
STRATEGIC LEVEL PRAYER JOURNAL - NOVEMBER 2025.



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May the Lord grant you understanding of this prayer journal as you pray, consequent upon which there will be changes in your life or your prayer group or Family, Church, Nation, and Continent.

What is presented are not Jewish Dates or the Jewish calendar but what the LORD instituted which we all see manifested in the movement of the Moon every month. The enemy has always manipulated these bodies for which believers are just becoming aware. This season is also a special edition of revelation which brings a new breath of fresh air without adding to the word of God but confirms it and makes our faith stronger

You may wish to pray in two ways: -

- 1. You can pray using the whole journal to pray into the womb of time according to the authority level granted to you by your appointment in the Lord. Expect the prophetic germination [as you saturate the ground and the womb of time with God's ordination] to happen. In any case ensure your seed remains in the ground as investment for the coming year. Determine, and command what this month should deliver to you and what it should not and must Not.
- 2. You can also use this daily for your prayers AND DEVOTION to prevail at the gate of each day, especially on critical days of intense warfare in the heavens. Remember that the day starts from 6 pm for the next 24 hours. If you are in Britain for instance the time will be early hours of the next day in Hong Kong @ your 6pm.
- 3. This document may seem lengthy, but it shows the effort that was generated in prayer. You can keep it and save it for use in a good way.

Pray that your prophetic faculties will be on the rise and be enlarged and sharp...<u>visions;</u> dreams; interpreting symbols; applying parables; riddles; revelation and predictions; accurate delivery of words of wisdom and words of knowledge; intercessions; interaction with heaven etc.. Divine decrees to cause the future and many other such faculties.

Ignorance of what every month holds for you, your family, community, nation, the church and the continent at large has caused many to perish, miss out or not fully access what God has in store for them.

Understanding the heavens and what they signify every month is another very key aspect as we enter this new level of our assignments among the nations. While the kingdom of darkness has used astrology, prognostications, and all manner of demonic methods to control the activities on earth using the heavens, the church continues in ignorance. They have even employed materialism to blind believers in Jesus Christ, whereas <u>all things are yours</u>

We thank God for the many people whom He is raising in different parts of the world to understand what the heavens hold for us every month. As you seek deeper understanding, the Holy Spirit will guide you into greater revelations. Amen.

The Life That Overcomes: Living by Faith in Every Realm

Introduction: The Dominion of Faith

Faith is the law of the Spirit that governs every manifestation of divine life. It is the invisible current that draws eternity into time and makes the unseen visible. Everything that God does, He does by faith—and everything that man receives from God, he receives by faith.

Scripture declares, "The just shall live by faith" (Habakkuk 2:4; Romans 1:17; Galatians 3:11; Hebrews 10:38). This fourfold repetition in the canon is no accident—it is heaven's emphasis that faith is not an occasional act but the atmosphere of the righteous. Faith is not merely for getting miracles; it is the very oxygen of our existence in the Kingdom. Without faith, the believer suffocates spiritually.

The life of faith is not a mere philosophy—it is a lifestyle of supernatural dominion. Faith makes the believer participate in the creative process of God. By faith, you cease to be a victim of circumstance; you become an enforcer of divine realities.

1. The Scriptural Foundation of Faith

Let us begin with the root verse of this life: "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." — Hebrews 11:1. Faith is substance—tangible, spiritual materiality. It gives reality to what the physical senses cannot yet perceive. It translates divine promises into earthly experiences. Faith is not mere belief in God's existence—it is participation in God's nature.

Romans 1:17 expands this: "For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, The just shall live by faith." Faith unveils righteousness. When you walk by faith, you are not trying to impress God with belief—you are expressing His own righteousness through your trust. Faith is not an emotional response to trouble; it is the divine logic of heaven's government.

When Jesus said in Mark 11:22, "Have faith in God" (literally in the Greek, "Have the God kind of faith"), He was inviting us to share in the creative boldness of the Almighty. This is the same faith by which God said, "Let there be light," and light appeared.

2. The Essence of Living by Faith

Living by faith is not a reaction to need—it is a revelation of union. The believer lives in partnership with the invisible realm. Faith is the bridge between revelation and manifestation.

To live by faith means:

- 1. To see what God says. Faith begins when revelation dawns.
- 2. To speak what God shows. Faith speaks the same language as heaven.
- 3. To act as if it were already done. Faith behaves according to divine conclusion, not earthly condition.

When Noah built the ark, there was no rain. When Abraham left Ur, there was no map. When the widow poured oil into borrowed vessels, there was no guarantee it would multiply. But faith is never based on visible guarantees—it rests in the integrity of the God who cannot lie.

3. Ancient Illustrations of Faith That Moved Mountains

a. Noah's Faith Saved a Generation

Noah built for 120 years under ridicule. Faith works in time until time bows to eternity. The ark was not only a boat—it was a prophetic declaration that judgment could be escaped through obedience.

b. Abraham's Faith Created a Nation

Abraham staggered not at the promise of God. He believed beyond biology and beyond history. He saw the invisible city and became the father of nations. Faith turned a barren man into a generational prototype.

c. Moses' Faith Subdued an Empire

He forsook Egypt, "not fearing the wrath of the king; for he endured as seeing Him who is invisible" (Hebrews 11:27). Faith gives endurance in the face of impossible odds. The Red Sea obeyed a rod because a man had seen the Invisible One.

d. Joshua's Faith Collapsed Walls Without Touching Them

Faith transforms obedience into weaponry. The shout of the people was not mere noise—it was the sound of heaven's confidence echoing through human mouths.

Each of these examples teaches us that faith is not passive belief but active partnership with divine will.

4. Contemporary Illustrations of Faith at Work

Faith is not confined to ancient times. The same power that parted seas now opens nations, heals the sick, and transforms families.

In the personal realm:

A woman once confessed healing scriptures daily over a terminal condition. Every report said death was near, but she refused to let fear govern her mouth. Over time, the Word prevailed—the doctors were silenced. Faith rewrote the report.

In the family realm:

A husband and wife prayed over a child born with severe developmental challenges. For months, they laid hands daily, declaring the promise that "the seed of the righteous shall be mighty upon the earth." Years later, that same child graduated with honors. Faith raised a testimony where medicine had written limits.

In the church realm:

A small congregation decided to build a sanctuary debt-free. They prayed, believed, and gave in obedience, declaring that "the silver is Mine and the gold is Mine, saith the Lord." Within two years, supernatural provision came from unlikely sources—some even from unbelievers compelled by divine prompting. Faith transformed scarcity into overflow.

Faith is not magic: it is alignment. When the heart, the mouth, and the action align with the Word, manifestation becomes inevitable.

5. How Faith Comes

Romans 10:17 says, "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Faith does not come by wishing or fasting—it comes by exposure to divine truth. The more you hear the Word, the more faith materializes. Hearing here means more than sound—it means spiritual understanding.

There are three channels through which faith is imparted:

- 1. Revelation of Scripture: When light breaks from the Word, faith is born.
- 2. Meditation and confession: When you mutter the Word long enough, it becomes the voice of your spirit.
- 3. *Obedient action: When you act on the Word, faith matures into dominion.*

Faith unused diminishes. Faith exercised expands. Every act of obedience is a seed that grows into confidence for the next challenge.

6. The Faith Life in Personal Practice

At the personal level, living by faith means training your inner man to respond to revelation rather than emotion.

- Feed on the Word daily. The faith life is Word-fed and Spirit-led.
- Guard your confession. Faith speaks life; fear speaks death. What you say continually creates the atmosphere you live in.
- Act promptly. Delayed obedience is diluted faith. Move when the Spirit nudges you.

Faith turns your private devotion into public testimony. The secret place becomes the factory of manifestation.

7. Personal Enforcement Example

Every morning, begin by declaring:

"I live by faith today. I walk by the unseen, not by the seen. I am not a slave to circumstance; I am a son of covenant. The same Spirit that raised Christ from the dead quickens my mind, my body, my finances, and my household. I believe; therefore, I speak."

This is how you train your atmosphere. Faith is vocal; silence kills conviction.

Faith is not a moment; it is ongoing. It is heaven's force operating through human vessels. "This is the victory that overcomes the world, even our faith." — 1 John 5:4

II) Faith Has Structure: The Divine Blueprint

Faith is not mystical chaos. It has an architecture, a pattern, a spiritual structure that governs how it works. In the same way a building stands on a foundation, rises on pillars, and is crowned with a roof, faith stands upon revelation, operates through confession, and is perfected by action.

Hebrews 11:6 declares: "Without faith it is impossible to please God: for he that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him."

This single verse reveals the entire architecture:

- Foundation: Believe that He is acknowledging His reality and supremacy.
- Pillars: Seek Him diligently alignment and pursuit.
- Crown: Expect reward confidence that obedience brings manifestation.

Faith collapses when any of these are missing. Believing God exists is not enough; faith must seek and expect.

2. Foundation Stone One: Revelation Knowledge

Faith begins where the will of God is known.

You cannot have faith for what you are uncertain God intends to do. Revelation is the foundation of conviction. Romans 10:17 reminds us that faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God.

The Word is not a religious text; it is the voice of the invisible realm speaking to you.

Revelation converts information into conviction.

A man who has only read the Bible has knowledge; a man who has heard God through it has faith. When light enters your spirit, it rewires your reality.

Illustration:

A young missionary once walked into a disease-infested village with no medicine, but with revelation that "these signs shall follow them that believe." He laid hands on the dying, and they recovered. He did not argue with the verse; he lived it. Revelation produces boldness that defies fear.

When God's Word becomes your inner sight, faith becomes your natural response.

3. Foundation Stone Two: The Law of Confession

Faith is a speaking force. 2 Corinthians 4:13 says:

"We having the same spirit of faith, according as it is written, I believed, and therefore have I spoken; we also believe, and therefore speak."

Believing is incomplete until it speaks. Words are spiritual vehicles that carry faith from your spirit into the material realm. Creation itself was birthed by divine speech—"And God said, Let there be light." Confession means homologeo in Greek — "to say the same thing." When you confess, you are not making something up; you are agreeing with what God has already decreed. Faith says what God says until the seen world conforms. When you say what God says, you authorize heaven to reproduce it in your circumstances. When you say what fear says, you authorize defeat.

Your mouth is the steering wheel of your destiny.

Example:

A man once lost his business and kept saying, "Nothing works for me." The more he said it, the more the ground resisted him. One day, he heard a teaching on confession and changed his declaration: "Everything I set my hands to prospers." Within months, contracts began to appear. Same man. Same hands. Different confession.

Life responds to language. Faith refuses to speak the language of failure.

4. Foundation Stone Three: Action—The Completion of Faith

James 2:26 makes it plain: "Faith without works is dead." Faith is not faith until it acts. It is motion that gives faith visibility. Every time you act on revelation, you transfer divine potential into earthly reality. Faith does not wait for conditions; it creates them.

When Peter saw Jesus walking on water, faith said, "Lord, if it is You, bid me come." Jesus said, "Come." That single word was the bridge between water and solid ground. Peter stepped, and the impossible became possible—until he doubted.

Faith acts on now. Doubt delays. If you know God has spoken, act, and watch the supernatural align.

5. Building Faith: The Daily Practice

Like muscle, faith grows by exercise. You cannot delegate your spiritual conditioning. The following disciplines maintain faith's architecture:

a. Meditative Immersion

Faith thrives in revelation atmosphere. Meditation is the watering of the seed of the Word. Joshua 1:8 says: "This Book of the Law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night..." Meditation engraves truth into your consciousness until you think divine thoughts effortlessly.

b. Praying in the Spirit

Jude 20 declares, "Building up yourselves on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Ghost." Tongues are not mere utterances—they are construction tools. Every time you pray in the Spirit, you fortify your inner architecture.

c. Practicing Obedience

Partial obedience is sabotage. Every instruction obeyed increases your faith capacity for greater instructions. Faith grows on tested ground.

d. Fellowship with Believers of Like Spirit

Faith feeds on atmosphere. Surround yourself with people who speak possibility. Doubt is contagious; so is faith.

6. Maintaining Faith Amidst Storms

Even the strongest faith will be tested. The shaking is not to destroy you but to solidify you. Mark 4:37–40 recounts Jesus sleeping in the storm. The disciples cried, "Master, carest Thou not that we perish?" He arose, rebuked the wind, and then rebuked their fear: "Why are ye so fearful? How is it that ye have no faith?"

Faith is not measured by the absence of storms but by the absence of fear during them.

When everything screams, "It's over!" faith whispers, "Peace, be still."

Key Strategy in Trials:

- Hold your confession even when nothing changes. Faith speaks before the manifestation, not after.
- Remember past victories. Faith feeds on testimony. David said, "The God who delivered me from the lion and the bear will deliver me from this Philistine."
- Anchor in thanksgiving. Gratitude keeps faith alive when circumstances try to choke it.

Thanksgiving is faith's song before the battle is over.

7. Family Faith: Building a Household of Belief

At the family level, faith must become a culture. Families that believe together inherit together.

a. The Family Altar

Every home should have a rhythm of the Word and prayer. Faith flourishes where the Word has daily voice. Read scripture aloud, declare promises together, and make thanksgiving a ritual.

b. Speaking Blessing Over Children

Do not merely hope for their success—prophesy it. Words shape destinies. Say over your children:

"You will walk in wisdom and favor. You are for signs and wonders. No weapon formed against you shall prosper."

These declarations write prophecy into their atmosphere.

c. Faith in Finances

Families often face economic pressure. Faith is not ignorance of reality; it is insistence on covenant. Practice tithing and generous giving as acts of faith, not religious obligation.

Expect divine increase—not from human systems, but from heaven's economy.

Illustration:

A family once lost their primary income source. Instead of panic, they gathered, prayed, and declared that "our source is Jehovah Jireh." Within a week, unexpected provision came through a forgotten investment. Faith turns scarcity into sufficiency.

8. Church Faith: Corporate Dimension of the Overcoming Life

When believers gather in unity of faith, power multiplies exponentially.

Acts 4:31 reveals: "When they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the Word of God with boldness." Corporate faith releases territorial authority. One believer's faith moves a situation; a church's faith moves a city.

Apostolic Patterns for Church-Level Faith: Unified Declaration: We can all as a congregation regularly speak promises over the city, the nation, and the harvest.

Example: "We decree revival fire burns in this region; the hearts of men turn to Christ!"

Prophetic Action: There are times the Spirit may instruct an act—a march, a declaration walk, a seed, a communion moment. These are not rituals; they are faith triggers.

9. Ancient Example: Faith at the National Level

Consider Daniel. In Babylon, surrounded by idolatry, he refused compromise. His faith turned pagan kings into preachers. When thrown into the lions' den, his conviction held firm. Faith did not prevent him from entering the den; it prevented the lions from functioning.

Faith does not always stop adversity; it suspends its power. When the Church stands in that order of faith, regions shift. Governments notice. Darkness retreats. The impossible bows.

10. The Apostolic Mindset of Faith

Faith is warfare. Ephesians 6:16 calls it "the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked." The shield of faith is not a small plate—it's a full-body covering. When lifted, no dart can penetrate. Every accusation, every sickness, every demonic whisper finds no landing place where faith stands alert.

Apostolic faith does not beg; it legislates. It does not ask the mountain to move—it commands it to shift. Faith-filled decrees sound like heaven's government speaking through human lips.

11. Maintaining Your Faith Fire

Faith can be lost through neglect or corruption. Guard your spiritual temperature.

- Avoid contamination: Doubtful company and negative speech erode confidence.
- Renew your mind daily: Faith decays in unrenewed thinking.

• Stay full of the Spirit: Dryness breeds unbelief.

When you maintain the fire of the Word and the flow of the Spirit, faith becomes spontaneous. You will no longer try to believe; you will live believing.

12. Daily Enforcement Example (Family and Church)

For the Family: "We are a covenant household. The blessing of the Lord makes us rich and adds no sorrow. Our children are preserved. Our storehouse overflows. Sickness and fear are strangers here. We live by faith and walk in victory."

For the Church: "This assembly walks by faith. Signs, wonders, and salvation mark our gatherings. We are a city set on a hill. Our faith conquers territories and births revival. The glory of the Lord covers this house!" When declarations become consistent, faith becomes atmosphere

Faith is architectural—built line upon line, revelation upon revelation. It is not a gift for some; it is the calling of all. The believer who builds faith according to divine design cannot be destroyed by circumstance.

III) The Life That Overcomes: Living by Faith in Every Realm

1. Faith: The Legal Power of the New Creation

Faith is not merely a virtue; it is a legal instrument of dominion in the Kingdom.

When you were born again, you were not simply rescued—you were empowered.

1 John 5:4 declares:

"Whatsoever is born of God overcomes the world: and this is the victory that overcomes the world, even our faith."

Every born-again believer carries within them a victory mechanism—faith.

Faith is not borrowed strength; it is the divine DNA of God operational in the human spirit. When faith speaks, it is not man talking to circumstances; it is God talking through man.

This means:

- You don't fight for victory—you enforce from victory.
- Faith is the courtroom voice of the believer demanding manifestation of covenant.

2. The Dominion Mandate of Faith

Genesis 1:28 gave humanity the mandate: "Have dominion..."

But sin severed that authority. The cross restored it through faith in Christ.

Now, dominion is not control over people—it is spiritual governance over circumstances, systems, and atmospheres. Faith is how that dominion is exercised.

Romans 5:17 says: "They which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by One, Jesus Christ."

To reign in life means to govern realities by faith. Faith is the scepter of our kingship. When faith is active, defeat becomes illegal.

3. How Faith Enforces Victory.

There are three major operations of faith in enforcing dominion:

a. Faith Speaks with Authority.

Mark 11:23 — "Whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith."

Faith does not beg the mountain—it commands it. Mountains represent resistance—spiritual, financial, emotional, or systemic. The secret is not the size of your faith but the alignment of your voice. When the believer speaks under conviction of revelation, creation recognises that tone. The mountain must move.

b. Faith Acts with Precision

Victory is not claimed by emotion but executed by instruction. Every miracle in Scripture followed obedience to a precise Word. Naaman dipped seven times. The blind man washed in Siloam. The lepers went to show themselves to the priest. When faith hears an instruction, it does not argue—it executes. Obedience is the operational side of dominion.

c. Faith Stands with Endurance- Hebrews 10:36:

"You have need of patience, that, after you have done the will of God, you might receive the promise." Endurance is the proof of faith maturity. Faith that cannot wait cannot win.

Delay is not denial; it is development. The time between promise and manifestation is where dominion muscles are built. Dominion faith does not panic in waiting rooms. It worships there.

4. The Weapons of Faith in Warfare

Faith is both a shield and a sword. Ephesians 6:16–17 gives two metaphors:

- The shield of faith—for defense against fiery darts of fear, accusation, and doubt.
- The sword of the Spirit (the Word of God)—for offense, cutting through resistance.

Faith therefore both protects and penetrates.

Our apostolic Strategy for Warfare:

- 1. Identify the lie. Every battle of faith begins with a contradiction of truth.
- 2. Find the Word. Locate the scripture that cancels that lie.
- 3. Speak the Word. Repeatedly, audibly, consistently.
- 4. Stand your ground. Refuse to retreat in speech or thought until manifestation appears.

Example:

A believer under constant oppression once spent nights declaring aloud, "No weapon formed against me shall prosper." Fear began to dissipate. Demonic dreams stopped. Her environment shifted. Why? Faith spoken becomes fire in the spirit realm.

5. Faith in the Marketplace and Nations

Faith is not confined to the church altar; it governs hospital, care centres, boardrooms, schools, and parliaments. When believers carry faith into the systems of the world, they establish dominion of light.

a. In the Marketplace:

Faith-led entrepreneurs build companies that operate by revelation, not manipulation. They tithe business profits, treat staff as covenant partners, and make decisions by the peace of the Spirit. Faith-driven integrity turns commerce into ministry.

b. In Education and Innovation:

Faith does not ignore science—it transcends it. Great inventions, discoveries, and social reforms often came from men and women who believed they were acting under divine inspiration. Faith births creativity because it connects to the Creator.

c. In Nations:

When believers pray in faith over nations, policies shift. Faith-driven intercession shapes history. Scripture shows that Elijah's faith shut the heavens, then opened them again (James 5:17–18). That was national impact through one man's conviction.

Faith is the invisible parliament where heaven legislates through believers.

6. The Process of Faith Enforcement

Faith has a practical rhythm that can be mastered:

- 1. Receive the Word: Every battle begins with revelation.
- 2. Meditate until persuasion forms: Don't rush; let the Word saturate until you believe without debate.
- 3. Speak with conviction: Declare until atmosphere bows.
- 4. Act without delay: Faith without action is fantasy.
- 5. Rejoice as if it's done: Thanksgiving seals the manifestation.

Each step carries creative power. Neglecting any step aborts manifestation.

7. Ancient Patterns of Enforced Faith

a. David's Victory Over Goliath:

David did not pray Goliath away; he enforced covenant. His words were faith decrees: "The Lord will deliver you into my hand... that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel." He spoke before he struck. Dominion faith always prophesies its result before battle.

b. Elijah at Carmel:

He rebuilt the altar, soaked the sacrifice with water, and prayed a short, precise prayer. Fire fell immediately. Faith does not need length; it needs alignment.

c. The Woman with the Issue of Blood:

She said within herself, "If I may but touch His garment..." and pressed through the crowd. Faith touched virtue before anyone else perceived it.

These patterns are eternal. Faith always carries a voice, an action, and a contact point.

8. Contemporary Illustrations: Modern Faith in Action

a. Personal Realm:

A young believer lost his job but refused despair. Each morning he declared, "My promotion comes from the Lord." Within weeks, a better position opened in another city. His confession created direction.

b. Family Realm:

A couple struggling with infertility began nightly communion, confessing Psalm 113:9 — "He makes the barren woman to keep house and to be a joyful mother of children." Within months, conception came. Faith turned longing into laughter.

c. Church Realm:

A congregation once faced closure due to persecution. Instead of fear, they gathered in fasting and faith declarations: "The gates of hell shall not prevail." Within a year, revival broke out, and the same authorities that opposed them offered public protection.

Faith is never outdated—it is eternally operational.

9. The Three Dimensions of Enforced Faith

- 1. Faith for Victory (Receiving): Believing to obtain what grace provides.
- 2. Faith for Dominion (Ruling): Exercising authority to shape outcomes.
- 3. Faith for Legacy (Transferring): Imparting the same spirit of faith to the next generation.

You are not called to use faith only for personal breakthroughs but to reproduce a lineage of believers who live by faith instinctively.

Faith is generational wealth in the spirit.

10. Faith and the Apostolic Church

The apostolic church must return to militant faith. In Acts 6:8, Stephen, "full of faith and power, did great wonders and miracles among the people."

Faith and power always travel together. A powerless church is a faith-starved church.

Faith must once again be the atmosphere of ministry—where healing, deliverance, and transformation flow naturally. Leaders must train believers to live by revelation, not reaction.

Every sermon, prayer, and worship moment should be an activation of faith consciousness. "We are not a fearful assembly; we are a believing generation. We do not watch history—we make it by faith. Every territory assigned to us yields fruit. Revival is our portion, and the Word of God grows mightily and prevails."

When a church begins to speak like this, power dynamics shift in the spirit realm.

11. The Enforcer's Declarations

Daily, the believer must legislate reality through words of faith.

Use these as daily enforcement affirmations:

i) Personal Faith Enforcement

"Today, I walk by faith and not by sight. My spirit rules my senses. The life of God flows through me—healing my body, guiding my mind, prospering my hands. I am not subject to fear or lack. I am the righteousness of God in Christ, living victoriously in every situation."

ii) Family Faith Enforcement

"Our household stands on covenant ground. No plague shall come near our dwelling. The blessing of Abraham is upon our lineage. We are preserved, provided for, and progressing by divine favor. Our faith produces peace, progress, and posterity."

iii) Church Faith Enforcement

"Our gathering is a gate of heaven. Miracles, salvations, and breakthroughs are daily occurrences. We live in the overflow. The Word of the Lord grows, multiplies, and conquers this region through us. We are the voice of faith to our generation."

12. The Manifestation Dimension

Faith, when matured, becomes sight. There is a realm where you no longer struggle to believe—you know. This is where Abraham reached when he considered not his body, nor Sarah's womb, but was fully persuaded. Faith becomes effortless when it matures into trust. You move from striving for miracles to walking in perpetual manifestation. Faith graduates from believing for something to believing from Someone. When the believer reaches this stage, life itself becomes a testimony.

13. The Spirit of Faith and the End-Time Church

The Spirit of Faith is the mantle of the end-time army. It is the antidote to fear, deception, and compromise in the last days. As darkness increases, faith must blaze brighter.

Habakkuk 2:4 says, "The just shall live by his faith." Not by economy. Not by popularity. By faith. When others collapse under the weight of uncertainty, the man of faith rises as a pillar of stability. The Spirit of Faith will mark the final generation of reformers—believers who command weather, confront systems, heal nations, and raise the dead because they know who they are in Christ.

14. The Final Apostolic Charge

Beloved, the time has come to live by faith without retreat. Do not negotiate your destiny with doubt. Faith is not a theory—it is the believer's life support.

Rise every day and decree:

"I am born of God, therefore I overcome the world. My faith is not fragile; it is fiery. Every obstacle before me is a testimony in the making. I reign in life through Christ Jesus. I enforce the will of heaven on earth."

Remember:

- Faith is heaven's currency.
- The Word is faith's warehouse.
- Confession is faith's transport system.
- Obedience is faith's construction tool.

If you live by these, every realm—personal, family, and corporate—will reflect the dominion of Christ.

15. Closing Benediction

"Now unto Him who is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us..." (Ephesians 3:20) That power is faith—living, breathing, triumphant. Let it rule your thoughts, your speech, your home, and your generation.

You were born to live by faith. You were raised to walk by faith. You are destined to overcome by faith.

This is the Life that Overcomes.

Navigating The VAV Year (2025-2026) (5785-5786) In A PEY Season (2021-2029) (The Decade Of The Mouth).

(I humbly write as the Lord has given me light to show to the church on how we must <u>stake</u> our inheritance, ensuring promises don't float away but remain fastened in our lives, families, on the missions' fields, places of battle, ministries, and countries. We as God's people must not shy away from these dimensions of staking — Identity, Connection, Manifestation, and Transformation — anchor heaven's promises into the earth, securing our covenant inheritance in Christ.

I will try and explain these in structured sections, weaving together prophetic proclamation (seeing and declaring) and apostolic enforcement (governing and establishing).

Prophetic and Apostolic Guide into a VAV Year (2026) in a PEY Season

Staking Our Inheritance Through Proclamation and Enforcement

Introduction: A VAV Year in a PEY Season

We are in the midst of a remarkable prophetic timeline. We have often stressed the nature of the writing of this journal. It is strategic as it guides into God's Timeline so that YOU CAN EXPERIENCE REDEMPTION LIFT. If you pay attention, you push forward and breakout. The Hebraic calendar year 5786 is not just a number—it is a spiritual code pointing to times, seasons, and divine alignments. The decade of the PEY (80s) emphasizes the mouth, speech, and decrees. We must not soon forget the COVID years as the enemy desired to shut our mouths. What we proclaim carries weight, shaping destinies, cities, and nations.

But within this decade, the year 5786 draws out a particular letter: VAV (1). VAV is the sixth letter of the Hebrew alphabet and functions as a nail, hook, or connector. It binds together what seems divided, joining heaven to earth, word to fulfilment, and spirit to matter. When PEY (mouth/declaration) and VAV (nail/connection) operate together, they create a kingdom dynamic of proclamation and enforcement. Amen.

This article will explore how to walk in prophetic and apostolic dimensions this year—prophesying God's decrees (prophetic proclamation) and governing them into reality (apostolic enforcement).

Part One: Understanding the Times—Why PEY and VAV Matter

The PEY Decade (5780–5789)

- PEY means mouth: it is the decade of prophetic speech, decrees, and utterances (Proverbs 18:21).
- God is raising His people to <u>speak life over chaos</u>, to <u>frame futures by His Word</u>, and to <u>silence false voices that confuse nations</u>.
- The PEY season is about power in the mouth, but not just any speech—it is speech aligned with Heaven.

The VAV Year (5786)

- VAV means nail or hook. It is used in Hebrew grammar as "and"—a connector.
- Spiritually, VAV connects heaven and earth (Genesis 1 repeatedly says, "And God said... and it was so").
- It is about staking inheritance—nailing down promises so they don't drift away.

Together, PEY + VAV mean that this year is not about random speech but anchored decrees that bind heaven's will to earth's reality.

Part Two: Prophetic Proclamation—Speaking as Heaven Speaks

Prophecy begins with seeing and saying. This is the PEY dimension—what comes out of your mouth shapes the year ahead. But PEY in a VAV year means our words are not loose—they are nails that fasten destiny.

1. Identity: Standing in Christ the Son of Man

- Scripture: "As He is, so are we in this world" (1 John 4:17).
- Proclamation: I am not just a voice in the wind; I am one seated with Christ (Ephesians 2:6). My decrees give a voice to His authority.
- Application: When you declare healing, you speak as one joined to the Great Physician. When you decree resolutions to family issues, you speak as one joined to the Father of families in heaven.
- When you decree provision, you speak as one joined to the Lord of abundance.

Prophetic Insight: Many in this year will face <u>identity</u> challenges—<u>feeling small</u>, <u>powerless</u>, <u>poor</u>, <u>or unheard</u>. But God is saying: Your authority comes from union with Christ. Every decree you make in Him is a stake driven into the earth.

2. Connection: Heaven and Earth United

- Scripture: "Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" (Matt. 6:10).
- Proclamation: My words are not just prayers—they are bridges between heaven and earth.
- Application: When you pray for your family, tribes, ministry, or nation, see your words as the VAV—the connecting nail that brings heaven's decree into earth's condition.

Prophetic Insight: This is a year where prophetic decrees will collapse delays. What was "stuck in the heavens" is being nailed into earth's soil. Amen.

3. Manifestation: Spiritual to Material

- Scripture: "Blessed be the God... who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing" (Eph. 1:3).
- Proclamation: Every unseen blessing must find expression. My inheritance will not remain locked in the invisible.
- Application: Begin to name your inheritance: Nations, land, health, finances, relationships, generational blessings. Speak as one pulling down the unseen into the seen.
- We see an example in Numbers 21:16-18. There was no water. Israel sang: "Spring up O Well" that was a prophetic act calling what was hidden in the earth into manifestation. But there was an apostolic dimension in Num 21:18- that the princes dug the well by the direction of the lawgiver with their staves and the outcome was a well of water. We see authority and unity.

Insight: For many, this year is a crossing point from prophetic promises into tangible possession. What your mouth decrees with faith will materialize as generational inheritance.

4. Transformation: From the Unseen to the Seen

- Scripture: "We look not at the things which are seen, but... at the things which are unseen" (2 Cor. 4:18).
- Proclamation: My home, city, and nation will look like heaven's blueprint.
- Application: Do not speak what you see; speak what He shows. Align speech with heavenly reality until transformation occurs.

Insight: This is a year to shift atmospheres. The unseen will press into the visible. Expect radical changes in homes, churches, and even national policies as prophetic decrees take root.

Part Three: Apostolic Enforcement—Driving the Nails

Prophetic proclamation alone releases sound, but apostolic enforcement drives the nail deep until the word stands immovable. Apostolic enforcement is about government, order, and implementation.

1. The Apostolic Nature of VAV

- VAV is not a casual connector; it is a stake.
- Apostolic authority ensures promises are nailed down, not stolen.
- Without apostolic enforcement, prophetic words remain in the atmosphere.

2. Enforcing Identity

- Enforcement: Guard your identity in Christ. Do not let culture, fear, or failure redefine you.
- Strategy: Regularly declare: "I am seated with Christ. My authority is intact."
- Example: Jesus in the wilderness (Luke 4) enforced His identity against satanic temptation by the Word.

3. Enforcing Connection

- Enforcement: Apostolic prayer brings heavenly blueprints into earthly systems.
- Strategy: Establish decrees through fasting, strategic intercession, and practical obedience.
- Example: Elijah decreed rain, but then he labored in prayer until the manifestation came (1 Kings 18).

4. Enforcing Manifestation

- Enforcement: Apostolic leaders build structures for spiritual blessings to land.
- Strategy: Create "buckets" for the rain—budgets, ministries, teams, systems—so when blessings come, they are contained.

• Example: Joseph not only interpreted Pharaoh's dream but built grain houses to secure the harvest (Genesis 41).

5. Enforcing Transformation

- Enforcement: Apostolic governance shifts cities and nations (tribes).
- Strategy: Stake the land with prophetic actions, decree over institutions, and implement kingdom order in business, politics, and family.
- Example: Paul in Ephesus (Acts 19) not only preached but established a new spiritual economy that overturned idol worship.

Part Four: Practical Guide for the Year 5786

Luke 19:30–35 connects deeply with pey (mouth, declaration, prophetic release) and vav (hook, connection, apostolic enforcement into material reality).

1. Prophetic (Pey – Mouth/Declaration)

- Jesus gave a spoken prophetic instruction: "Go... you will find a colt tied... say, The Lord has need of him."
- The word spoken ahead of time framed the reality. It was not yet seen, but the mouth (pey) released it into being.
- Prophetic declaration always identifies hidden resources (the colt was tied, unseen, restricted). The prophetic word brings it into visibility.

2. Apostolic (Vav – Connection/Enforcement)

- The disciples went and did exactly as instructed this is apostolic obedience and enforcement.
- When challenged by the owners, the apostolic action held authority: "The Lord has need of him." This simple phrase was both legal authorization and enforcement.
- The vav, as a hook, connects heaven's decree (pey) with earthly manifestation. The colt was loosed and delivered to Christ a material enforcement of a prophetic word.

Daily Practice

- 1. Morning Proclamation (PEY): Begin each day with decrees over identity, connection, manifestation, and transformation.
- 2. Midday Enforcement (VAV): Take practical action to anchor what you declared—phone calls, strategies, building, correcting.
- 3. Evening Reflection: Journal testimonies of manifestation and transformation.

Corporate Practice

• Churches and ministries should create Prophetic Proclamation Sheets for the year.

• Apostolic leaders should call enforcement gatherings to hammer words into place through fasting, intercession, and implementation.

National and Generational Application

- Nations: Stake territories with prophetic acts—plant scripture stakes, anoint gates, decree policies.
- Generations: Parents and mentors must declare over children and spiritual sons/daughters. Stake inheritance for future generations.

Conclusion: Living Anchored in a VAV Year

The year 5786 is not ordinary. It is a VAV year in a PEY season—a time when the mouth decrees and the nail secures. To walk faithfully:

- Proclaim prophetically what Heaven is saying.
- Enforce apostolically until manifestation comes.

This is how we stake inheritance, ensuring promises don't float away but remain fastened in our lives, families, ministries, and nations.

Adopt-A-Missionary- A Missions' Strategy

...a strategy for loving the missionary family as well as the people groups, they serve

Adopt-A-Missionary is a mission strategy that has gained momentum in missions over the years. What makes this strategy different is its focus. Historically, churches have focused on countries, and mission agencies have focused their attention on people groups. Adopt-A- Missionary focuses on missionary families, or what we can call message bearers.

For 5 years, my wife (of blessed memory) and I served as missionary representatives to the Kenyan peoples of East Africa. We divided the nation of Kenya into 6. Working with the missionary on ground we had a plan to evangelise the nation. We raised teams of two by two from Nigeria and travelled from Nigeria to the different regions of Kenya. We planted 6 churches throughout the country. In the last 29 years + the FMI missionary teams have been helped by God to open the gospel among 40 unreached people groups. Our FMC churches faithfully prayed and the missionaries that we served with, and the church has supported them financially.

In 1990 for example, we were relocated to Kano, Nigeria, Northwest, with two major tribes- the Kanawas and Magusawas. We were led of the Lord to pay more attention to tribal missions in 1993, where the gospel has never been heard while maintaining a church base. Thankfully, our churches have continued to pray for and support the mission's effort with this strategic ministry.

ADOPT-A-Missionary Defined

What then does it mean to Adopt-A-missionary? It means committing yourself as an individual, fellowship group, local congregation, denomination, or mission agency to pray for and commit resources to win souls, establish believers, administrate the work within a specific people group through a missionary family or families. This commitment is continued until the believers in that people group can reach the rest of their people without outside (cross-cultural) assistance.

We are agents of God praying, giving, and serving to see an adopted family reach out to bring sinners into God's family. This is the true meaning of Adopting a missionary family. One day this will be accomplished, and every tribe, tongue, people, and nation will give glory to God around His throne (Rev. 5:9).

Adopt a Missionary Family

Fullstature Missions International is committed to the work of missions and has developed a ministry to bring into focus the Great Commission (Matt 28:19-20) set forth by Christ and to support missionary families need. We ask that your family prayerfully consider adopting a missionary family to be a blessing and to be blessed. After you have made an adoption, we encourage you can send your missionary family an email to share about your family and to ask them to share with you. The FMI becomes a bridge to help people you may never know or meet. You can reach out to the missionary during Holidays, birthdays, or anniversaries or just at any time. Commit to lift your missionary up in prayer. (Phil 6)

It is also our desire to support more missionaries through our ministry budget than we currently can do. The missionaries we support currently are under-supported. In other words, the support we grant is not adequate. In most cases, we are nearly able (with Naira) to provide what will keep body and soul together leaving projects in the field undone. This is where you pause and do something.

It is our goal to ensure that every Missionary, supported through, (what we call) the General Fund which includes the "Faith Promise Offering" (FPO), are missionaries we, as a ministry want to support.

The money these Missionaries receive is totally dependent on what is given by the individual or families who have adopted them.

Example: Missionary "Felix" may have two families in First Baptist Church which chose to adopt him. They do so for a combined support of \$200 per month, one for \$75 per month and one for \$125 per month. Should the family who chose to support Missionary "Felix" for \$125 per month be unable to do so for any reason, Missionary "Felix" would

only receive \$75 for that month. There will be a "shortfall" and the family who was unable to give what they had purposed to give would not be contacted and asked, "Where is your contribution".

If you have a desire to support a Missionary, please feel free to fill out a "Adopt-A-Missionary Request Form" and return it to our ministry office.

Build a Relationship

Develop a relationship with your adopted missionary family. Learn about their ministry and their ups and downs so that you know when to Praise God with them and when to lift them up in prayer. Being a missionary can have very hard times and there is great comfort when a missionary knows that God is always there and that there are people supporting them at every step.

Faith Promise

In addition to your commitment to get to know and pray for your adopted missionary, you may consider supporting your missionary financially. Among some of the greatest difficulties that missionaries face is having their financial needs met. Missionaries typically spend a significant amount of time raising monies to support their ministries which in turn reduces the amount of time out in the field.

- Ask Jehovah to forgive you where you have for one reason or another, ignored or rejected to recognize your day of birth.

- Thank Jehovah for the day of your conception. (Psa 139:13)
- Thank Jehovah that when He thought of you, he already thought of your entire life. Thank Him that He did not leave anything to chance. (Isa 49:1)
- Thank Him that he knew exactly what your redemptive purpose was going to be. (Psa. 139:16)
- Pray that He will reveal the original you more and more as you enter another year of your life. (Psa 139:13-15)
- Pray that He will restore the heavenly label, and the heavenly name He gave you before you were conceived. (Jer 1:5).
- Speak into the foundations of your life and prophesy good things.
- Prophesy that you will live and not die prematurely in any area of your life. Your family will live, the work of your hand will live and grow from strength to strength. Deut. 33:6, Psa. 27:13, 118:17
- Prophesy and proclaim the blessing of Levi upon your life as a priest unto Jehovah (2 Pet 2:9, Deut 33:8-11)
- Prophesy and proclaim the blessing of Benjamin upon your life. Deut. 33:12
- Prophesy the blessing of the wisdom of Issachar in every area of life. Wisdom to establish the work of your hands, your family, as you grow a year older 1 Chron 12:32, Deut.33:18b-19, Prov 24:3-4
- Prophesy the blessing of Dan concerning your role as a leader. Prophesy over your inheritance that Jehovah will indeed ensure you leave an inheritance for your descendants. Deut 33:20-21, Psa 16:5-6.
- Prophesy the blessing of Joseph. Speak to the earth and declare that the earth will bring forth its best for you in this New Year. Prophesy to the heavens to declare the glory of Jehovah over your life every day of this New Year. Deut 33:13-17, Lev 26:4-5, Hos 2:21-22, Psalm 19:1-2, Isa 55:12
- Prophesy that you will grow in your spirit man into a matured son so you can receive your inheritance. Wherever you go in this New Year, creation will experience release from frustration. Rom 8:19-20, Gal 4:1-2
- Praise Jehovah that your birthday marks the entry into another season of Jubilee. Thank Jehovah that immediately you were born, you cried out prophetically blowing your own jubilee cornet, and prophetically rejoiced in yourself. Ask Him to give you joy no matter your circumstance, to rejoice on this day. Amen.

Reflection:

Ask yourself, "What would I do right now if I truly believed God's Word?" Then do it.

Prayer:

Father, give me the courage to act on Your promises without hesitation or doubt.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 4

The Authority of the Believer

Scripture: "Behold, I give you authority... over all the power of the enemy." – Luke 10:19

Many Christians live as victims, unaware of the authority they possess in Christ. Faith thrives in the revelation of dominion. You are not begging for victory; you are enforcing what has already been won. The authority of the believer is rooted in union with Christ. When you stand on His Word and resist the enemy, heaven backs your command.

Reflection:

Stop asking God to do what He has already empowered you to do in His name.

Prayer:

Lord, awaken my understanding of the authority I have in Christ. Teach me to reign in life by Your Spirit.



Today, @ 13:19p.m. is the full moon

- This is the season when the moon is in its full strength. Command the moon to praise Jehovah and dedicate all its strength to heeding only to God's command and purpose.
- Read Isa 60.18-20 and Proclaim Psalm 118; Declare that these shall be gates of praise and righteousness for you and kingdom citizens in your territory.
- At the full moon, declare that every prophetic decree you had prophesied for this month will have reached it fullness and will begin to be released to you with the waning of the moon. Pray 1 Tim 1:7 over your mind will and emotions, and kingdom citizens everywhere.

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 5

How Faith Comes

Scripture: "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" Romans 10:17

God's Word carries healing power. Just as medicine requires regular intake, the Word must be taken consistently, believed deeply, and confessed continually.

Faith-filled words release the healing virtue of Christ into the body. The Word is not merely informative—it is transformative.

Reflection:

Are you feeding your spirit with the Word as faithfully as you care for your body?

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, I receive Your Word as medicine. Let Your healing power work in every part of me.

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 6

The God-Kind of Faith

Scripture: "Have faith in God." - Mark 11:22

The literal translation says, "Have the faith of God." This is the same kind of faith that spoke creation into being. The God-kind of faith believes in the heart and speaks with authority, expecting results.

This faith does not waver at impossibilities. It refuses to acknowledge defeat. It sees the unseen, declares the end from the beginning, and rests in the integrity of God's Word.

Reflection:

If God's Word is true—and it is—then your situation is subject to change.

Prayer:

Lord, help me to operate in Your kind of faith, unwavering and bold in its confession.

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 7

The Power of Love in Faith

Scripture: "Faith works by love." – Galatians 5:6

Faith cannot operate in an atmosphere of strife or bitterness. Love is the environment in which faith flourishes. When the heart is free from offense, the Spirit flows unhindered.

To walk in love is to walk in power. Forgiveness is not a feeling—it's a decision to release and trust God with justice.

Reflection:

Search your heart. Unforgiveness is a clog in the pipeline of faith.

Prayer:

Father, fill my heart with Your love. Let no bitterness hinder my walk of faith.

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 8

The Inner Witness

Scripture: "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit..." - Romans 8:16

Faith follows the inner witness of the Holy Spirit. God's direction is not always loud; often it's a quiet assurance within. The believer who learns to listen to the Spirit will walk in divine timing and protection.

Reason argues; faith listens.

Reflection:

Peace is your compass. If you lose peace, pause until it returns.

Prayer:

Holy Spirit, teach me to hear and follow Your inner witness in every decision.

SUNDAY NOVEMBER 9

The Prayer of Faith

Scripture: "Whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them." – Mark 11:24

Prayer is not begging God to act—it's enforcing His will through faith. The prayer of faith believes at the moment of asking and receives before seeing.

Doubt delays manifestation. Faith takes possession now.

Reflection:

Don't keep asking for what you've already believed you received. Thank Him instead.

Prayer:

Lord, I believe I receive the answers to my prayers according to Your Word. I stand in faith until manifestation comes.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10

The Rest of Faith

Scripture: "We who have believed do enter that rest." – Hebrews 4:3

Faith is not frantic—it rests. Once you've prayed and believed, anxiety must cease. Rest is the proof of genuine faith.

Worry is faith in reverse. True faith knows that God has already provided, and the outcome is settled.

Reflection:

If you're still striving, you haven't entered rest. Let go and trust Him completely.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 11

The Spirit-Filled Life of Faith

Scripture: "Be filled with the Spirit." – Ephesians 5:18

Faith grows strong in an atmosphere of continual fellowship with the Holy Spirit. He reveals the Word, strengthens the inner man, and empowers the believer to stand unshaken.

A Spirit-filled life is a faith-filled life. Prayer, praise, and the Word are the keys to staying full.

Reflection:

Stay filled, stay believing, stay victorious.

Prayer:

Holy Spirit, fill me afresh today. Let my faith remain alive, active, and victorious in every circumstance.

The presence of God in you is not passive; it is active, vital, and powerful. His Spirit quickens every part of your being. To live conscious of this reality is to live in continual strength.

What you are conscious of, you manifest. Be more aware of the indwelling Christ than the symptoms around you.

Prayer:

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 13

The Law of the Spirit of Life

Scripture: "The law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death." – Romans 8:2

There is a higher law at work in the believer—the law of divine life. Just as gravity governs the natural world, the Spirit of life governs the new creation. Disease and death cannot dominate where this law is known and believed.

Faith is the switch that activates this law. The Spirit of life flows wherever faith opens the way.

Reflection:

You are not subject to the old order of weakness—you live under a new covenant of life and power.

Prayer:

Father, I thank You for the law of life at work in me. I declare that no sickness or fear shall rule over me.

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 14

The Secret of Spiritual Power

Scripture: "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you." - Acts 1:8

Power is not earned through striving; it is received through surrender. The Spirit does not anoint the casual, but the consecrated. When a believer yields fully, heaven fills that life with divine might.

Spiritual power is the overflow of a pure heart in union with God. When self is crucified, Christ's life is released without hindrance.

Reflection:

Power is not in noise or motion—it is in a life fully yielded to the Holy Spirit.

Prayer:

Lord, I yield myself to You completely. Let Your power find full expression through my life.

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 15

Compassion—the Channel of Healing

Scripture: "Jesus was moved with compassion and healed their sick." – Matthew 14:14

The power that heals flows through love. Compassion is the heartbeat of divine healing. It is not pity but identification—feeling what others feel and allowing the Spirit to minister through you.

When love becomes the motive, healing becomes natural. The anointing rests where the love of God abides.

Reflection:

Power without love is empty. Let every act of ministry flow from compassion, not duty.

Prayer:

Holy Spirit, fill my heart with divine love. Let compassion move me to bring Your healing presence to others.

SUNDAY NOVEMBER 16

The Sanctified Life

Scripture: "Be holy, for I am holy." – 1 Peter 1:16

Consecration is not about separation from the world alone—it is union with God's nature. Holiness is the atmosphere in which the Spirit feels at home. When a believer's heart is cleansed, divine power flows freely.

The sanctified life is a surrendered life. It seeks nothing but God's glory.

Reflection:

Purity attracts presence. What is hindering the free flow of His Spirit in your life?

Prayer:

Father, cleanse me from all that displeases You. Let my life be a vessel You can fully inhabit.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 17

Dominion Through the Spirit

Scripture: "Greater is He that is in you, than he that is in the world." – 1 John 4:4

The Spirit-filled believer is not at the mercy of darkness. The indwelling Christ is greater than every opposing power. Authority over disease and demons is not a gift for a few—it is the inheritance of all who walk in the Spirit.

To reign in life is to know your place in Christ and to exercise that dominion boldly.

Reflection:

You carry divine authority—speak to sickness, not about it.

Prayer:

Lord, awaken my understanding of the power within me. I choose to walk in victory, not defeat.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 18

The Flame of Consecration

Scripture: "Present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God." – Romans 12:1

Consecration is the continual offering of oneself upon the altar of service. It costs everything, yet it releases heaven's fullness. The man or woman fully given to God becomes a channel of His fire to the world.

The Spirit seeks vessels, not talent; yieldedness, not prominence.

Reflection:

Are you on the altar? True power comes only through complete surrender.

Prayer:

Lord, consume every part of me with Your holy fire. Let my life burn for Your purposes alone.

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 19

The Healing River Within

A praying believer is an undefeatable believer.

Reflection:

The surrendered believer becomes an altar upon which the fire of God falls. When self dies, the Spirit lives fully. Revival begins when one person completely yields to the will of God.

Reflection:

Your availability matters more than your ability. Have you placed all upon the altar?

Prayer:

Father, take my life—every dream, every plan. Use me for Your glory alone.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 24

The Fire of the Holy Spirit

Scripture: "He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and with fire." – Matthew 3:11

The baptism of the Holy Spirit is not a mere experience; it is an invasion of divine fire. This fire consumes sin, purifies motives, and empowers the believer for service.

When the Holy Spirit fills a person, the ordinary becomes extraordinary. Heaven's flame transforms weak vessels into mighty witnesses.

Reflection:

The anointing is God's divine ability resting upon a human vessel. It destroys yokes, heals the sick, and convicts the lost. It is not earned by effort but received through intimacy and obedience.

When the Spirit's anointing comes, preaching pierces hearts, songs become weapons, and lives are changed by unseen power.

Reflection:

Guard the anointing. It is heaven's trust upon your life.

Prayer:

Holy Spirit, let Your anointing rest upon me with fresh power. Use me to bring freedom and healing to others.

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 27

The Spirit of Prayer and Travail

Scripture: "As soon as Zion travailed, she brought forth her children." – Isaiah 66:8

Revival is born in travail. When the Spirit groans through the intercessor, new life is birthed in the Spirit. True prayer costs something—it draws strength from heaven and breaks chains on earth.

The church does not need more programs; she needs men and women who will weep between the porch and the altar until heaven answers.

Reflection:

How long has it been since you prayed until something broke inside you?

Prayer:

Lord, teach me to pray with the groanings of the Spirit. Birth revival through my intercession.

- Praise God that we are kept despite the shakings in the world. The Lord is good.

Repentance is the doorway to revival. When sin is confessed and forsaken, the refreshing wind of the Spirit returns. Revival cannot come to a proud or hardened heart.

The church that humbles itself will once again see the power of God.

Reflection:

Repentance is not condemnation—it is restoration.

Prayer:

Lord, search me and cleanse me. Let true repentance prepare the way for Your glory in my life and generation.

SUNDAY NOVEMBER 30

The Glory in the Meeting Place

Scripture: "The glory of the Lord filled the house." – 2 Chronicles 5:14

When hearts are united in purity and praise, the glory descends. Revival meetings were never meant to be ordinary gatherings but holy visitations. The Spirit longs to fill every room where Jesus is truly exalted.

When glory fills the house, conviction grips hearts, miracles break forth, and worship rises like a river.

Reflection:

Your worship invites His presence. Prepare every meeting as if heaven will attend.

Prayer:

Lord, let Your glory fill every gathering of believers again. May Your presence be our greatest desire.

Scripture: "Our God is a consuming fire." – Hebrews 12:29


The fire of revival is not meant to be admired—it is meant to be carried. God seeks men and women who will take His flame into dark places and light the world with His power.




He withheld preaching God's word to them. He showed his hatred by not warning them about God's coming judgment for their sins!







We **love** them so much that we don't **want** them to face Jesus at the Great White Throne and be cast in the lake of fire. (See Revelation Ch. 20.)


We **love** them so much that we don't **want** their works to be judged by God the Son, the Lord Jesus Christ.








We **love** them so much that we want them **with us** in the new heaven and the new earth, forever and ever.

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16


