Until Fulfilment

Scripture: Hebrews 10:36, Luke 18:1–8, Philippians 3:13–14

Key Thought: Don't adjust your theology to match your results. Adjust your life to match His promise.

Reflection: Faith doesn't quit. Contending means pressing even when results are delayed. Elijah prayed 7 times. The woman with the issue of blood pressed through a crowd. Jesus endured the cross. So must we.


Action Step: Review the 3 areas you listed on July 9. Renew your resolve to press in until your life matches Jesus' promise. You may have problems in the family ...apply the promises of God.

Prayer: "Lord, I will not settle. I will press until Christ is fully formed in me and through me."

Declaration you can Use Daily:

"I am becoming like Christ in word, in purity, in love, and in power. I refuse to settle for anything less than what He died to give. I will press until Christ is fully formed in me. Amen."

SATURDAY, JULY 19

 **Tokens God Can Show Us.** Biblical Signs and wonders of His Covenant, Presence, and Favor. (With Journaling Questions and Ancient Stories of Encouragement) *These are evidences of God's voice, presence, answers to prayer etc...*

Rainbow – Covenant of Mercy

Scripture: Genesis 9:13 – “I do set my bow in the cloud... for a token of a covenant.” These are evidences of God’s voice, presence, answers to prayer etc...

Reflection: The rainbow was God’s promise to Noah that judgment by flood would never come again. It’s a sign of enduring mercy and generational faithfulness. *After storms, God may still show us a “rainbow” moment—symbolic of hope, peace, and His mercy in our journey.*

Ancient Story: After the flood, Noah worshiped, and the rainbow appeared. This marked a new era—not just survival but promise. That same bow still reminds us: judgment may come, but mercy prevails.

Journaling Questions: (This means you take notes)

- Have you ever seen a “rainbow” moment after a storm in your life?
- Where is God reminding you of His covenant mercy right now?



SUNDAY, JULY 20

Blood – Redemption and Protection

Scripture: Exodus 12:13 – “The blood shall be to you for a token... and when I see the blood, I will pass over you.”

Reflection: The blood on doorposts saved Israel’s firstborns. It marked them for protection and freedom. **Today, Christ’s blood speaks better things than Abel’s—deliverance, covering, and identity.** Meditate on the words... **deliverance, covering, and identity**

Ancient Story: In Egypt, Israel obeyed the strange command to smear lamb’s blood on their homes. That act triggered their deliverance from centuries of slavery. The blood worked. Sometimes God might command you to anoint children with oil before they go to school or for a competition or sprinkle some salt on the front door or your office etc... Or take communion as a family.

Journaling Questions:

- Where do you need to freshly apply the blood of Jesus in your life or family?
- What danger or judgment have you escaped because of God’s covering?

MONDAY, JULY 21

Circumcision – Covenant of Separation

Scripture: Genesis 17:11 – “It shall be a token of the covenant betwixt me and you.”

Reflection: Circumcision marked Israel as God’s own. As a matter of fact we still circumcise our boy children today. Today, spiritual circumcision is about the heart. It’s not just removal—but separation for intimacy, obedience, and holiness.

Ancient Story: Before taking the Promised Land, Joshua had the new generation circumcised (Joshua 5). They had to renew the token before receiving inheritance.

Journaling Questions:

- Is there anything God is asking you to “cut away” for deeper intimacy?
- In what area are you sensing a fresh call to consecration? That is God pulling you near. Do not refuse. He is preparing you for something.

TUESDAY, JULY 22-- Staff or Rod – Authority and Divine Power

Scripture: Exodus 4:17 – “Take this rod... wherewith thou shalt do signs.”

Reflection: The rod in Moses’ hand represented God’s power in partnership with his obedience. *God still gives you spiritual tokens—mantles, objects, or assignments—through which His authority flows. The name of the Lord Jesus is a strong tower the righteous run into it and they are safe*

Ancient Story: When Moses lifted his rod, the Red Sea parted. It was just a shepherd’s staff—until surrendered to God. It became the staff of miracles.

Journaling Questions: write.

- What “rod” has God placed in your hand (gifting, calling, platform)?
- Are you using it with faith or fear?

WEDNESDAY, JULY 23

Cloud and Fire – Divine Presence and Guidance

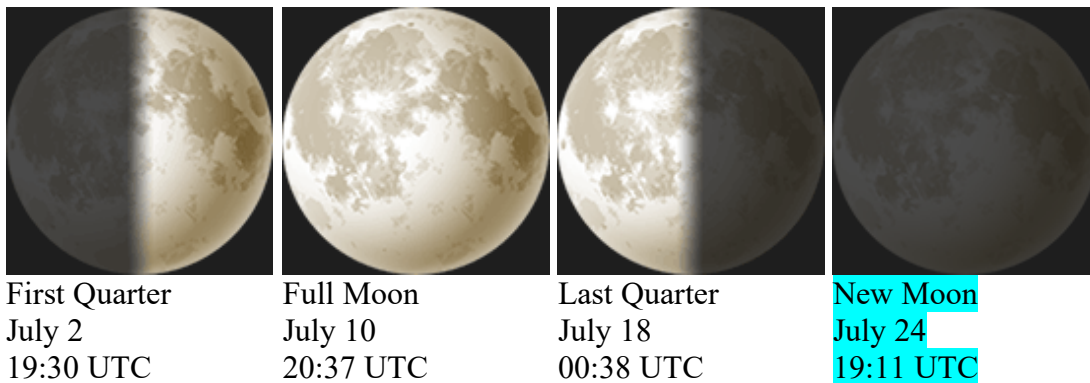
Scripture: Exodus 13:21–22 – “By day in a pillar of cloud... by night in a pillar of fire.”

Reflection: The cloud and fire led Israel visibly, night and day. *Even today, God gives “pillar-like” tokens—spiritual impressions, dreams, mentors, or Scripture that direct us through wilderness seasons.*

Ancient Story: When the cloud moved, Israel moved. When it stopped, they stopped—even for months. **It trained them to follow God’s rhythm, not their own. Today many Christians do not care about God’s will or direction. You must care.**

Journaling Questions:

- What has God used recently as a “cloud” or “fire” to guide you?
- Are you willing to stay when He stays, and move only when He moves?



 **THURSDAY, JULY 24**

Manna – Daily Provision

Scripture: Exodus 16:33–34 – “Lay it up before the Lord, to be kept **for your generations.**”

Many churches just do “free willing” in teaching in the church or with their children. They forget that these children are the next generation and needs a systematic way to receive the word of God so that the next generation can have a legacy they transfer to generations.

Reflection: Manna was fresh *each morning*. God wanted Israel to trust Him daily—not hoard. Today, daily grace, provision, and insight are still how God trains us in trust.

Ancient Story: Some Israelites tried to gather more than needed. It rotted. But on the Sabbath, God preserved it. He controls the supply and the system.

Journaling Questions:

- Are you trusting God for today's portion—or hoarding in fear?
- Where has God miraculously provided “just enough” in your journey?



FRIDAY, JULY 25

Fleece – Confirming God's Will

Scripture: Judges 6:36–40 – “Let it now be dry only upon the fleece...”

Reflection: Gideon was unsure. God graciously confirmed His word through signs. While faith is ideal, God still uses “fleeces”—tokens of assurance—for those honestly seeking clarity.

Ancient Story: God didn't scold Gideon for asking. He confirmed twice. The “fleece” led Gideon to tear down idols and rally Israel for victory.

Journaling Questions:

- What decision are you wrestling with and need confirmation for?
- Has God already shown you a “fleece” you've overlooked?



SATURDAY, JULY 26

Open Doors – Divine Opportunity

Scripture: Revelation 3:8 – “Behold, I have set before thee an open door...”

Reflection: Open doors are divine setups. They represent access to new realms of purpose or provision. Don't try to pry open what God hasn't opened—but walk boldly through what He has.

Ancient Story: Paul testified in 1 Corinthians 16:9 that a great “door” had opened for effective ministry. But there were adversaries too. Opposition doesn't mean the door is false.

Journaling Questions:

- What open doors do you sense before you?

- Are fear or unworthiness keeping you from walking through them?



SUNDAY, JULY 27

Divine Dreams or Visions – Revelation

Scripture: Acts 2:17 – “Your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.”

Reflection: From Abraham to Joseph to Peter, God has spoken through night visions. Today, dreams and visions still carry direction, warning, or encouragement.

Ancient Story: Joseph’s dreams put him in trouble—but they were accurate. In prison and palace, his ability to interpret dreams became the vehicle for his elevation

Journaling Questions:

- What recent dream or inner picture has lingered with you?
- Could God be speaking direction through it?



MONDAY, JULY 28

Peace – Heart Confirmation

Scripture: Colossians 3:15 – “Let the peace of God rule in your hearts.”

Reflection: Peace is a token more powerful than logic. If your spirit is uneasy, God may be restraining you. When He leads, peace often wraps your heart like a blanket.

Ancient Story: Paul sensed unrest before sailing (Acts 27), but he was overruled—and the ship wrecked. He later warned others not to ignore inner peace or red flags.

Journaling Questions:

- Where do you currently feel peace or unrest about a decision?
- Are you letting peace “umpire” your steps—or are you rushing ahead?



TUESDAY, JULY 29



God's Voice – Personal Communication

Scripture: 1 Samuel 3:10 – “And the Lord came, and stood, and called as at other times, Samuel, Samuel. Then Samuel answered, Speak; for thy servant heareth.”

Reflection: God's voice is one of His most intimate tokens. He may speak through Scripture, dreams, impressions, or even stillness. Hearing His voice brings direction and reveals relationship. Sometimes it comes gently, sometimes clearly—but always personally.

Ancient Story: Young Samuel was unfamiliar with God's voice, but Eli helped him recognize it. That encounter shifted Samuel from a temple helper to a national prophet.

Journaling Questions:

- How do you usually sense or recognize God's voice?
- What has He said recently that you need to act on or confirm?



WEDNESDAY, JULY 30



Holy Spirit Manifestations – Presence of God

Scripture: Acts 2:3–4 – “And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire... and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost.”

Reflection: The Holy Spirit's manifestations—wind, fire, tongues, shaking, prophecy—are tokens of God's tangible presence and power. They mark divine commissioning and boldness for spiritual assignments.

Ancient Story: At Pentecost, timid disciples became bold witnesses. Tongues of fire rested on them, symbolizing God's empowering presence for global mission.

Journaling Questions:

- When have you felt or seen a manifestation of the Spirit?
- How did that moment change or empower you?



 **THURSDAY, JULY 31**

Angel Encounters – Divine Assignment or Protection

Scripture: Luke 1:19 – “I am Gabriel, that stand in the presence of God; and am sent to speak unto thee...”

Reflection: Angels are ministering spirits sent to help, warn, or strengthen God’s people. Though not always visible, they are active around believers. When they do appear, they carry messages, direction, or deliverance.

Ancient Story: Gabriel’s visit to Zechariah preceded the birth of John the Baptist. The encounter brought divine clarity—but also accountability (Zechariah’s doubt led to silence).

Journaling Questions:

- Do you recall a moment that felt supernaturally protected or divinely arranged?
- Are you alert to how God might use angelic help in your current journey?
