What is presented are not Jewish Dates or the Jewish calendar but what the LORD instituted which we all see manifested in the movement of the Moon every month. The enemy has always manipulated these bodies for which believers are just becoming aware. This season is also a special edition of revelation which brings a new breath of fresh air without adding to the word of God but confirms it and makes our faith stronger.

You may wish to pray in two ways:-

- 1. You can pray using the whole journal to pray into the womb of time according to the authority level granted to you by your appointment in the Lord. Expect the prophetic germination [as you saturate the ground and the womb of time with God's ordination] to happen. In any case ensure your seed remains in the ground as investment for the coming year. Determine, and command what this month should deliver to you and what it should not and must Not.
- 2. You can also use this daily for your prayers AND DEVOTION to prevail at the gate of each day, especially on critical days of intense warfare in the heavens. Remember that the day starts from 6pm for the next 24 hours. If you are in Britain for instance the time will be early hours of the next day in Hong Kong @ your 6pm.
- 3. This document may seem lengthy, but it shows the effort that was generated in prayer. You can keep it and save it for use in a good way.

Pray that your prophetic faculties will be on the rise and be enlarged and sharp...<u>visions</u>; <u>dreams</u>; <u>interpreting symbols</u>; <u>applying parables</u>; <u>riddles</u>; <u>revelation and predictions</u>; <u>accurate delivery of words of wisdom and words of knowledge</u>; <u>intercessions</u>; interaction with heaven etc.. Divine decrees to cause the future and many other such faculties.

SHAPE YOUR DAY, MONTH AND CONSEQUENTLY YOUR YEARS

Healing, Purpose, and a Testimony: Why AM I Still Alive?

Luke 13:1–9

Introduction.

The words of Jesus in Luke 13:1–9 carry both tenderness and urgency. In this passage, He confronts human assumptions about suffering, points us to the need for repentance, and reveals God's patience through the parable of the barren fig tree. Within these verses lies a threefold rhythm of the Christian life—healing, purpose, and testimony. Healing addresses our inner and outer brokenness, purpose aligns us with divine intention, and testimony ensures that our lives bear fruit for the glory of God.

This article explores these themes in detail, drawing on the richness of Scripture, practical examples, and testimonies in contemporary times to show how Luke 13:1–9 speaks to believers today.

1. The Context of Luke 13:1–9

The chapter begins with people bringing news to Jesus about Galileans who were slaughtered by Pilate and about eighteen people who died when a tower fell in Siloam. The people wanted an explanation: were these tragedies punishments for unusual sin? Jesus rejected that conclusion. Instead, He declared, "Unless you repent, you will all likewise perish" (vv. 3, 5). He, then told the parable of a barren fig tree. A man had planted it in his vineyard and came three years in a row seeking fruit, but found none. He wanted to cut it down. Yet the gardener pleaded for one more year to cultivate it, fertilize it, and see if it would yet bear fruit. This background reveals three dimensions of divine engagement with humanity:

- 1. Healing God addresses not only physical tragedy but also the inner disease of sin.
- 2. Purpose Every tree planted in God's vineyard is meant to bear fruit.
- 3. Testimony The fruit itself becomes a witness of God's patience and transforming power.

2. Healing: Beyond Physical Tragedy

2.1. Healing the Misconception about Suffering (Luke 13:1-5)

The first healing in Luke 13 is that: *the people assumed that tragedy equals divine punishment*. Jesus corrected them. Healing begins when our distorted views of God are repaired. He is not a cruel judge waiting to strike but a loving Father calling all to repentance. It is common today for many to ask cynically: why has God allowed this death, and that tragedy and suffering around the world? Jesus sort to correct these cynical views of many and heal them. Suffering is not always the result of personal sin.

o John 9:3 – "Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him."

Just as Jesus clarified with the blind man, suffering can be a platform for God's glory, not evidence of guilt. God's character is compassionate, not punitive.

• Psalm 103:8–10 – "The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in mercy. He has not dealt with us according to our sins, nor punished us according to our iniquities."

Healing comes as we embrace God's mercy instead of projecting harshness onto Him. Repentance, not blame, is the right response to tragedy.

o Acts 17:30 – "God commands all men everywhere to repent."

Jesus redirected the crowd from assigning blame toward personal responsibility before God.

2.2. Healing from Sin (Luke 13:3,5)

While the Galileans' bloodshed and the tower's collapse were tragic, Jesus redirected the conversation: *the greater danger is spiritual death through unrepentance*. We need to redirect a lot of conversation in our day. True healing is not just surviving accidents but being restored. Sin brings spiritual death, but repentance restores life.

o Romans 6:23 – "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Healing from sin is stepping from death into the gift of life through Christ. Forgiveness is available to all through Christ's sacrifice.

o 1 John 1:9 – "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Healing flows as guilt is lifted and righteousness is imparted. Healing from sin empowers a new walk. 2 Corinthians 5:17 – "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new."

Healing is not just pardon, but transformation into a new lifestyle.

2.3. Healing of Patience. (Luke 13:6-9)

In the parable, the barren fig tree was not immediately cut down. The gardener interceded, offering another chance. This is healing in the form of time, mercy, and divine patience. Many of us are living testimonies that God did not "cut us off" when we were fruitless. He healed us by granting time, nourishment, and care.

God's patience is salvation. 2 Peter 3:9 – "The Lord is not slack concerning His promise... but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance."

His patience heals us by giving us room to turn back to Him. God nurtures us toward fruitfulness. *Philippians 1:6* – "He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ." The gardener's digging and fertilizing show how God actively works to help us bear fruit. Patience itself is evidence of grace. *Isaiah 30:18* – "Therefore the Lord will wait, that He may be gracious to you." God's waiting is not weakness; it is grace in action, giving us time to heal, grow, and produce.

2.4. Testimony of Healing.

Consider the story of a woman who lived years in bitterness because of a tragic loss. She assumed God had punished her family. But through counselling, Scripture, and prayer, she discovered God's healing love. Instead of blaming Him, she began to bear fruit in comforting others who grieved. Her healing became a testimony that tragedies do not define God's love; rather, His patience restores us.

3. Purpose: The Call to Fruitfulness

3.1. God Plants with Purpose

The fig tree was not wild; it was planted in a vineyard. This speaks of divine intention. You and I are not accidents. Our placement in families, communities, and churches is deliberate. Like the fig tree, we were set in God's vineyard to bear fruit.

3.2. Purpose Defined by Fruit

Fruit in Scripture refers to visible evidence of inner life. Paul speaks of the "fruit of the Spirit" (Galatians 5:22–23) and Jesus said, "By their fruits you shall know them" (Matthew 7:16). Purpose is not abstract—it is measurable in love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, faithfulness, and service.

3.3. The Danger of Fruitlessness

The vineyard owner was ready to cut down the barren tree. Fruitlessness is dangerous because it contradicts divine purpose. A Christian who bears no fruit risks misrepresenting Christ to the world. Jesus said, "Every branch in me that does not bear fruit He takes away" (John 15:2).

3.4. Cultivating Purpose

The gardener pleaded for more time to dig and fertilize the tree. Likewise, God provides cultivation through Scripture, fellowship, trials, and the Spirit. Purpose matures as we submit to pruning and growth. A Christian who avoids discomfort may also avoid fruitfulness.

3.5. Testimony of Purpose Fulfilled.

One missionary recalled how he spent years without clear direction. His ministry seemed barren. But in a season of prayer and renewal, God clarified his purpose: to disciple young leaders in rural areas. Today, dozens of churches trace their roots to his labor. His purpose unfolded through patient cultivation.

4. Testimony: The Fruit that Speaks

4.1. A Life that Testifies.

Fruit is not for the tree itself but for others. Our testimony is the outflow of God's grace in us. A tree that bears fruit feeds the hungry, provides shade, and multiplies seeds. In the same way, a Christian's testimony nourishes others and multiplies faith.

4.2. The Testimony of Transformation

The barren tree that finally bears fruit becomes a story of grace. Our greatest testimony is not perfection but transformation. People glorify God when they see our healing, purpose, and ongoing change.

4.3. Collective Testimony.

The Church itself is called to be a vineyard of testimonies. When believers gather, their stories of God's patience and power strengthen others. The early church grew because of apostolic testimony, not just doctrine.

4.4. Testimony in Suffering

Even tragedies can become testimonies. The tower of Siloam may have crushed bodies, but survivors had the chance to live differently afterward. In modern times, survivors of war, disease, or loss often carry the testimony of God's sustaining grace.

5. Healing, Purpose, and Testimony Interwoven

5.1. Healing Enables Purpose

We cannot fulfil divine purpose while crippled by misconceptions, guilt, or unrepentance. Healing restores us to clarity and freedom. Like the fig tree that receives care, we need healing before fruit can emerge.

5.2. Purpose Produces Testimony

Once healed, we step into our purpose, and the fruit that results becomes our testimony. Without purpose, there is no fruit; without fruit, there is no testimony.

5.3. Testimony Sustains Healing in Others

The cycle continues when our testimony becomes healing for someone else. Just as one person's story of forgiveness heals another's bitterness, so testimonies multiply healing and awaken purpose across generations.

6. Practical Lessons for Today

- 1. Do not misinterpret tragedy. Tragedy is not always punishment. Instead, it is a call to examine our hearts and repent.
- 2. Seek healing beyond the surface. True healing is spiritual restoration, not just survival.
- 3. Embrace divine patience. If you are still alive, God has not given up on you. He is cultivating you.
- 4. Discover your purpose. Like the fig tree, you are planted intentionally. Ask God to reveal your fruit-bearing assignment.
- 5. Value testimonies. Share your story of grace; it may be the fertilizer for someone else's barren season.

7. Contemporary Testimonies that Mirror Luke 13

Testimony 1: Healing from Misconceptions

A young man believed his poverty was God's punishment. After hearing the Word of God, he realized that his worth was not measured by wealth but by God's love. This healing of his perspective freed him to pursue his purpose—mentoring others in his community.

Testimony 2: Purpose in Barrenness.

A couple endured years of childlessness. Like the barren tree, they felt useless. Yet during that season, they adopted orphans and established a children's home. Their purpose blossomed, proving that barrenness does not mean fruitlessness.

Testimony 3: Testimony in Tragedy

A survivor of a collapsed building became a preacher, using his survival story to call others to repentance. His testimony bore fruit as many turned to Christ, not because of theological arguments but because of the power of a lived story.

8. A Christ-Centered Understanding

Ultimately, Luke 13:1–9 points us to Christ Himself. He is the gardener who intercedes for us, asking the Father for time to heal and cultivate us. His cross is the digging, His blood the fertilizer, and His Spirit the water. The testimony of every fruitful believer is possible because Jesus, the patient gardener, refused to let us be cut down too soon.

Conclusion

Luke 13:1–9 is a call to see life through three lenses: healing, purpose, and testimony. Healing delivers us from misconceptions about God and from the paralysis of sin. Purpose aligns us with God's expectation to bear fruit. Testimony becomes the outward evidence that we are living extensions of His grace. The barren fig tree stands as both a warning and a hope. A warning that fruitlessness invites judgment. A hope that as long as Christ intercedes,

there is room for healing and growth. Your life, like that tree, may seem barren now. But with divine cultivation, it can yet bear fruit that will nourish generations. May we embrace God's healing, step into our purpose, and live as testimonies of His unending patience and love. Amen.

Fullstature College of the Bible and Missions (FCBM) will help take out the raw edges, sand out the splinters and prepared you for God to add the varnish, readying us to begin your work. Don't get us wrong we have always been a little unfinished, but God has helped us to help others since 1994. In this work, we will always need to be learning, growing, and adapting.

Missionary Challenge

The countries that have received the greatest amount of Western missionary attention over two centuries contain the greatest number of unreached and unreached people groups: China and India (which once included Pakistan and Bangladesh).

Navigating The VAV Year (2025-2026)(5785–5786) In A PEY Season (2021-2029) (The Decade Of The Mouth).

(I humbly write as the Lord has given me light to show to the church on how we must <u>stake</u> our inheritance, ensuring promises don't float away but remain fastened in our lives, families, on the missions' fields, places of battle, ministries, and countries. We as God's people must not shy away from these dimensions of staking—Identity, Connection, Manifestation, and Transformation—anchor heaven's promises into the earth, securing our covenant inheritance in Christ.

I will try and explain these in structured sections, weaving together prophetic proclamation (seeing and declaring) and apostolic enforcement (governing and establishing).

Prophetic and Apostolic Guide into a VAV Year (2026) in a PEY Season

Staking Our Inheritance Through Proclamation and Enforcement

Introduction: A VAV Year in a PEY Season

We are in the midst of a remarkable prophetic timeline. We have often stressed the nature of the writing of this journal. It is strategic as it guides into God's Timeline so that YOU CAN EXPERIENCE REDEMPTION LIFT. *If you pay attention, you push forward and breakout*. The Hebraic calendar year 5786 is not just a number—it is a spiritual code pointing to times, seasons, and divine alignments. The decade of the PEY (80s) emphasizes the mouth, speech, and decrees. We must not soon forget the COVID years as the enemy desired to shut our mouths. What we proclaim carries weight, shaping destinies, cities, and nations.

But within this decade, the year 5786 draws out a particular letter: VAV (1). *VAV is the sixth letter of the Hebrew alphabet and functions as a nail, hook, or connector*. It binds together what seems divided, joining heaven to earth, word to fulfilment, and spirit to matter. When PEY (mouth/declaration) and VAV (nail/connection) operate together, they create a kingdom dynamic of proclamation and enforcement. Amen.

This article will explore how to walk in prophetic and apostolic dimensions this year—prophesying God's decrees (prophetic proclamation) and governing them into reality (apostolic enforcement).

Part One: Understanding the Times—Why PEY and VAV Matter

The PEY Decade (5780–5789)

- PEY means mouth: it is the decade of prophetic speech, decrees, and utterances (Proverbs 18:21).
- God is raising His people to <u>speak life over chaos</u>, to <u>frame futures by His Word</u>, and to <u>silence false voices that confuse nations</u>.
- The PEY season is about power in the mouth, but not just any speech—it is speech aligned with Heaven.

The VAV Year (5786)

- VAV means nail or hook. It is used in Hebrew grammar as "and"—a connector.
- Spiritually, VAV connects heaven and earth (Genesis 1 repeatedly says, "And God said... and it was so").
- It is about <u>staking</u> inheritance—<u>nailing down promises so they don't drift away</u>.

Together, PEY + VAV mean that this year is not about random speech but anchored decrees that bind heaven's will to earth's reality.

Part Two: Prophetic Proclamation—Speaking as Heaven Speaks

Prophecy begins with seeing and saying. This is the PEY dimension—what comes out of your mouth shapes the year ahead. But PEY in a VAV year means our words are not loose—they are nails that fasten destiny.

1. Identity: Standing in Christ the Son of Man

- **Scripture:** "As He is, so are we in this world" (1 John 4:17).
- **Proclamation**: I am not just a voice in the wind; I am one seated with Christ (Ephesians 2:6). My decrees give a voice to His authority.
- **Application:** When you declare healing, you speak as one joined to the Great Physician. When you decree resolutions to family issues, you speak as one joined to the Father of families in heaven.
- When you decree provision, you speak as one joined to the Lord of abundance.

Prophetic Insight: Many in this year will face <u>identity</u> challenges—<u>feeling small, powerless, poor, or unheard</u>. But God is saying: Your authority comes from union with Christ. Every decree you make in Him is a stake driven into the earth.

2. Connection: Heaven and Earth United

- **Scripture**: "Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" (Matt. 6:10).
- **Proclamation:** My words are not just prayers—they are bridges between heaven and earth
- **Application**: When you pray for your family, tribes, ministry, or nation, see your words as the VAV—the connecting nail that brings heaven's decree into earth's condition.

Prophetic Insight: This is a year where prophetic decrees will collapse delays. What was "stuck in the heavens" is being nailed into earth's soil. Amen.

3. Manifestation: Spiritual to Material

- **Scripture**: "Blessed be the God... who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing" (Eph. 1:3).
- **Proclamation**: Every unseen blessing must find expression. My inheritance will not remain locked in the invisible.
- **Application**: Begin to name your inheritance: Nations, land, health, finances, relationships, generational blessings. Speak as one pulling down the unseen into the seen.
- We see an example in Numbers 21:16-18. There was no water. Israel sang: "Spring up O Well" that was a prophetic act calling what was hidden in the earth into manifestation. But there was an apostolic dimension in NUM 21:18- that the princes dug the well by the direction of the lawgiver with their staves and the outcome was a well of water. We see authority and unity.

Insight: For many, this year is a crossing point from prophetic promises into tangible possession. What your mouth decrees with faith will materialize as generational inheritance.

4. Transformation: From the Unseen to the Seen

- **Scripture:** "We look not at the things which are seen, but... at the things which are unseen" (2 Cor. 4:18).
- **Proclamation**: My home, city, and nation will look like heaven's blueprint.
- **Application**: Do not speak what you see; speak what He shows. Align speech with heavenly reality until transformation occurs.

Insight: This is a year to shift atmospheres. The unseen will press into the visible. Expect radical changes in homes, churches, and even national policies as prophetic decrees take root.

Part Three: Apostolic Enforcement—Driving the Nails

Prophetic proclamation alone releases sound, but apostolic enforcement drives the nail deep until the word stands immovable. Apostolic enforcement is about government, order, and implementation.

1. The Apostolic Nature of VAV

- VAV is not a casual connector; it is a stake.
- Apostolic authority ensures promises are nailed down, not stolen.
- Without apostolic enforcement, prophetic words remain in the atmosphere.

2. Enforcing Identity

- **Enforcement:** Guard your identity in Christ. Do not let culture, fear, or failure redefine you.
- Strategy: Regularly declare: "I am seated with Christ. My authority is intact."
- **Example:** Jesus in the wilderness (Luke 4) enforced His identity against satanic temptation by the Word.

3. Enforcing Connection

- Enforcement: Apostolic prayer brings heavenly blueprints into earthly systems.
- **Strategy:** Establish decrees through fasting, strategic intercession, and practical obedience.
- Example: Elijah decreed rain, but then he labored in prayer until the manifestation came (1 Kings 18).

4. Enforcing Manifestation

- Enforcement: Apostolic leaders build structures for spiritual blessings to land.
- **Strategy:** Create "buckets" for the rain—budgets, ministries, teams, systems—so when blessings come, they are contained.
- **Example:** Joseph not only interpreted Pharaoh's dream but built grain houses to secure the harvest (Genesis 41).

5. Enforcing Transformation

- **Enforcement:** Apostolic governance shifts cities and nations (tribes).
- Strategy: Stake the land with prophetic actions, decree over institutions, and implement kingdom order in business, politics, and family.
- **Example:** Paul in Ephesus (Acts 19) not only preached but established a new spiritual economy that overturned idol worship.

Part Four: Practical Guide for the Year 5786

Luke 19:30–35 Connects deeply with pey (mouth, declaration, prophetic release) and vav (hook, connection, apostolic enforcement into material reality).

1. Prophetic (Pey – Mouth/Declaration)

- Jesus gave a spoken prophetic instruction: "Go... you will find a colt tied... say, The Lord has need of him."
- The word spoken ahead of time framed the reality. It was not yet seen, but the mouth (pey) released it into being.
- Prophetic declaration always identifies hidden resources (the colt was tied, unseen, restricted). The prophetic word brings it into visibility.

- 2. Apostolic (Vav Connection/Enforcement)
- The disciples went and did exactly as instructed this is apostolic obedience and enforcement.
- When challenged by the owners, the apostolic action held authority: "The Lord has need of him." This simple phrase was both legal authorization and enforcement.
- The vav, as a hook, connects heaven's decree (pey) with earthly manifestation. The colt was loosed and delivered to Christ a material enforcement of a prophetic word.

Daily Practice

- 1. Morning Proclamation (PEY): Begin each day with decrees over identity, connection, manifestation, and transformation.
- 2. Midday Enforcement (VAV): Take practical action to anchor what you declared—phone calls, strategies, building, correcting.
- 3. Evening Reflection: Journal testimonies of manifestation and transformation.

Corporate Practice

- Churches and ministries should create Prophetic Proclamation Sheets for the vear.
- Apostolic leaders should call enforcement gatherings to hammer words into place through fasting, intercession, and implementation.

National and Generational Application

- Nations: Stake territories with prophetic acts—plant scripture stakes, anoint gates, decree policies.
- Generations: Parents and mentors must declare over children and spiritual sons/daughters. Stake inheritance for future generations.

Conclusion: Living Anchored in a VAV Year

The year 5786 is not ordinary. It is a VAV year in a PEY season—a time when the mouth decrees and the nail secures. To walk faithfully:

- Proclaim prophetically what Heaven is saying.
- Enforce apostolically until manifestation comes.

This is how we stake inheritance, ensuring promises don't float away but remain fastened in our lives, families, ministries, and nations.

Stake Your Inheritance: PEY + VAV Decrees (5786)

This decree blends the prophetic power of PEY (mouth: declaration) and VAV (connection: nail, joining heaven and earth). Use it daily to stake your inheritance in Christ during this Hebrew year 5786. Speak boldly—your mouth is the stake that connects unseen promises to visible reality.

Identity: Jesus the Son of Man (VAV)

Scripture: 1 John 4:17

Decrees:

- I decree that I stand in Christ, the Son of Man, as a rightful heir of covenant inheritance.
- I decree that my words carry authority because I am joined to Jesus in His humanity and divinity.
- I stake my inheritance by speaking as one seated with Christ in heavenly places (Eph. 2:6).

Connection: Heaven and Earth United (VAV)

Scripture: Matthew 6:10

Decrees:

- I decree that every word from my mouth connects Heaven's decree with Earth's reality.
- I nail down every heavenly promise into manifestation on earth by my prophetic declarations.
- I stake my inheritance as Heaven's resources flow into my life, family, ministry, and nation.

Manifestation: Spiritual to Material (VAV)

Scripture: Ephesians 1:3

Decrees:

- I decree that spiritual blessings manifest into material breakthroughs.
- I pull down unseen promises into visible results by the words of my mouth.
- I stake my inheritance in land, health, finances, relationships, and generational blessings.

Transformation: Unseen to Seen (PEY + VAV)

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 4:18

Decrees:

- I decree that unseen realities of Heaven shape what I see around me.
- I decree transformation in my home, church, city, and nation by the spoken Word.
- I stake my inheritance until every hidden promise becomes visible and tangible.

Activation Prayer

Father, I thank you, praise and worship You, in the name of Jesus, I align my mouth (PEY) with Heaven's decrees and drive the stake (VAV) of Christ into the ground of my inheritance. Let every unseen blessing be nailed into manifestation. I connect Heaven and Earth, spirit and matter, the invisible and the visible by my declarations. I stake my inheritance today—no delay, no diversion, no denial. Amen.

Adopt-A-Missionary- A Missions' Strategy

...a strategy for loving the missionary family as well as the people groups, they serve

Adopt-A-Missionary is a mission strategy that has gained momentum in missions over the years. What makes this strategy different is its focus. Historically, churches have focused on countries, and mission agencies have focused their attention on people groups. Adopt-A-Missionary focuses on missionary families, or what we can call message bearers.

For 5 years, my wife (of blessed memory) and I served as missionary representatives to the Kenyan peoples of East Africa. We divided the nation of Kenya into 6. Working with the missionary on ground we had a plan to evangelise the nation. We raised teams of two by two from Nigeria and planted 6 churches throughout the country. In the last 29 years + the FMI missionary teams have been helped by God to open the gospel among 40 unreached people groups. Our FMC churches faithfully prayed and the missionaries that we served with, and the church has supported them financially.

In 1990 for example, we were relocated to Kano with two major tribes- the Kanawas and Magusawas. We were led of the Lord to pay more attention to *tribal missions in 1993*, *where the gospel has never been heard while maintaining a church base*. Thankfully, our churches have continued to pray for and support the mission's effort with this strategic ministry.

ADOPT-A-Missionary Defined

What then does it mean to Adopt-A-missionary? It means committing yourself as an individual, fellowship group, local congregation, denomination, or mission agency to pray for and commit resources to win souls, establish believers, administrate the work within a specific people group through a missionary family or families. This commitment is continued until the believers in that people group can reach the rest of their people without outside (cross-cultural) assistance.

We are agents of God praying, giving, and serving to see an adopted family reach out to bring sinners into God's family. This is the true meaning of Adopting a missionary family. One day

this will be accomplished, and every tribe, tongue, people, and nation will give glory to God around His throne (Rev. 5:9).

Adopt a Missionary Family

Fullstature Missions International is committed to the work of missions and has developed a ministry to bring into focus the Great Commission (Matt 28:19-20) set forth by Christ and to support missionary families need. We ask that your family prayerfully consider adopting a missionary family to be a blessing and to be blessed. After you have made an adoption, we encourage you can send your missionary family an email to share about your family and to ask them to share with you. The FMI becomes a bridge to help people you may never know or meet. You can reach out to the missionary during Holidays, birthdays, or anniversaries or just at any time. Commit to lift your missionary up in prayer. (Phil 6)

It is also our desire to support more missionaries through our ministry budget than we currently can do. The missionaries we support currently are under-supported. In other words, the support we grant is not adequate. In most cases, we are nearly able (with Naira) to provide what will keep body and soul together leaving projects in the field undone. This is where you pause and do something.

It is our goal to ensure that every Missionary, supported through, (what we call) the General Fund which includes the "Faith Promise Offering" (FPO), are missionaries we, as a ministry want to support.

The money these Missionaries receive is totally dependent on what is given by the individual or families who have adopted them.

Example: Missionary "Felix" may have two families in First Baptist Church which chose to adopt him. They do so for a combined support of \$200 per month, one for \$75 per month and one for \$125 per month. Should the family who chose to support Missionary "Felix" for \$125 per month be unable to do so for any reason, Missionary "Felix" would only receive \$75 for that month. There will be a "shortfall" and the family who was unable to give what they had purposed to give would not be contacted and asked, "Where is your contribution".

If you have a desire to support a Missionary, please feel free to fill out a "Adopt-A-Missionary Request Form" and return it to our ministry office.

Build a Relationship

Develop a relationship with your adopted missionary family. Learn about their ministry and their ups and downs so that you know when to Praise God with them and when to lift them up in prayer. Being a missionary can have very hard times and there is great comfort when a missionary knows that God is always there and that there are people supporting them at every step.

Faith Promise

In addition to your commitment to get to know and pray for your adopted missionary, you may consider supporting your missionary financially. Among some of the greatest difficulties

that missionaries face is having their financial needs met. Missionaries typically spend a significant amount of time raising monies to support their ministries which in turn reduces the amount of time out in the field.

IS THIS THE MONTH OF YOUR BIRTH? USE REVELATION KNOWLEDGE WELL (AND AGAIN) !!

Even if this is not your month of birth, pray into the day of your birth on a weekly basis (that is the weekday in which you were born). Take time at regular basis to be praying for yourself and prophesying over your own life. Speak into the foundations of your life and prophesy good things.

Thank Him for your specific day of birth. Declare that day blessed.

- Thank Him that He ordained that you will be made manifest on earth on a specific day in that month at a specific hour and minute.
- Thank Him that He has a purpose for your life, and it will be fulfilled.
- Ask Jehovah to forgive you where you have for one reason or another, ignored or rejected to recognize your day of birth.
- Thank Jehovah for the day of your conception. (Psa 139:13)
- Thank Jehovah that when He thought of you, he already thought of your entire life. Thank Him that He did not leave anything to chance. (Isa 49:1)
- Thank Him that he knew exactly what your redemptive purpose was going to be. (Psa. 139:16)
- Pray that He will reveal the original you more and more as you enter another year of your life. (Psa 139:13-15)

HEALING, PURPOSE & TESTIMONY

(Why Am I Still Alive? Luke 13:1–9)

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 1 - When Towers Fall

Scripture: "Or those eighteen who died when the tower in Siloam fell on them—do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusalem?" (Luke 13:4, NIV)

Reflection: Tragedy strikes suddenly. The people in Jesus' day asked, "Why them?" Today, many ask, "Why me?" or "Why not me?" Jesus shifts the conversation—not to blame the dead, but to call the living to repentance. I am still alive, not because I am better, but because God is patient.

Example/Testimony: When the Twin Towers fell in 2001, thousands died. Others who were supposed to be there missed their train, woke up late, or changed their route. Survivors often said, "I don't know why I was spared, but I must live differently." The same applies to me.

Prayer: Lord, help me not to waste the mercy of being alive. Let my life point others to repentance and hope in Christ. Amen.

The Mouth as a Weapon

Scripture: Job 22:28

Prophetic Focus: Recognize your mouth as a divine instrument of creation and warfare.

Decrees:

- I speak life and alignment with God's Word today.
- My declarations overthrow the enemy's words.

Prayer: Lord, sanctify my mouth as Your battle-ax. Let every word I speak align with Heaven and enforce Your will.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 2 - Not Worse Sinners

Scripture: "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered this way?" (Luke 13:2)

Reflection: It is easy to think tragedy equals judgment. But Jesus says no. Life and death are not determined by comparative sin. Survival is not superiority—it is stewardship. If I am alive, I must live fruitfully.

Example/Testimony: Job's friends wrongly assumed his suffering was punishment. But God called Job His servant. My survival after my wife's passing is not proof of greater holiness; it is a commission to carry on the mission.

Prayer: Father, deliver me from comparing my life with others. Let me understand that my life is spared for purpose, not pride. Amen.

Guarded Lips

Scripture: Psalm 141:3

Prophetic Focus: Purity of speech brings authority in battle.

Decrees:

- My lips release only what glorifies God.
- No idle or corrupt word will proceed from me.

Prayer: Father, cleanse my lips with holy fire like Isaiah. Teach me to guard my words and use them wisely.

WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 3 - A Call to Repentance

Scripture: "But unless you repent, you too will all perish." (Luke 13:3)

Reflection: Every spared life is an opportunity. Survival is a trumpet blast to repentance. It is not just about escaping hell, but about turning fully to God's will.

Example/Testimony: After a fatal bus crash in Nigeria, one man who survived wept, saying, "I have wasted my years. God spared me for a reason." He turned to Christ and became an evangelist. Repentance turned tragedy into testimony.

Prayer: Lord, I repent of wasted time and fruitless living. Restore me to full obedience and empower me to walk in Your will. Amen.

Speaking to Dry Bones

Scripture: Ezekiel 37:4

Prophetic Focus: Your decree brings life to dead situations.

Decrees:

- Every dry area in my life receives breath and life.
- My family, finances, and destiny align with resurrection power.

Prayer: Spirit of God, breathe into every barren place of my inheritance as I prophesy Your Word.

THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 4 - God's Patience with Me

Scripture: "For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any." (Luke 13:7)

Reflection: Patience is not absence. God inspects me regularly. Every new day is an extension of His patience. He looks for fruit: love, obedience, disciples, faith. The reason I am still alive is because of His mercy, not my merit.

Example/Testimony: The thief on the cross wasted years, but his last breath became fruitful when he cried out to Jesus. Even in my grief, God is patient—waiting for deeper surrender.

Prayer: Merciful Father, thank You for Your patience. May my life bear fruit that pleases You daily. Amen.

Overcoming by Testimony

Scripture: Revelation 12:11 And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death.

Prophetic Focus: Testimonies are prophetic weapons.

Decrees:

- The blood of Jesus speaks victory over me.
- My testimony silences the accuser.

Prayer: Lord, I testify to Your faithfulness and enforce victory over every satanic accusation.

FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 5 - From Survivor to Witness

Scripture: "Unless you repent, you too will all perish." (Luke 13:5)

Reflection: I am not alive to simply exist—I am a witness. People must see that God sustains me not for comfort, but for testimony. My story of loss becomes a platform for evangelism. My survival is not the end—it is the beginning of a louder witness.

Example/Testimony: After a plane crash, a survivor said, "I will tell the world about Jesus because He gave me another chance." I too must turn my pain into proclamation.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, let my life preach louder than my words. May my survival become salvation to others. Amen

Asking for Nations

Scripture: Psalm 2:8

Prophetic Focus: Your inheritance includes territories and nations.

Decrees:

- I lay claim to the nations as part of my kingdom inheritance.
- The boundaries of my influence expand today.

Prayer: Father, I ask for my city and nation. Let Your kingdom invade every sphere I touch.

SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 6 - The Urgency of the Gospel

Scripture: "Unless you repent, you too will all perish." (Luke 13:3, 5)

Reflection: Life is short, death is sudden, and eternity is real. Every extension of life is God saying: "Preach while there's time." The reason I am still alive is not just for healing but for heralding the gospel.

Example/Testimony: D. L. Moody once delayed an altar call and said, "Come back tomorrow." That night, the Chicago fire broke out, and many died. He vowed never again to postpone calling men to Christ.

Prayer: Lord, give me boldness to share the gospel urgently. Let no soul perish because I delayed. Amen.

The Sword of the Mouth

Scripture: Revelation 19:15

Prophetic Focus: The prophetic word cuts down opposition.

Decrees:

- My mouth releases the sword of the Spirit.
- Every enemy is cut off by the Word of the Lord.

Prayer: Jesus, let Your sword proceed from my lips. May I defeat every adversary by Your Word.



SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 7 – Hope in the Midst of Tears

Scripture: "Weeping may endure for a night, but joy comes in the morning." (Psalm 30:5)

Reflection: Grief is real, but it is not the end. Hope is the fruit that grows out of tears. My survival means I must not let despair silence me. Hope becomes my evangelistic message.

Example/Testimony: Horatio Spafford lost his wife and daughters in tragedy. Out of grief he wrote, "It is well with my soul." His hymn has carried millions to hope in Christ.

Prayer: Father, turn my mourning into a song of hope that points others to Christ. Amen.

The Sword of the Mouth

Scripture: Revelation 19:15

Prophetic Focus: The prophetic word cuts down opposition.

Decrees:

- My mouth releases the sword of the Spirit.
- Every enemy is cut off by the Word of the Lord.

Prayer: Jesus, let Your sword proceed from my lips. May I defeat every adversary by Your Word.

The Double-Edged Sword

Scripture: Hebrews 4:12

Prophetic Focus: The Word discerns and divides.

Decrees:

- The Word in my mouth exposes lies and establishes truth.
- Every hidden agenda against me is uncovered.

Prayer: Lord, let Your Word in my mouth pierce darkness and separate truth from deception.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 8 - The Fig Tree Without Fruit

Scripture: "A man had a fig tree growing in his vineyard, and he went to look for fruit on it but did not find any." (Luke 13:6)

Reflection: God is not only keeping me alive—He is inspecting my fruit. Am I producing love, obedience, disciples, holiness, or am I barren? My survival must equal my service.

Example/Testimony: Jesus cursed a barren fig tree (Mark 11:13–14). It looked healthy, but bore no fruit. A life spared but unfruitful is wasted mercy.

Prayer: Lord, help me not just to exist but to bear fruit that glorifies You. Amen.

Silencing the Accuser

Scripture: Zechariah 3:1-4

Prophetic Focus: God rebukes the accuser and clothes you with righteousness.

Decrees:

- The Lord rebukes every accusation against me.
- I am clothed in garments of purity and authority.

Prayer: Father, silence every voice of condemnation. Let me stand justified in Christ.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 9 - God's Inspection

Scripture: "For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any." (Luke 13:7)

Reflection: God inspects lives regularly. He does not just keep me alive for comfort; He examines me for usefulness. Each day alive is another opportunity to pass His inspection.

Example/Testimony: King Belshazzar was weighed and found wanting (Daniel 5:27). God inspected him and ended his reign. My survival is proof I am still under review and must respond.

Prayer: Search me, O God, and find fruit in my life. Keep me from failing Your inspection. Amen.

Commanding Mountains

Scripture: Mark 11:23

Prophetic Focus: Faith-filled words move mountains.

Decrees:

- I speak to every obstacle: Be removed!

- No mountain can resist the Word of God in my mouth.

Prayer: Lord, I command mountains of delay, sickness, and lack to move now in Jesus' name.

WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 10 - Three Years of Waiting

Scripture: "For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit..." (Luke 13:7)

Reflection: God's patience stretches over time. He doesn't cut me down quickly; He allows seasons. But patience has a limit. Time must not be wasted.

Example/Testimony: Israel wandered forty years in the wilderness. Though God was patient, most never entered the Promised Land because they did not change.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for patience. Help me not to waste the seasons You extend to me. Amen.

Binding and Loosing

Scripture: Matthew 16:19

Prophetic Focus: Heaven backs your decrees on earth.

Decrees:

- I bind every work of darkness against my inheritance.
- I loose divine favor, provision, and protection.

Prayer: Lord, teach me to legislate with my mouth. Let Heaven respond to my decrees.

THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 11 - Why I Wasn't Cut Down

Scripture: "Cut it down! Why should it use up the soil?" (Luke 13:7)

Reflection: Justice says, "Cut it down." Mercy says, "Spare him." If I am alive, it is because mercy overruled judgment. My survival is a courtroom of grace.

Example/Testimony: David sinned gravely, yet God spared his life (2 Samuel 12:13). He wrote Psalm 51 as a testimony of mercy. I too am alive because of mercy.

Prayer: Lord, I deserve judgment, but You gave mercy. Let me live every day in gratitude. Amen.

Possessing the Gates

Scripture: Genesis 22:17

Prophetic Focus: The seed of Abraham possesses the gates of enemies.

Decrees:

- I take possession of the gates of influence.
- I decree dominion over every entry point of my inheritance.

Prayer: Father, strengthen me to stand in the gates and decree Your rule.

FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 12 - The Danger of Wasted Grace

Scripture: "Why should it use up the soil?" (Luke 13:7)

Reflection: A tree that only consumes without producing is wasting grace. A life that is spared but selfish is dangerous. Grace is meant to empower productivity, not laziness.

Example/Testimony: Paul said, "His grace toward me was not in vain. I worked harder than all of them" (1 Corinthians 15:10). Grace unused is grace wasted.

Prayer: Lord, may Your grace not be wasted in my life. Let me serve fruitfully until my last breath. Amen.

Declaring Victory in Warfare

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 10:4-5

Prophetic Focus: Your decrees demolish strongholds.

Decrees:

- Every stronghold is torn down by the Word of God.
- My mind and heart align with truth.

Prayer: Lord, let my mouth release victory decrees that overthrow strongholds today.

SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 13 - A Patient Gardener

Scripture: "Sir," the man replied, "leave it alone for one more year." (Luke 13:8)

Reflection: Jesus is the gardener interceding for me. Even when heaven's justice demands my cutting down, Jesus pleads: "Give him one more year." My survival is Christ's advocacy.

Example/Testimony: Peter denied Jesus three times, but Jesus interceded: "I have prayed for you." (Luke 22:32). That prayer turned a failing disciple into an apostolic leader.

Prayer: Thank You, Jesus, for interceding for me. Because of You, I live another day. Amen.

The Word in Your Mouth is Near You

Scripture: Romans 10:8

Prophetic Focus: God's Word is active when spoken from your mouth.

Decrees:

- The Word of faith is alive in me.

- I decree salvation, healing, and breakthrough by His Word.

Prayer: Father, let my mouth continually declare the living Word that saves and delivers.


SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 14 - Living as One Spared

Scripture: "Leave it alone for one more year." (Luke 13:8)

Reflection: I am alive on borrowed time. Every day is a loan of mercy. I must live like a man spared, not entitled. Each morning I rise is divine extension.

Example/Testimony: Hezekiah was given 15 more years (Isaiah 38:5). Those years were mercy. Some of us live today in our "added years."

Prayer: Lord, help me live as one spared by mercy, with gratitude and urgency. Amen.



Revival by Decree

Scripture: Psalm 85:6

Prophetic Focus: Decrees release revival fire.

Decrees:

- I decree awakening in my family and nation.
- The fire of revival spreads through my decrees.

Prayer: Lord, awaken us again. Use my mouth to spark revival flames

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 15 - Digging Around Me

Scripture: "...I'll dig around it..." (Luke 13:8)

Reflection: God digs into my life, breaking the hardness. Trials, losses, and corrections are His tools. Digging hurts, but it prepares for fruit.

Example/Testimony: Joseph was "dug around" through betrayal, slavery, and prison. That digging prepared him for fruitfulness in Egypt.

Prayer: Lord, even when digging hurts, I yield. Prepare me for greater fruit. Amen.

Speaking Peace to Storms

Scripture: Mark 4:39

Prophetic Focus: Authority calms chaos.

Decrees:

- Peace, be still in every storm of my life.
- My mouth carries the authority of Christ.

Prayer: Jesus, I speak Your peace over every storm raging against me.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 16 - Manure and Nourishment

Scripture: "...and fertilize it." (Luke 13:8, NIV)

Reflection: Sometimes God allows what looks like "waste" or "mess" in my life to become nourishment for fruitfulness. Trials, pain, and disappointments fertilize my soil. The reason I am still alive is because God is still investing in my growth.

Example/Testimony: Paul's thorn in the flesh was painful, but it fertilized his humility and dependence on God's grace (2 Corinthians 12:7–9).

Prayer: Lord, turn every bitter experience into nourishment for my growth and fruitfulness. Amen.

Declaring Restoration

Scripture: Joel 2:25

Prophetic Focus: God restores through prophetic words.

Decrees:

- I decree restoration of lost years and opportunities.
- Everything stolen returns sevenfold.

Prayer: Father, let restoration break forth as I decree Your Word.

WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 17 - The Gardener's Care

Scripture: "Sir, leave it alone for one more year, and I'll dig around it and fertilize it." (Luke 13:8)

Reflection: Jesus is the patient gardener, tenderly working on me. He does not give up easily. Every sermon, prayer, and trial is His careful cultivation of my life. My continued life is proof that He still cares.

Example/Testimony: John Newton, once a slave trader, was cultivated by God's grace through storms at sea and personal loss. The gardener transformed him into the writer of "Amazing Grace."

Prayer: Jesus, thank You for not abandoning me. Keep tending me until I become fully fruitful. Amen.

Decreeing Justice

Scripture: Isaiah 54:17

Prophetic Focus: Your words invoke divine justice.

Decrees:

- No weapon against me prospers.
- I decree justice and vindication.

Prayer: Lord, establish justice in every area of contention in my life.

THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 18 - Pruned to Multiply

Scripture: "...every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful." (John 15:2)

Reflection: Pruning is painful but necessary. Loss, discipline, and divine correction cut away distractions so I can multiply. My survival means I am still under divine pruning.

Example/Testimony: Missionary Hudson Taylor was pruned through loss of wife and children in China. His pruning birthed the China Inland Mission, multiplying his fruit beyond his lifetime.

Prayer: Father, prune me for Your glory. Let the cuts of life produce lasting fruit in me. Amen.

The High Praises in the Mouth

Scripture: Psalm 149:6-9

Prophetic Focus: Praise is a prophetic weapon of judgment.

Decrees:

- My praise executes vengeance on darkness.

- I decree liberty through high praise.

Prayer: Father, let high praises in my mouth release victory today.

FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 19 - Fruit That Remains

Scripture: "I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last." (John 15:16)

Reflection: Temporary success is not the goal. Eternal fruit is. Souls saved, disciples trained, lives transformed—this is the fruit that remains. My survival is for legacy, not luxury.

Example/Testimony: Billy Graham's fruit remains decades after his passing: millions saved, leaders raised, institutions built. That is fruit that endures.

Prayer: Lord may my survival produce fruit that outlives me and glorifies You forever. Amen.

Speaking Healing

Scripture: Proverbs 18:21

Prophetic Focus: Life and death are in your tongue.

Decrees:

- I speak life and healing over my body and family.
- Sickness bows to the Word of life in my mouth.

Prayer: Lord, let my mouth carry healing power today.

SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 20 - Equipped for Kingdom Work

Scripture: "...to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up." (Ephesians 4:12)

Reflection: I am alive to be equipped and to equip others. My pain, lessons, and survival are tools to strengthen others in ministry. Apostolically, God keeps me alive to multiply workers.

Example/Testimony: Paul equipped Timothy, Titus, and others, ensuring that the gospel outlived him. His survival through shipwrecks and prisons was to raise leaders.

Prayer: Lord, use me to equip others for the work of Your Kingdom. Amen.

The Mouth that Blesses, Not Curses

Scripture: James 3:10

Prophetic Focus: Blessing cancels curses.

Decrees:

- My mouth blesses and does not curse.
- Every curse against me is reversed by my blessing decrees.

Prayer: Father, train my mouth to bless and not curse, that I may inherit blessing.



SEPTEMBER SUNDAY 21 - Destiny Beyond Delay

Scripture: "The vision is yet for an appointed time...though it tarry, wait for it." (Habakkuk 2:3)

Reflection: Delay is not denial. God extends life because destiny is not finished. My mission is greater than my pain. I am alive because purpose is still unfolding.

Example/Testimony: Abraham waited decades for Isaac. His survival into old age was necessary to fulfill covenant destiny.

Prayer: Father, let me not waste this delay. Fulfill my destiny in the years You've given me. Amen.

Warring with Prophecy

Scripture: 1 Timothy 1:18

Prophetic Focus: Prophecies are weapons of war.

Decrees:

- I war with every prophecy spoken over me.
- I decree manifestation of every divine word.

Prayer: Lord, empower me to contend with the prophecies spoken over my life

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 22 - One More Year

Scripture: "If it bears fruit next year, fine! If not, then cut it down." (Luke 13:9)

Reflection: Life is a series of extensions: "one more year." God doesn't promise unlimited chances. Every day alive is a countdown of grace. Urgency must define how I live.

Example/Testimony: King Hezekiah was given 15 more years. Some used their extensions well, others wasted them. How will I use mine?

Prayer: Lord, help me live every "one more year" as if it is my last chance to bear fruit. Amen.

Declaring New Beginnings

Scripture: Isaiah 43:19

Prophetic Focus: Prophetic speech opens new paths.

Decrees:

- I decree new doors, new paths, new beginnings.
- The wilderness gives way to streams of refreshing.

Prayer: Father, as I decree, cause new beginnings to manifest in my life.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23 - If It Bears Fruit

Scripture: "If it bears fruit next year, fine!" (Luke 13:9)

Reflection: Fruitfulness is God's condition for my continued life. He expects evidence—souls reached, disciples raised, love demonstrated. Survival without fruit is wasted mercy.

Example/Testimony: Jesus told His disciples, "By their fruit you shall know them." (Matthew 7:16). Fruitfulness is the true evidence of life in Christ.

Prayer: Lord, may my spared life show real fruit for Your Kingdom. Amen.

Decreeing Kingdom Advancement

Scripture: Matthew 6:10

Prophetic Focus: Your decrees release God's kingdom on earth.

Decrees:

- Your kingdom comes where I decree.
- Heaven's order invades my environment.

Prayer: Lord, let my words release kingdom advancement in my city and nation

WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 24 - The Consequence of No Fruit

Scripture: "If not, then cut it down." (Luke 13:9)

Reflection: Unfruitfulness has consequences. Survival is not eternal; life without fruit risks being cut off. This is a prophetic warning: use life well while it lasts.

Example/Testimony: In Revelation 3, Jesus warned the church in Sardis: "You have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead." Fruitlessness is spiritual death.

Prayer: Father, keep me from fruitlessness. Let my life not end as wasted soil. Amen.

Claiming Generational Inheritance

Scripture: Proverbs 13:22

Prophetic Focus: Your words secure inheritance for future generations.

Decrees:

- My children and children's children inherit covenant blessings.
- Generational curses are broken forever.

Prayer: Father, I decree blessings over my lineage for generations to come

THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 25 - Urgency in Evangelism

Scripture: "The night is coming when no one can work." (John 9:4)

Reflection: The gardener's "one more year" is evangelistic urgency. While I live, I must reach the lost. Death will close the door of opportunity.

Example/Testimony: Evangelist Reinhard Bonnke preached with urgency: "Hell empty, Heaven full." Millions were saved because he lived as if every crusade were the last.

Prayer: Lord, put urgency in my heart for souls. Let me not waste the short window of life. Amen.

Speaking over Finances

Scripture: Deuteronomy 8:18

Prophetic Focus: The power to get wealth is released by decree.

Decrees:

- I decree supernatural provision and prosperity.
- I command resources to align with kingdom purposes.

Prayer: Lord, let my mouth release decrees that unlock financial breakthroughs.

FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 26 - Living Prophetically

Scripture: "Surely the Sovereign LORD does nothing without revealing his plan to his servants the prophets." (Amos 3:7)

Reflection: Prophetic living means reading life through God's lens. My survival is not random; it is a prophetic sign. God spared me because my assignment is not finished.

Example/Testimony: Anna the prophetess lived long in the temple, proclaiming the Messiah. Her extended life was prophetic proof of God's unfolding plan (Luke 2:36–38).

Prayer: Lord, let me live prophetically, discerning Your times and proclaiming Your will. Amen.

Declaring Open Doors

Scripture: Revelation 3:8

Prophetic Focus: Your decrees open strategic doors.

Decrees:

- I decree open doors of influence and opportunity.
- No man can shut the doors God opens.

Prayer: Father, let open doors manifest as I decree Your Word.

SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 27 - Why I Am Still Alive

Scripture: "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain." (Philippians 1:21)

Reflection: Paul found his answer: living meant Christ, dying meant gain. My life is not mine—it is Christ's. I am alive because He has work yet to do through me.

Example/Testimony: Paul often escaped death—stonings, shipwrecks, prisons. Each time, he concluded: "I am alive for the sake of the gospel."

Prayer: Lord, help me live fully for Christ, knowing that every breath belongs to You. Amen.

Declaring Angelic Enforcement

Scripture: Psalm 103:20

Prophetic Focus: Angels respond to decrees aligned with God's Word.

Decrees:

- I decree angelic enforcement of God's promises.
- Heavenly hosts guard my inheritance today.

Prayer: Lord, send Your angels to execute the words of my mouth aligned with Your will.

SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 28 - Finishing Well

Scripture: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." (2 Timothy 4:7)

Reflection: The true goal is not just surviving, but finishing well. Fruitfulness must lead to a faithful finish. Being alive is an opportunity to end strong.

Example/Testimony: Stephen was young, but he finished well—faithful to Christ, bold in witness. His death birthed Saul's eventual conversion (Acts 7).

Prayer: Lord, may my life and death bring glory to You. Help me finish my race well. Amen.

Speaking Alignment with Destiny


Scripture: Jeremiah 29:11

Prophetic Focus: Your words align you with God's plans.

Decrees:

- I decree alignment with God's destiny for my life.
- Every detour is corrected today.

Prayer: Father, align my path with destiny as I decree Your purposes

Prophetic Focus: Your mouth declares harvest among nations.

Prayer: Lord, let my decrees release laborers and harvest into nations.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 30 - The Cry of the Gardener

Scripture: "Sir, leave it alone for one more year." (Luke 13:8)

Reflection: This is Christ's intercession over me: "Father, spare him." My survival is Christ's prayer answered. If I live, it is because Jesus still pleads for me.

Example/Testimony: Peter failed, but Jesus prayed for him. That prayer turned him into a Pentecost preacher. I am alive because Christ intercedes for me still.

Prayer: Thank You, Jesus, for interceding for me daily. My life belongs to You. Amen.

Sealing Your Inheritance

Scripture: Ephesians 1:13-14

Prophetic Focus: Seal your inheritance with decrees of faith.

Decrees:

- I decree my inheritance is sealed in Christ.

- Nothing can snatch me from His hand.

Prayer: Father, I seal every decree of these 30 days. Let them bear fruit in my life and generations




