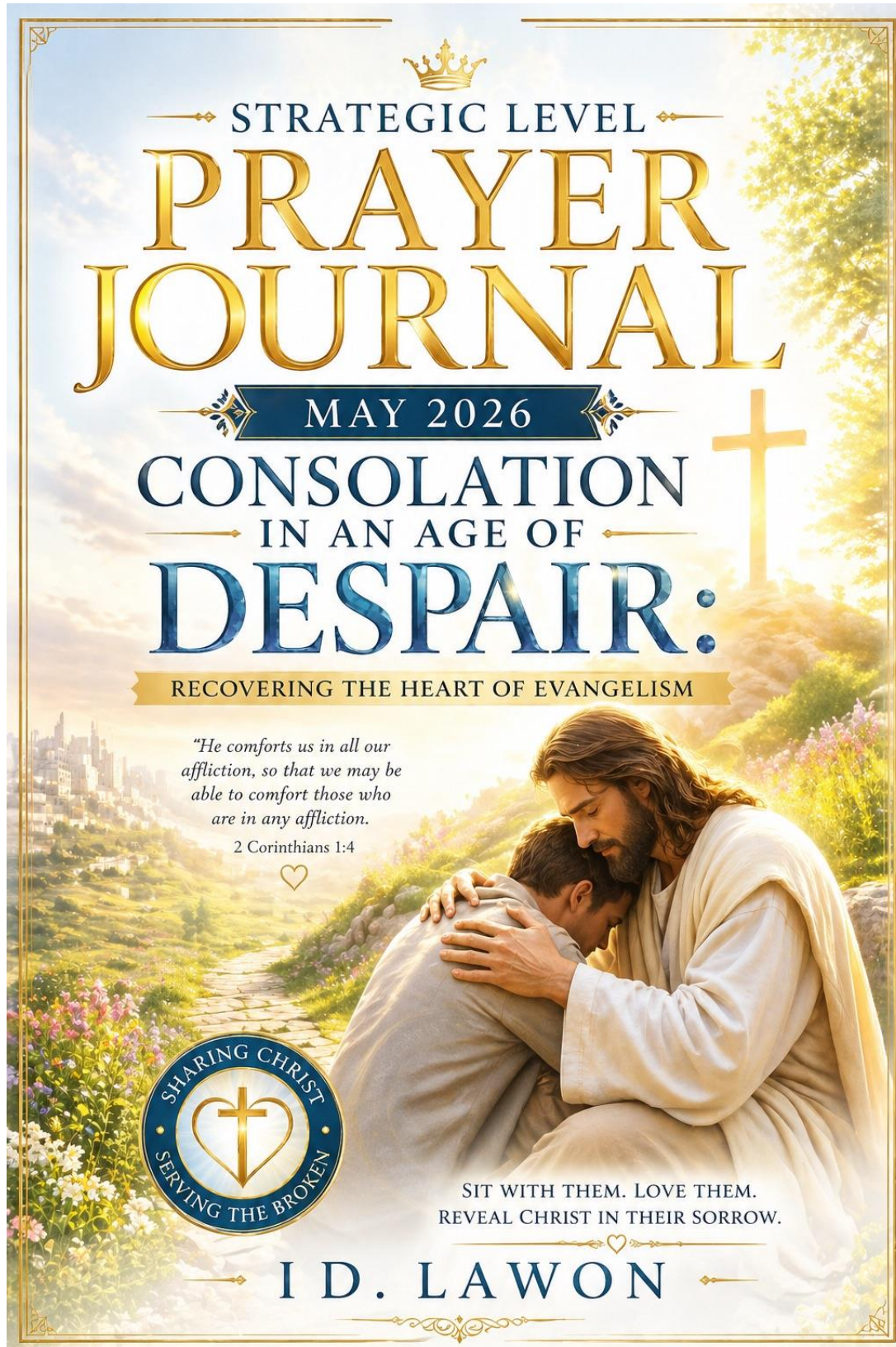

May the Lord grant you understanding of this prayer journal as you pray, consequent upon which there will be changes in your life or your prayer group or Family, Church, Nation, and Continent. What is presented are not Jewish Dates or the Jewish calendar but what the LORD instituted which we all see manifested in the movement of the Moon every month. The enemy has always manipulated these bodies for which believers are just becoming aware. This season is also a special edition of revelation which brings a new breath of fresh air without adding to the word of God but confirms it and makes our faith stronger.

**You may wish to pray in two ways:-**

1. You can pray using the whole journal to pray into the womb of time according to the authority level granted to you by your appointment in the Lord. Expect the prophetic germination [as you saturate the ground and the womb of time with God's ordination] to happen. In any case ensure your seed remains in the ground as investment for the coming year. Determine, and command what this month should deliver to you and what it should not and must Not.
2. You can also use this daily for your prayers AND DEVOTION to prevail at the gate of each day, especially on critical days of intense warfare in the heavens. Remember that the day starts from 6pm for the next 24 hours. If you are in Britain for instance the time will be early hours of the next day in Hong Kong @ your 6pm.
3. This document may seem lengthy, but it shows the effort that was generated in prayer. You can keep it and save it for use in a good way.

Pray that your prophetic faculties will be on the rise and be enlarged and sharp...visions; dreams; interpreting symbols; applying parables; riddles; revelation and predictions; accurate delivery of words of wisdom and words of knowledge; intercessions; interaction with heaven etc.. Divine decrees to cause the future and many other such faculties

## **SHAPE YOUR DAY, MONTH AND CONSEQUENTLY YOUR YEARS**

Ignorance of what every month holds for you, your family, community, nation, the church and the continent at large has caused many to perish, miss out or not fully access what God has in store for them.

Understanding the heavens and what they signify every month is another very key aspect as we enter this new level of our assignments among the nations. While the kingdom of darkness has used astrology, prognostications, and all manner of demonic methods to control the

activities on earth using the heavens, the church continues in ignorance. They have even employed materialism to blind believers in Jesus Christ, whereas *all things are yours*

We thank God for the many people whom He is raising in different parts of the world to understand what the heavens hold for us every month. As you seek deeper understanding, the Holy Spirit will guide you into greater revelations. Amen

## **CONSOLATION IN AN AGE OF DESPAIR: *Recovering the Heart of Evangelism***

In every generation, the people of God are called to discern the true condition of the human soul. Our age is loud with promises—success, happiness, fulfilment—yet beneath the surface lies a quieter, more honest reality: despair. Anxiety, loneliness, spiritual numbness, and exhaustion define much of modern life. It is into this condition that the gospel speaks—not first as correction, not primarily as instruction, but as **consolation**.

This article explores consolation as a central biblical and theological theme, drawing from Scripture, church history, and insights from Andrew Root. We will examine how consolation shapes evangelism, how it appears in prophetic ministry, and how it becomes a powerful tool for reaching the lost in both ancient and contemporary contexts.

### **1. Barnabas: The Son of Consolation (*Acts Model of Evangelism*)**

The early church did not grow primarily through strategy—it expanded through Spirit-filled people embodying the presence of Christ. One of the clearest examples is Barnabas.

*“And Joses, who was also named Barnabas by the apostles (which is translated Son of Encouragement/Consolation), a Levite of the country of Cyprus...”* (Acts 4:36)

The name *Barnabas* literally means “**son of consolation**” or encouragement. This was not merely a personality trait—it was a ministry identity.

#### **Barnabas as a Bridge Builder**

In Acts 9:26–27, when Saul (later Paul) attempted to join the disciples, they were afraid. His past as a persecutor made him untrustworthy. It was Barnabas who stepped into that tension:

*“But Barnabas took him and brought him to the apostles...”*

Barnabas **entered fear and suspicion with consolation**, not judgment. His act did more than comfort Saul—it **unlocked apostolic destiny**.

#### **Barnabas and the Expansion to the Gentiles**

In Acts 11:22–24, Barnabas is sent to Antioch:

*“When he came and had seen the grace of God, he was glad, and encouraged them all...”*

Notice the pattern:

- He *sees* grace
- He *rejoices*
- He *encourages* (*consoles*)

The result?

*“And a great many people were added to the Lord.”*

Evangelism flowed through consolation. People were not coerced—they were **welcomed into grace through presence**.

## Key Insight

Barnabas shows us that **consolation is not passive comfort—it is catalytic ministry**. It builds trust, restores identity, and opens doors for the gospel.

## 2. Prophecy as Consolation

In many circles, prophecy is associated with revelation, direction, or correction. Yet Scripture defines its primary function differently:

*“But the one who prophesies speaks to people for their upbuilding and encouragement and consolation.”* (1 Corinthians 14:3)

The Greek word used here (*paraklesis*) carries the meaning of:

- Comfort
- Encouragement
- Consolation
- Coming alongside

## The Prophetic Ministry of Consolation

Prophecy, at its core, is not about impressing people with spiritual insight—it is about **ministering God’s nearness in moments of despair**.

Consider Isaiah 40:1:

*“Comfort, yes, comfort My people!” says your God.*

Before correction comes comfort. Before instruction comes presence.

## Jesus as the Fulfilment of Consolation

Jesus Himself embodies this prophetic consolation:

*“The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me... He has sent Me to heal the broken-hearted...”* (Luke 4:18)

He does not begin with demands—He begins with healing.

## **Implication for Ministry**

True prophetic ministry:

- Speaks into pain
- Reveals God’s nearness
- Restores hope without denying reality

Prophecy becomes evangelistic when it **touches the hidden wounds of the heart.**

## **3. Consolation Through the Lens of Andrew Root**

Andrew Root argues that we are living in what he calls an **“age of despair.”** Contrary to popular belief, modern culture has not solved the human condition—it has intensified it.

### **The Crisis of Happiness**

Root identifies a critical problem:

- Society idolizes happiness
- People feel pressure to appear fulfilled
- Yet internally, they experience emptiness

This produces:

- Anxiety
- Loneliness
- Exhaustion

### **The Shift in Evangelism**

Root challenges traditional evangelism models:

- Not persuasion
- Not marketing
- Not numerical growth strategies

Instead:

**Evangelism is consolation in a world of despair.**

## **The Theology of Presence**

Root emphasizes that Christ is revealed not in triumphalism but in suffering:

- God meets us in sorrow
- The cross is the central revelation of God
- Ministry must enter pain, not avoid it

## **Key Takeaway**

Evangelism fails when it ignores despair.

Evangelism flourishes when it **walks with people in their suffering.**

## **4. Consolation as the Core of Evangelism**

Modern evangelism often feels ineffective because it answers questions people are no longer asking. Many are not asking, “How do I get to heaven?” They are asking:

- “Why do I feel so empty?”
- “Why am I so tired?”
- “Does anyone see my pain?”

## **Biblical Model of Evangelism**

2 Corinthians 1:3–4 gives a powerful framework:

*“The Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those...”*

This reveals a divine pattern:

1. We receive comfort from God
2. We become carriers of that comfort
3. Others encounter God through us

## **Evangelism Reframed**

Evangelism becomes:

- Not convincing → but accompanying
- Not arguing → but listening
- Not presenting solutions → but embodying presence

## **Jesus and the Woman at the Well (John 4)**

Jesus does not begin with doctrine—He begins with **engagement in her reality**:

- He acknowledges her thirst
- He speaks into her life gently
- He reveals Himself progressively

Her transformation leads to evangelism:

*“Come, see a Man...”*

She becomes a witness because she was first **seen and consoled**.

## **5. Biblical and Ancient Examples of Consolation**

### ***Job’s Friends (Negative Example)***

Initially, Job’s friends did something powerful:

*“They sat down with him on the ground seven days and seven nights... and no one spoke a word to him.”* (Job 2:13)

This was true consolation—**presence in silence**.

Their failure came when they began to explain and correct instead of comfort.

### ***David’s Psalms of Lament***

David models honest despair:

*“Why are you cast down, O my soul?”* (Psalm 42:5)

Yet within lament, consolation emerges:

- God is still present
- Hope is still possible

### ***Jesus Weeping (John 11:35)***

Jesus knew He would raise Lazarus, yet He wept.

Why?

Because **consolation honors present pain even when future hope exists**.

### ***Early Church Fathers***

Figures like Gregory of Nyssa and Macrina emphasized:

- Walking with the grieving
- Understanding suffering as a place of divine encounter

Martin Luther later described God as one who meets us in “**the theology of the cross**”—not glory alone, but suffering.

## **6. Consolation in Ancient and Contemporary Evangelism**

### **Ancient Church**

The early Christians gained influence not through power but through presence:

- Caring for the sick during plagues
- Remaining when others fled
- Offering dignity to the marginalized

Their consolation **revealed Christ more loudly than words.**

### **Modern Examples**

In contemporary settings, consolation-driven evangelism looks like:

#### **1. Presence in Crisis**

- Sitting with someone grieving
- Showing up without agenda

#### **2. Listening Without Fixing**

- Allowing people to express pain
- Resisting the urge to correct quickly

#### **3. Consistent Relationship**

- Staying over time
- Building trust through reliability

### **Real Impact**

People are drawn to faith not by argument alone, but by encountering:

- Peace in someone’s presence
- Compassion that feels supernatural

- Hope that does not deny reality

## 7. Consolation as a Strategy for Outreach

If consolation is central to evangelism, then outreach must be reimagined.

### Practical Actions

#### 1. Become Present

*“Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.”* (Romans 12:15)

- Sit with someone in pain
- Be emotionally available

#### 2. Practice Deep Listening

James 1:19:

*“Be swift to hear, slow to speak...”*

- Ask questions
- Listen without interrupting
- Validate feelings

#### 3. Remove Agenda

People sense when they are projects.

True consolation says:

- “I am here for you”
- Not “I am here to fix you”

#### 4. Speak Life Gently

When the moment comes:

- Share truth with compassion
- Offer hope rooted in Christ

#### 5. Stay Consistent

Consolation is not a moment—it is a **ministry of presence over time**.

## 8. The Power of Consolation in Winning the Lost

The deepest human longing is not just for answers—it is for **presence**.

When someone encounters:

- Unconditional care
- Genuine compassion
- Consistent presence

They begin to ask:

- “Why are you like this?”
- “Where does this peace come from?”

This opens the door for the gospel.

### Embodied Gospel

John 1:14:

*“The Word became flesh and dwelt among us...”*

Jesus did not shout salvation from heaven—He **entered human suffering**.

Evangelism must do the same.

## Conclusion: Becoming Carriers of Consolation

We are living in a world that is tired of noise, arguments, and pressure. But it is deeply hungry for something else—**consolation**.

Barnabas shows us the model.

Prophecy confirms the calling.

Scripture grounds the practice.

And voices like Andrew Root remind us of the urgency.

### Final Charge

*“Comfort, yes, comfort My people...”* (Isaiah 40:1)

You are called to:

- Enter sorrow without fear
- Carry the presence of Christ
- Walk with the broken
- Reveal hope that does not pretend

## Declaration

- “I am a carrier of divine consolation.
- I enter despair with the presence of Christ.
- Through love, I reveal the gospel.”

When consolation becomes your lifestyle, evangelism stops being an effort—and becomes a **natural overflow of Christ within you.**

## Adopt-A-Missionary- A Missions’ Strategy

*...a strategy for loving the missionary family as well as the people groups, they serve*

Adopt-A-Missionary is a mission strategy that has gained momentum in missions over the years. What makes this strategy different is its focus. Historically, churches have focused on countries, and mission agencies have focused their attention on people groups. Adopt-A-Missionary focuses *on missionary families, or what we can call message bearers.*

For 5 years, my wife (of blessed memory) and I served as missionary representatives to the Kenyan peoples of East Africa. We divided the nation of Kenya into 6. Working with the missionary on ground we had a plan to evangelise the nation. We raised teams of two by two from Nigeria and travelled from Nigeria to the different regions of Kenya. We planted 6 churches throughout the country. In the last 29 years + the FMI missionary teams have been helped by God to open the gospel among 40 unreached people groups. Our FMC churches faithfully prayed and the missionaries that we served with, and the church has supported them financially.

In 1990 for example, we were relocated to Kano, Nigeria, Northwest, with two major tribes—the Kanawas and Magusawas. We were led of the Lord to pay more attention *to tribal missions in 1993, where the gospel has never been heard while maintaining a church base.* Thankfully, our churches have continued to pray for and support the mission’s effort with this strategic ministry.

## ADOPT-A-Missionary Defined

What then does it mean to Adopt-A-missionary? It means committing yourself as an individual, fellowship group, local congregation, denomination, or mission agency to pray for and commit resources to win souls, establish believers, administrate the work within a specific people group through a missionary family or families. This commitment is continued until the believers in that people group can reach the rest of their people without outside (cross-cultural) assistance.

*We are agents of God praying, giving, and serving to see an adopted family reach out to bring sinners into God's family. This is the true meaning of Adopting a missionary family. One day this will be accomplished, and every tribe, tongue, people, and nation will give glory to God around His throne (Rev. 5:9).*

## **Adopt a Missionary Family**

Fullstature Missions International is committed to the work of missions and has developed a ministry to bring into focus the Great Commission (Matt 28:19-20) set forth by Christ and to support missionary families need. We ask that your family prayerfully consider adopting a missionary family to be a blessing and to be blessed. After you have made an adoption, we encourage you can send your missionary family an email to share about your family and to ask them to share with you. The FMI becomes a bridge to help people you may never know or meet. You can reach out to the missionary during Holidays, birthdays, or anniversaries or just at any time. Commit to lift your missionary up in prayer. (Phil 6)

It is also our desire to support more missionaries through our ministry budget than we currently can do. The missionaries we support currently are under-supported. In other words, the support we grant is not adequate. In most cases, we are nearly able (with Naira) to provide what will keep body and soul together leaving projects in the field undone. This is where you pause and do something.

It is our goal to ensure that every Missionary, supported through, (what we call) the General Fund which includes the "Faith Promise Offering" (FPO), are missionaries we, as a ministry want to support.

The money these Missionaries receive is totally dependent on what is given by the individual or families who have adopted them.

**Example:** Missionary "Felix" may have two families in First Baptist Church which chose to adopt him. They do so for a combined support of \$200 per month, one for \$75 per month and one for \$125 per month. Should the family who chose to support Missionary "Felix" for \$125 per month be unable to do so for any reason, Missionary "Felix" would only receive \$75 for that month. There will be a "shortfall" and the family who was unable to give what they had purposed to give would not be contacted and asked, "Where is your contribution".

If you have a desire to support a Missionary, please feel free to fill out a "Adopt-A-Missionary Request Form" and return it to our ministry office.

## **Build a Relationship**

Develop a relationship with your adopted missionary family. Learn about their ministry and their ups and downs so that you know when to Praise God with them and when to lift them up in prayer. Being a missionary can have very hard times and there is great comfort when a missionary knows that God is always there and that there are people supporting them at every step.

## **Faith Promise**

In addition to your commitment to get to know and pray for your adopted missionary, you may consider supporting your missionary financially. Among some of the greatest difficulties that missionaries face is having their financial needs met. Missionaries typically spend a significant amount of time raising monies to support their ministries which in turn reduces the amount of time out in the field.





*Even if this is not your month of birth, pray into the day of your birth on a weekly basis (that is the weekday in which you were born). Take time at regular basis to be praying for yourself and prophesying over your own life. Speak into the foundations of your life and prophesy good things.*

Thank Him for your specific day of birth. Declare that day blessed.

- Thank Him that He ordained that you will be made manifest on earth on a specific day in that month at a specific hour and minute.
- Thank Him that He has a purpose for your life, and it will be fulfilled.
- Ask Jehovah to forgive you where you have for one reason or another, ignored or rejected to recognize your day of birth.
- Thank Jehovah for the day of your conception. (Psa 139:13)
- Thank Jehovah that when He thought of you, he already thought of your entire life. Thank Him that He did not leave anything to chance. (Isa 49:1)
- Thank Him that he knew exactly what your redemptive purpose was going to be. (Psa. 139:16)
- Pray that He will reveal the original you more and more as you enter another year of your life. (Psa 139:13-15)
- Pray that He will restore the heavenly label, and the heavenly name He gave you before you were conceived. (Jer 1:5).
- Speak into the foundations of your life and prophesy good things.
- Prophesy that you will live and not die prematurely in any area of your life. Your family will live, the work of your hand will live and grow from strength to strength. Deut. 33:6, Psa. 27:13, 118:17
- Prophesy and proclaim the blessing of Levi upon your life as a priest unto Jehovah (2 Pet 2:9, Deut 33:8-11)
- Prophesy and proclaim the blessing of Benjamin upon your life Deut. 33:12
- Prophesy the blessing of the wisdom of Issachar in every area of life. Wisdom to establish the work of your hands, your family, as you grow a year older 1 Chron 12:32, Deut.33:18b-19, Pro 24:3-4

#### Reflection on Scripture

Solomon had pleasure, wealth, achievement, and influence, yet he called it vanity. This exposes the lie that happiness is the highest goal. Anything outside God may excite the soul temporarily but cannot anchor it eternally.

#### Ancient Biblical Precedent

Solomon pursued pleasure, wisdom, building projects, wealth, and greatness, but still discovered emptiness without God.

**Testimony-** Many people receive what they prayed for—marriage, money, promotion, recognition—yet still feel empty. That emptiness becomes God’s invitation to deeper truth.

### Reflection on Scripture

God’s grace is not activated by pretending. His strength is perfected in weakness. When you admit your need, you make room for His power.

### Ancient Biblical Precedent

Paul pleaded for weakness to be removed, but God revealed grace instead. His limitation became the platform for divine strength.

### Testimony

Many believers became free when they stopped pretending and finally told God the truth: “I am tired. I am weak. I need You.”

## Strategic Prayers

- Jesus, I release the pressure to appear strong.

## Loneliness in a Loud World

**Scripture: Psalm 25:16**

### Reflection on Scripture

David cried out because he felt lonely and afflicted. Loneliness is not proof that God has abandoned you. It can become a sacred place where intimacy with God deepens.

### Ancient Biblical Precedent

David, Elijah, Jeremiah, and even Jesus experienced lonely seasons. Yet those seasons became places of encounter.

## Testimony

Some people found God most deeply when human voices became quiet and divine presence became real.

## Scriptures

- Psalm 25:16
- Psalm 27:10
- Isaiah 43:2

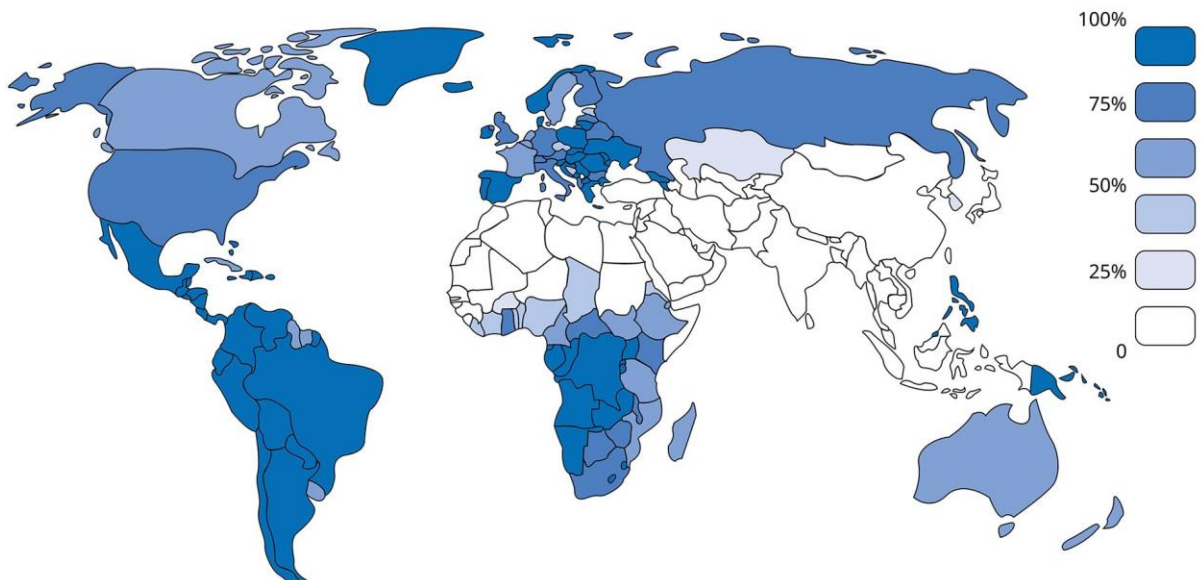
We must think deeply about making Jesus known. He has given us the Holy Spirit, the Bible and many preachers but we need to be trained in our minds on how to be effective for the Lord.

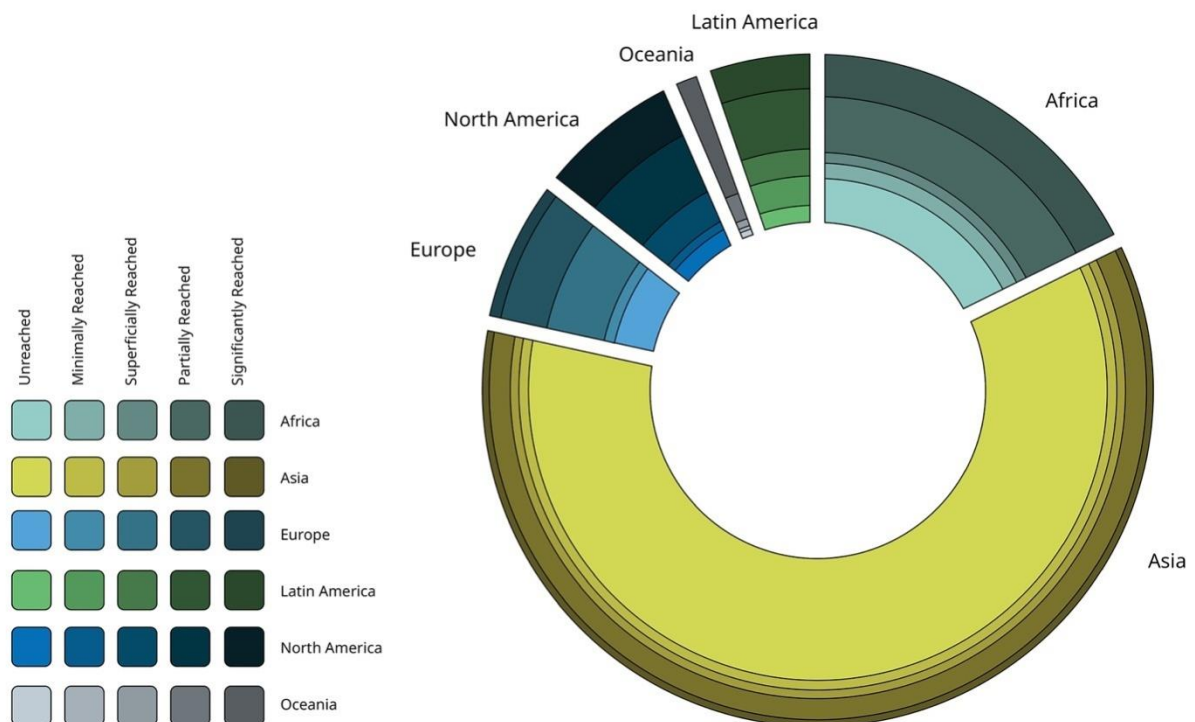

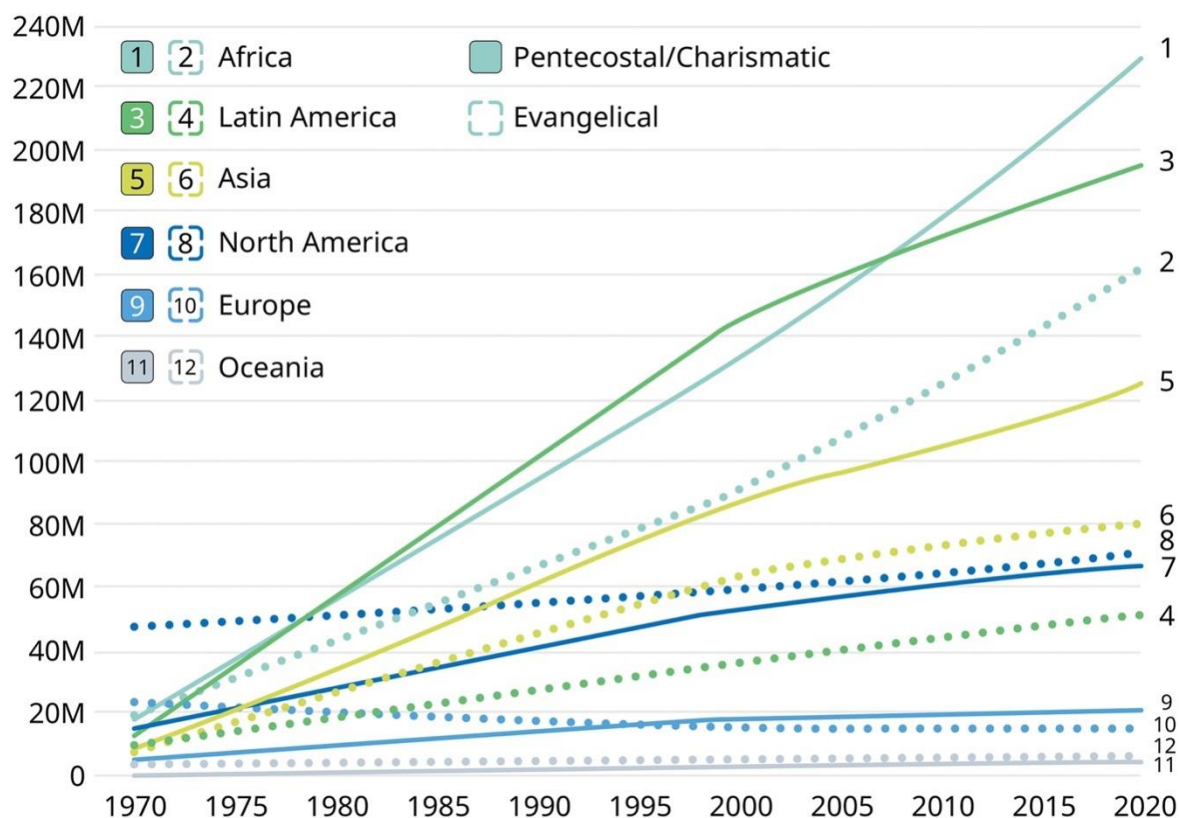
**Unreached People by Region- Source: The Joshua Project, 2023**

Unreached people groups are those who lack an indigenous church capable of evangelizing their own people. People groups are distinct social groups where shared language and cultural practices create communal belonging.

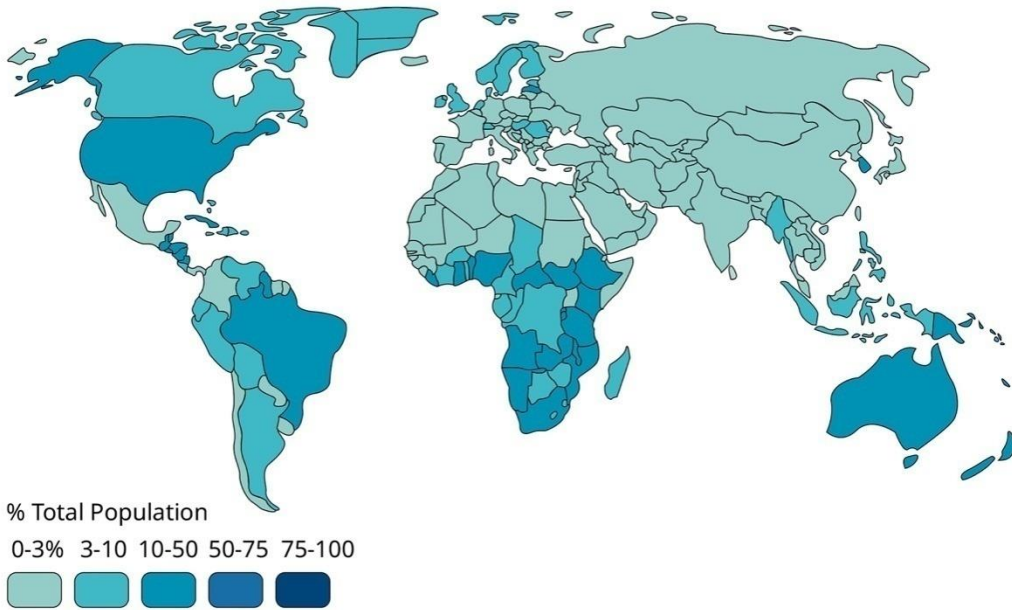
**Missionary Challenge**

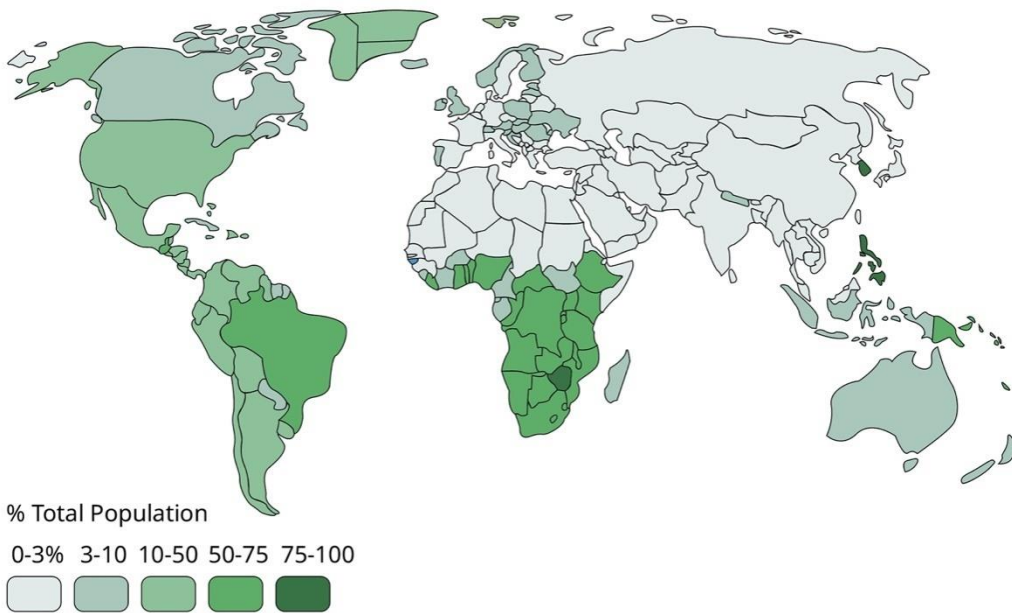
