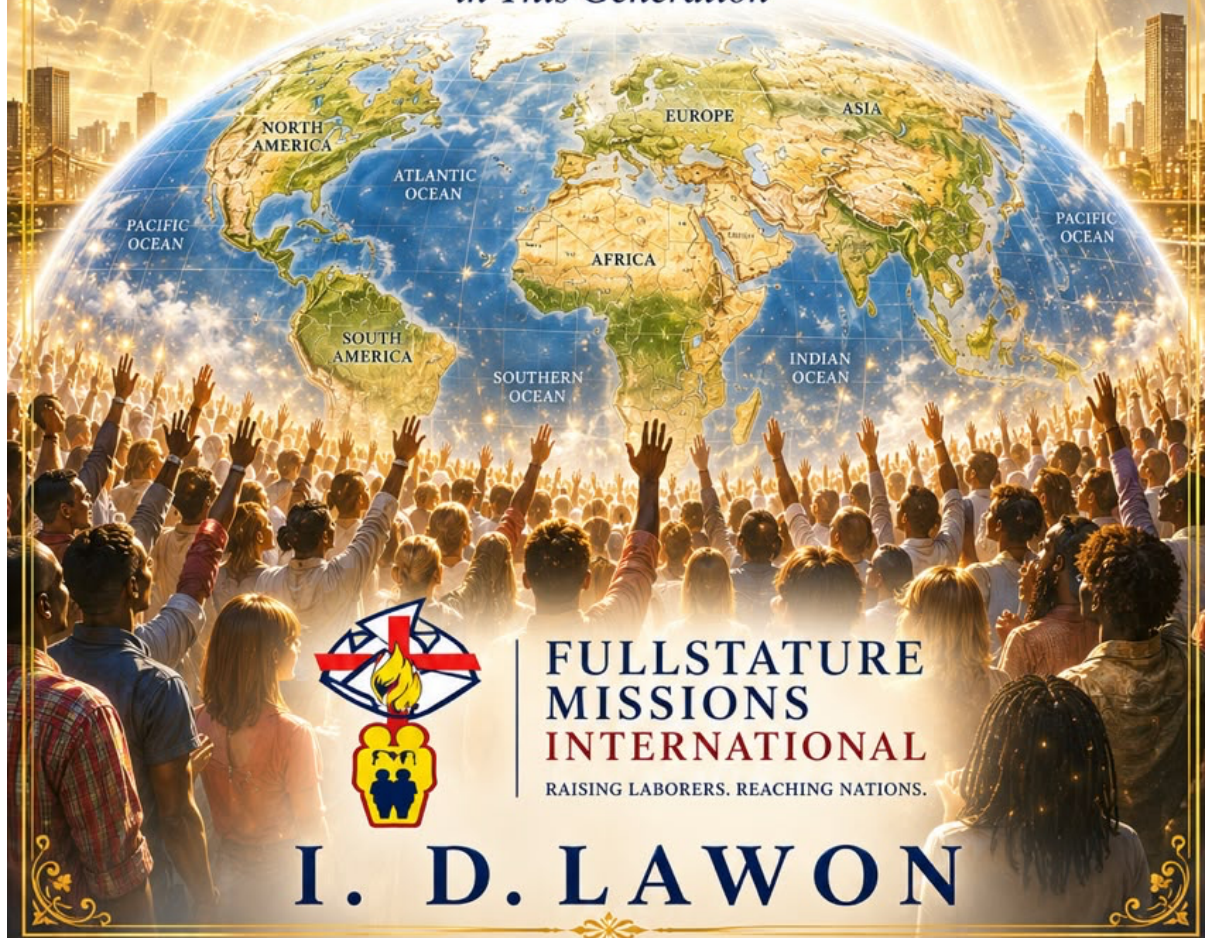

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May the Lord grant you understanding of this prayer journal as

you pray, consequent upon which there will be changes in your life or your prayer group or Family, Church, Nation, and Continent. What is presented are not Jewish Dates or the Jewish calendar but what the LORD instituted which we all see manifested in the movement of the Moon every month. The enemy has always manipulated these bodies for which believers are just becoming aware. This season is also a special edition of revelation which brings a new breath of fresh air without adding to the word of God but confirms it and makes our faith stronger.

You may wish to pray in two ways:-

1. You can pray using the whole journal to pray into the womb of time according to the authority level granted to you by your appointment in the Lord. Expect the prophetic germination [as you saturate the ground and the womb of time with God's ordination] to happen. In any case ensure your seed remains in the ground as investment for the coming year. Determine, and command what this month should deliver to you and what it should not and must Not.
2. You can also use this daily for your prayers AND DEVOTION to prevail at the gate of each day, especially on critical days of intense warfare in the heavens. Remember that the day starts from 6pm for the next 24 hours. If you are in Britain for instance the time will be early hours of the next day in Hong Kong @ your 6pm.
3. This document may seem lengthy, but it shows the effort that was generated in prayer. You can keep it and save it for use in a good way.

Pray that your prophetic faculties will be on the rise and be enlarged and sharp...visions; dreams; interpreting symbols; applying parables; riddles; revelation and predictions; accurate delivery of words of wisdom and words of knowledge; intercessions; interaction with heaven etc.. Divine decrees to cause the future and many other such faculties

SHAPE YOUR DAY, MONTH AND CONSEQUENTLY YOUR YEARS

Ignorance of what every month holds for you, your family, community, nation, the church and the continent at large has caused many to perish, miss out or not fully access what God has in store for them.

Understanding the heavens and what they signify every month is another very key aspect as we enter this new level of our assignments among the nations. While the kingdom of darkness

has used astrology, prognostications, and all manner of demonic methods to control the activities on earth using the heavens, the church continues in ignorance. They have even employed materialism to blind believers in Jesus Christ, whereas **all things are yours**

We thank God for the many people whom He is raising in different parts of the world to understand what the heavens hold for us every month. As you seek deeper understanding, the Holy Spirit will guide you into greater revelations. Amen

ADVANCING GOD’S KINGDOM

A Prophetic Call to the Church in This Generation

“Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.” — *Matthew 6:10*

“And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come.” — *Matthew 24:14*

Introduction

The greatest need of our generation is not merely another conference, another church program, another political solution, or another technological breakthrough. Our greatest need is the manifestation of the Kingdom of God.

Throughout history, whenever God has desired to transform nations, He has never begun with governments. He has begun with people. He has sought men and women whose hearts were fully yielded to Him, who would become channels through which His authority, righteousness, power, and compassion could flow into the earth.

The history of redemption is the history of God’s Kingdom advancing against the kingdom of darkness.

From the Garden of Eden to the Cross, from Pentecost to the present hour, God has been progressively establishing His Kingdom among men.

Every generation has had its defining assignment.

Moses confronted Egypt.

Joshua possessed the land.

David established righteous government.

Elijah confronted national apostasy.

Nehemiah rebuilt broken walls.

The apostles carried the Gospel across the known world.

The Reformers restored biblical truth.

The great missionary movements carried Christ to the nations.

Now another generation stands before heaven.

The question is not whether God still desires to advance His Kingdom.

The question is whether the Church will arise to cooperate with the purposes of the King.

This month, as thousands of believers unite in strategic prayer across many nations, heaven again issues its timeless invitation:

Advance My Kingdom

Not your kingdom.

Not your ministry.

Not your denomination.

Not your reputation.

My Kingdom.

Nothing else ultimately matters.

The Kingdom Has Always Been God's Central Purpose

Many believers understand salvation, healing, prosperity, deliverance, and spiritual gifts.

Yet Jesus Himself rarely preached these as ends in themselves.

His primary message was always the Kingdom.

His first recorded sermon declared:

“Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.” (Matthew 4:17)

His miracles demonstrated the Kingdom.

His teachings explained the Kingdom.

His parables illustrated the Kingdom.

His disciples were commanded to proclaim the Kingdom.

Even after His resurrection, Scripture says He continued speaking to them concerning “the things pertaining to the kingdom of God” (Acts 1:3).

The Kingdom is therefore not one doctrine among many.

It is the central theme that unites the whole Bible.

Genesis introduces the King.

The Gospels reveal the King.

Acts proclaims the King.

The Epistles establish Kingdom citizens.

Revelation reveals the everlasting reign of the King.

History itself is moving toward one glorious conclusion:

“The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of His Christ.”
(Revelation 11:15)

Everything God is doing today must be understood through this Kingdom perspective.

What Does It Mean to Advance God’s Kingdom?

Advancing God’s Kingdom does not mean expanding a religious organization.

It is not building larger church buildings.

It is not increasing denominational influence.

It is not promoting personalities.

The Kingdom advances wherever the rule of Christ replaces the rule of sin.

Where hatred gives way to love.

Where darkness gives way to light.

Where truth overcomes deception.

Where justice replaces oppression.

Where Christ is enthroned in human hearts.

Every soul saved is Kingdom advancement.

Every church planted is Kingdom advancement.

Every disciple equipped is Kingdom advancement.

Every missionary sent is Kingdom advancement.

Every family restored is Kingdom advancement.

Every act of compassion performed in Christ's name is Kingdom advancement.

Every community transformed by the Gospel is Kingdom advancement.

The Kingdom advances one surrendered life at a time until entire nations begin to experience the influence of God's righteousness.

The Kingdom Begins Within Before It Transforms Without

Jesus declared,

“The kingdom of God is within you.” (Luke 17:21)

Before God changes cities, He changes hearts.

Before He reforms nations, He reforms character.

Before He entrusts public influence, He develops private holiness.

Many desire Kingdom power without Kingdom character.

Yet throughout Scripture, God consistently prepares the vessel before enlarging the assignment.

Joseph endured years of preparation before governing Egypt.

Moses spent forty years in the wilderness before leading Israel.

David was anointed long before he was enthroned.

Paul disappeared into Arabia before shaking the Roman Empire.

God is never in a hurry to promote those whose character cannot sustain their calling.

Kingdom advancement therefore begins in the secret place.

Private prayer.

Private repentance.

Private obedience.

Private worship.

Private surrender.

Revival always begins before anyone notices it.

Long before nations are awakened, God has been quietly preparing men and women whose hearts belong completely to Him.

The Church Was Born to Advance the Kingdom

Jesus never intended His Church merely to survive history.

He intended her to shape history.

He declared:

“I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.”

Notice that gates are defensive.

The Church is not called to hide behind walls while darkness advances.

The Church is commissioned to move forward.

Every generation that forgot this became occupied with preserving traditions instead of advancing God’s purposes.

Church history demonstrates that whenever believers became consumed with comfort, the missionary passion declined.

But whenever believers rediscovered God’s heart for the nations, revival soon followed.

The Moravians prayed continuously for decades and sent missionaries across continents.

William Carey challenged the Church to “expect great things from God; attempt great things for God.”

Hudson Taylor crossed cultures to take the Gospel inland in China.

Countless African, Asian, Latin American, and Indigenous evangelists carried the Gospel into communities often overlooked by larger mission movements.

The advance of God's Kingdom has always depended on ordinary believers who believed an extraordinary God.

The Kingdom Advances Through Prayer

No spiritual awakening has ever occurred without prayer.

Prayer is not preparation for Kingdom work.

Prayer is Kingdom work.

Prayer changes the spiritual atmosphere.

Prayer releases labourers.

Prayer opens closed nations.

Prayer weakens demonic resistance.

Prayer strengthens weary missionaries.

Prayer prepares unreached peoples.

Prayer changes governments.

Prayer changes churches.

Prayer changes families.

Prayer changes us.

Throughout Scripture we repeatedly see that before great divine interventions, there was prevailing prayer.

The Upper Room preceded Pentecost.

Elijah prayed before rain returned.

Daniel prayed before prophetic revelation unfolded.

The early Church prayed before prison doors opened.

Prayer aligns earth with heaven.

Every believer who kneels sincerely before God participates in advancing His Kingdom.

The Kingdom Must Reach Every Nation

God's vision has always been global.

When He called Abraham, He promised that **all families of the earth** would be blessed.

The Psalms repeatedly summon all nations to praise the Lord.

Isaiah foresaw the nations streaming to God's light.

Jesus commanded His followers to make disciples of all nations.

The Book of Revelation reveals worshippers gathered from every tribe, language, people, and nation.

This is not merely a missionary slogan.

It is God's eternal purpose.

Millions still have little or no meaningful opportunity to hear the Gospel.

Many languages still need Scripture translation.

Many communities still await faithful Christian witness.

This reality should not discourage us.

It should move us to prayer, generosity, wise strategy, and joyful obedience.

Every believer can participate.

Some will go.

Some will send.

Some will teach.

Some will translate.

Some will give.

Some will pray.

Some will encourage.

Everyone has a place in God's mission.

Advancing the Kingdom in Everyday Life

Kingdom advancement is not reserved for missionaries or pastors.

It belongs to every disciple.

Teachers advance the Kingdom by shaping lives with integrity.

Doctors and nurses advance the Kingdom by serving with compassion.

Business leaders advance the Kingdom through honesty and generosity.

Parents advance the Kingdom by discipling their children.

Students advance the Kingdom through courageous witness.

Government officials advance the Kingdom by pursuing justice.

Farmers, artisans, engineers, scientists, media professionals, and labourers all become Kingdom ambassadors when they dedicate their work to the glory of Christ.

There is no secular-sacred divide in God's economy.

Adopt-A-Missionary- A Missions’ Strategy

...a strategy for loving the missionary family as well as the people groups, they serve

Adopt-A-Missionary is a mission strategy that has gained momentum in missions over the years. What makes this strategy different is its focus. Historically, churches have focused on countries, and mission agencies have focused their attention on people groups. Adopt-A-Missionary focuses *on missionary families, or what we can call message bearers*.

For 5 years, my wife (of blessed memory) and I served as missionary representatives to the Kenyan peoples of East Africa. We divided the nation of Kenya into 6. Working with the missionary on ground we had a plan to evangelise the nation. We raised teams of two by two from Nigeria and travelled from Nigeria to the different regions of Kenya. We planted 6 churches throughout the country. In the last 29 years + the FMI missionary teams have been helped by God to open the gospel among 40 unreached people groups. Our FMC churches

faithfully prayed and the missionaries that we served with, and the church has supported them financially.

In 1990 for example, we were relocated to Kano, Nigeria, Northwest, with two major tribes—the Kanawas and Magusawas. We were led of the Lord to pay more attention to ***tribal missions in 1993, where the gospel has never been heard while maintaining a church base.*** Thankfully, our churches have continued to pray for and support the mission’s effort with this strategic ministry.

ADOPT-A-Missionary Defined

What then does it mean to Adopt-A-missionary? It means committing yourself as an individual, fellowship group, local congregation, denomination, or mission agency to pray for and commit resources to win souls, establish believers, administrate the work within a specific people group through a missionary family or families. This commitment is continued until the believers in that people group can reach the rest of their people without outside (cross-cultural) assistance.

We are agents of God praying, giving, and serving to see an adopted family reach out to bring sinners into God’s family. This is the true meaning of Adopting a missionary family. One day this will be accomplished, and every tribe, tongue, people, and nation will give glory to God around His throne (Rev. 5:9).

Adopt a Missionary Family

Fullstature Missions International is committed to the work of missions and has developed a ministry to bring into focus the Great Commission (Matt 28:19-20) set forth by Christ and to support missionary families need. We ask that your family prayerfully consider adopting a missionary family to be a blessing and to be blessed. After you have made an adoption, we encourage you can send your missionary family an email to share about your family and to ask them to share with you. The FMI becomes a bridge to help people you may never know or meet. You can reach out to the missionary during Holidays, birthdays, or anniversaries or just at any time. Commit to lift your missionary up in prayer. (Phil 6)

It is also our desire to support more missionaries through our ministry budget than we currently can do. The missionaries we support currently are under-supported. In other words, the support we grant is not adequate. In most cases, we are nearly able (with Naira) to provide what will keep body and soul together leaving projects in the field undone. This is where you pause and do something.

It is our goal to ensure that every Missionary, supported through, (what we call) the General Fund which includes the “Faith Promise Offering” (FPO), are missionaries we, as a ministry want to support.

The money these Missionaries receive is totally dependent on what is given by the individual or families who have adopted them.

Example: Missionary “Felix” may have two families in First Baptist Church which chose to adopt him. They do so for a combined support of \$200 per month, one for \$75 per month and one for \$125 per month. Should the family who chose to support Missionary “Felix” for \$125

per month be unable to do so for any reason, Missionary “Felix” would only receive \$75 for that month. There will be a “shortfall” and the family who was unable to give what they had purposed to give would not be contacted and asked, “Where is your contribution”.

If you have a desire to support a Missionary, please feel free to fill out a “Adopt-A-Missionary Request Form” and return it to our ministry office.

Build a Relationship

Develop a relationship with your adopted missionary family. Learn about their ministry and their ups and downs so that you know when to Praise God with them and when to lift them up in prayer. Being a missionary can have very hard times and there is great comfort when a missionary knows that God is always there and that there are people supporting them at every step.

Faith Promise

In addition to your commitment to get to know and pray for your adopted missionary, you may consider supporting your missionary financially. Among some of the greatest difficulties that missionaries face is having their financial needs met. Missionaries typically spend a significant amount of time raising monies to support their ministries which in turn reduces the amount of time out in the field.

IS THIS THE MONTH OF YOUR BIRTH? USE REVELATION KNOWLEDGE WELL (AND AGAIN)!!

Even if this is not your month of birth, pray into the day of your birth on a weekly basis (that is the weekday in which you were born). Take time at regular basis to be praying for yourself and prophesying over your own life. Speak into the foundations of your life and prophesy good things.

Thank Him for your specific day of birth. Declare that day blessed.

- Thank Him that He ordained that you will be made manifest on earth on a specific day in that month at a specific hour and minute.
- Thank Him that He has a purpose for your life, and it will be fulfilled.
- Ask Jehovah to forgive you where you have for one reason or another, ignored or rejected to recognize your day of birth.
- Thank Jehovah for the day of your conception. (Psa 139:13)
- Thank Jehovah that when He thought of you, he already thought of your entire life. Thank Him that He did not leave anything to chance. (Isa 49:1)
- Thank Him that he knew exactly what your redemptive purpose was going to be. (Psa. 139:16)
- Pray that He will reveal the original you more and more as you enter another year of your life. (Psa 139:13-15)
- Pray that He will restore the heavenly label, and the heavenly name He gave you before you were conceived. (Jer 1:5).
- Speak into the foundations of your life and prophesy good things.
- Prophesy that you will live and not die prematurely in any area of your life. Your family will live, the work of your hand will live and grow from strength to strength. Deut. 33:6, Psa. 27:13, 118:17
- Prophesy and proclaim the blessing of Levi upon your life as a priest unto Jehovah (2 Pet 2:9, Deut 33:8-11)
- Prophesy and proclaim the blessing of Benjamin upon your life Deut. 33:12

- Prophecy the blessing of the wisdom of Issachar in every area of life. Wisdom to establish the work of your hands, your family, as you grow a year older 1 Chron 12:32, Deut.33:18b-19, Pro 24:3-4
- Prophecy the blessing of Dan concerning your role as a leader. Prophecy over your inheritance that Jehovah will indeed ensure you leave an inheritance for your descendants. Deut 33:20-21, Psa 16:5-6.
- Prophecy the blessing of Joseph. Speak to the earth and declare that the earth will bring forth its best for you in this New Year. Prophecy to the heavens to declare the glory of Jehovah over your life every day of this New Year. Deut 33:13-17, Lev 26:4-5, Hos 2:21-22, Psalm 19:1-2, Isa 55:12 • Prophecy that you will grow in your spirit man into a matured son so you can receive your inheritance. Wherever you go in this New Year, creation will experience release from frustration. Rom 8:19-20, Gal 4:1-2
- Praise Jehovah that your birthday marks the entry into another season of Jubilee. Thank Jehovah that immediately you were born, you cried out prophetically blowing your own jubilee cornet, and prophetically rejoiced in yourself. Ask Him to give you joy no matter your circumstance, to rejoice on this day. Amen.

Day 1 — Seek First the Kingdom

Key Scripture

Matthew 6:33

“But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.”

Kingdom Insight

The first command Jesus gave concerning the priorities of life was not to seek prosperity, influence, success, or even ministry. He commanded His disciples to **seek first the Kingdom of God**. This is the foundation upon which every other blessing rests.

The Kingdom of God is more than a future destination; it is the present reign and rule of God in the hearts of those who willingly submit to Him. Wherever Christ is acknowledged as King, His Kingdom is manifested. His righteousness shapes our character, His peace governs our relationships, and His joy strengthens our daily walk (Romans 14:17).

Human nature naturally seeks personal security, recognition, comfort, and achievement. Yet Jesus reversed the world’s order. Instead of pursuing earthly gain first and hoping to fit God into our schedule, believers are called to make His Kingdom their supreme pursuit. When God occupies first place, every other area of life comes into proper alignment.

Seeking the Kingdom involves surrendering our ambitions to God’s purposes. It means asking not merely, “What do I want?” but “What does the King desire?” Kingdom-minded believers view their careers, finances, families, ministries, and talents as sacred trusts to be used for God’s glory.

The Kingdom also advances through obedience. Every act of forgiveness, every soul won to Christ, every disciple nurtured, every missionary supported, and every prayer offered for the nations extends the influence of God’s reign upon the earth.

Today the Church desperately needs believers whose highest passion is not building personal kingdoms but advancing Christ’s eternal Kingdom. Such disciples become instruments through whom revival spreads, communities are transformed, and nations encounter the Lord.

As we begin this month of prayer, let us once again enthrone Christ above every competing affection. Let His Kingdom become our greatest treasure, our daily pursuit, and our lifelong mission.

Biblical Example

King Solomon (1 Kings 3:5–14)

When God invited Solomon to ask for whatever he desired, Solomon chose wisdom to govern God's people rather than wealth or long life. Because he sought God's purposes before personal gain, the Lord added riches, honor, and influence beyond his request. Kingdom priorities always invite Kingdom provision.

Prophetic Reflection

The Holy Spirit is calling believers back to divine priorities. Many have been distracted by lesser pursuits, but God is restoring a generation that values His presence above possessions and His purposes above popularity. As hearts return to the King, revival will overflow into churches, cities, and nations.

15 Strategic Prayer Points

1. Father, establish Your Kingdom as the highest priority of my life.
2. Remove every idol competing for my devotion.
3. Give me a heart that delights in Your will.
4. Teach me to seek eternal values above temporary success.
5. Let righteousness govern every decision I make.
6. Fill me with fresh hunger for Your presence.
7. Deliver me from worldly distractions.
8. Let my family become a Kingdom-centered household.

Missions Focus

Sunday, August 2, 2026

Key Scripture

Psalm 24:7–10

“Who is this King of glory? The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord mighty in battle.”

Kingdom Insight

Every kingdom is defined by its king. Christianity is not merely a system of beliefs; it is joyful submission to the reign of Jesus Christ, the King of kings. His Kingdom advances wherever He is enthroned in willing hearts.

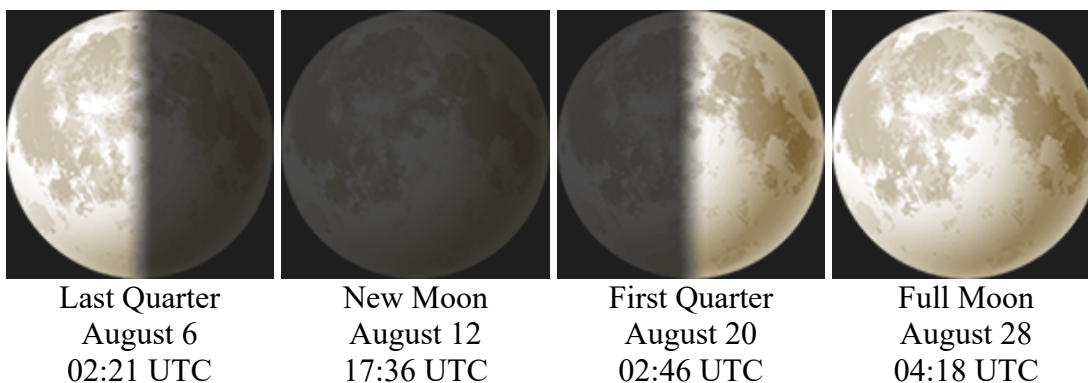

Philip the Evangelist (Acts 8:26–40)

Philip obeyed the Spirit's direction without hesitation. His willingness to leave a successful ministry and follow God's leading into the desert resulted in the conversion of the Ethiopian official and the spread of the Gospel into Africa.

Apostolic vision looks beyond local success to global obedience. It recognizes that billions still have little or no access to the Gospel and that every believer has a role in fulfilling the Great Commission—through praying, giving, going, welcoming, mobilizing, or discipling others.

Such vision requires sacrifice. Time, finances, comfort, and personal ambitions are willingly surrendered so that Christ may be known where He has not yet been named. History shows that every significant missionary movement has been sustained by churches that embraced apostolic vision.

God continues to raise leaders who think beyond buildings and programs. They ask how every ministry, every budget, every training initiative, and every disciple can contribute to Kingdom expansion. Apostolic vision transforms ordinary congregations into missionary communities.

Jesus never said the greatest problem was the size of the harvest. He declared that the greatest need was the shortage of laborers. Across the world, millions still live without access to the Gospel, while vast mission fields remain underserved. God's answer has always been the raising and sending of faithful workers.

A laborer is more than a preacher. Kingdom laborers include evangelists, church planters, Bible translators, teachers, intercessors, medical workers, business professionals, media specialists, youth mentors, and faithful believers who use their gifts to advance Christ's mission. Every member of the Body of Christ has a meaningful role.

Raising laborers begins in the local church. Children should be taught to love the nations. Young adults should be challenged to consider God's calling. Mature believers should mentor emerging leaders. Churches should intentionally identify, equip, commission, and support those whom God is sending.

The Lord still calls ordinary people. The disciples were fishermen, tax collectors, and common men before becoming world changers. Their effectiveness came not from extraordinary backgrounds but from wholehearted devotion to Christ and the empowering of the Holy Spirit.

We should also remember that laborers require ongoing encouragement. Missionaries face isolation, cultural challenges, spiritual opposition, and practical needs. As partners in the Gospel, the Church strengthens them through faithful prayer, generous giving, pastoral care, and regular encouragement.

Kingdom Insight

The Lord Jesus Christ has never intended that the work of His Kingdom should depend upon a few gifted individuals while the rest of the Church merely observes. His design is that every believer becomes equipped, matured, and released into fruitful ministry. To accomplish this, Christ has graciously given the Church the fivefold ministry: apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers.

These ministry gifts are not positions of superiority but functions of service. Apostles establish Kingdom foundations and pioneer new works. Prophets call God's people back to

His heart and declare His truth with courage. Evangelists proclaim Christ with passion, bringing sinners to salvation. Pastors shepherd, nurture, and protect God's people. Teachers ground believers in sound doctrine, enabling them to grow in maturity and discernment.

When these ministries function together in humility and mutual honor, the Church becomes balanced, healthy, and effective. One ministry should never diminish another, for each reflects a different aspect of Christ's own ministry. The ultimate goal is not the elevation of ministers but the equipping of every believer to participate in advancing God's Kingdom.

Unfortunately, many churches have become personality-driven rather than Christ-centered. Instead of developing disciples, they have become dependent upon a few leaders. Yet Scripture reveals that mature leadership continually releases others into ministry. Healthy leaders reproduce themselves, mentor younger believers, and rejoice when others flourish.

The Great Commission cannot be completed without an equipped Church. Every believer has been entrusted with gifts, opportunities, and responsibilities. The fivefold ministry exists to help each Christian discover and faithfully fulfill that divine assignment.

As we pray today, let us ask God to restore biblical leadership throughout His Church. May He raise humble servants who equip rather than control, who empower rather than dominate, and who point continually to Jesus Christ. Then the Body of Christ will grow in unity, maturity, and missionary effectiveness until the knowledge of the Lord fills the earth.

Biblical Example

Paul and Timothy (2 Timothy 2:1–2)

Paul intentionally invested in Timothy, equipping him to teach others who would continue the work. This pattern of multiplication remains God's model for leadership development.

Prophetic Reflection

The Lord is restoring servant leadership within His Church. He is raising leaders whose greatest joy is not gathering followers around themselves but releasing mature disciples who advance His Kingdom throughout the world.

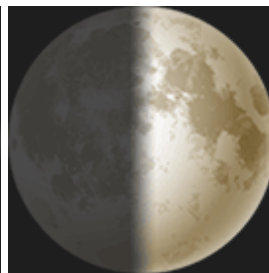

Kingdom Insight

Business professionals, educators, healthcare workers, students, retirees, artists, technicians, and homemakers all possess unique opportunities to display Christ's love and proclaim His Gospel.

God's Kingdom advances most effectively through united prayer, shared vision, and cooperative ministry.

Breaking Strongholds

Key Scripture

2 Corinthians 10:4–5

“For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds.”

Kingdom Insight

The advance of God's Kingdom involves spiritual conflict. Scripture reminds us that believers do not wrestle against flesh and blood but against spiritual forces of darkness (Ephesians 6:12). Yet we do not engage this conflict with fear, human aggression, or worldly methods. Our confidence rests entirely in the victory already secured through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

A stronghold is any pattern of thinking, belief, or influence that resists the truth of God. It may appear in individuals through fear, pride, deception, addiction, bitterness, unbelief, or persistent sin. It may also affect families, communities, and cultures where falsehood and injustice have become deeply rooted.

The Gospel is God's primary instrument for destroying strongholds. As people encounter Christ, hearts are transformed, minds are renewed, and lives are set free. Prayer, the proclamation of Scripture, obedience, worship, and holy living all become powerful means through which God advances His Kingdom.

We must remember that people themselves are never the enemy. Christ died for those who oppose Him, and our desire is always their redemption. Therefore, spiritual warfare is exercised with humility, truth, and love, never with hatred or personal vengeance.

Every believer has access to God's spiritual armor. Truth guards us against deception. Righteousness protects our hearts. Faith extinguishes the enemy's accusations. Salvation secures our hope. The Word of God exposes lies. Prayer keeps us dependent upon the Holy Spirit.

Today let us stand confidently in Christ's victory. May every stronghold of fear, unbelief, deception, and sin be replaced by the liberating truth of God's Word. As His light shines into dark places, lives, families, churches, and nations will experience genuine freedom.

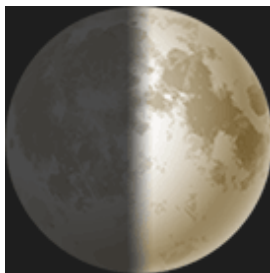

Kingdom Insight

Kingdom Compassion

Key Scripture

Matthew 9:36

"But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shepherd."

Kingdom Insight

One of the most beautiful characteristics of Jesus was His compassion. Again and again the Gospels tell us that He was "moved with compassion." His compassion was never superficial emotion; it produced action. He healed the sick, fed the hungry, comforted the brokenhearted, forgave sinners, welcomed the rejected, and proclaimed the Good News of the Kingdom.

Kingdom compassion reflects the very heart of God. It sees beyond appearances to recognize the dignity of every person as one created in God's image. Compassion refuses to ignore suffering. It listens before judging, serves without expecting recognition, and gives generously because it understands the immeasurable mercy God has shown us.

The Church has historically demonstrated this compassion by caring for widows, orphans, refugees, the poor, prisoners, the sick, and those affected by disasters. Such acts of mercy do not replace the proclamation of the Gospel; they beautifully accompany it. Compassion opens hearts while the Gospel transforms lives.

In today's world, countless people carry hidden burdens—loneliness, grief, anxiety, poverty, displacement, addiction, and hopelessness. Many appear outwardly successful while inwardly desperate. The Holy Spirit calls believers to become ambassadors of Christ's compassion through practical service, encouraging words, faithful presence, and fervent prayer.

True compassion also extends across cultures and national boundaries. God's love knows no race, language, or social status. The missionary movement itself is an expression of divine compassion, taking the hope of Christ to those who have never heard His name.

Today let us ask the Lord to soften our hearts. May He remove indifference, selfishness, and prejudice, replacing them with Christlike love. As His compassion flows through us, many will encounter not merely our kindness but the living Savior whose mercy changes lives forever.

Biblical Example

The Feeding of the Five Thousand (Matthew 14:13–21)

Jesus' compassion moved Him to teach the people and provide for their physical needs. His miracle revealed that God's Kingdom cares for the whole person.

Prophetic Reflection

The Lord is awakening a compassionate Church that will minister to both spiritual and physical needs. Through ordinary acts of love, many hearts will be opened to receive the Gospel.

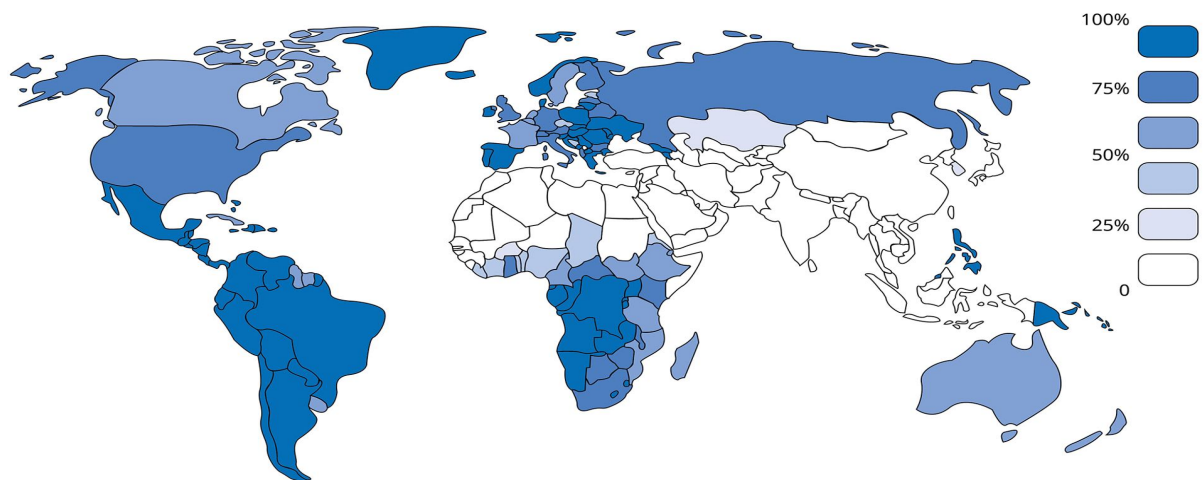
We must think deeply about making Jesus known. He has given us the Holy Spirit, the Bible and many preachers but we need to be trained in our minds on how to be effective for the Lord.

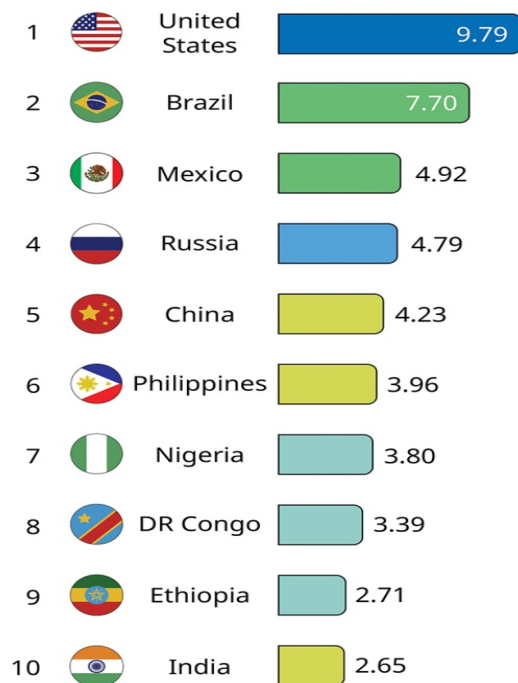
If you just show up in ministry, hearts full of love for God and eager to make big changes for His Kingdom, you will likely be back home early, burnt out and disappointed.

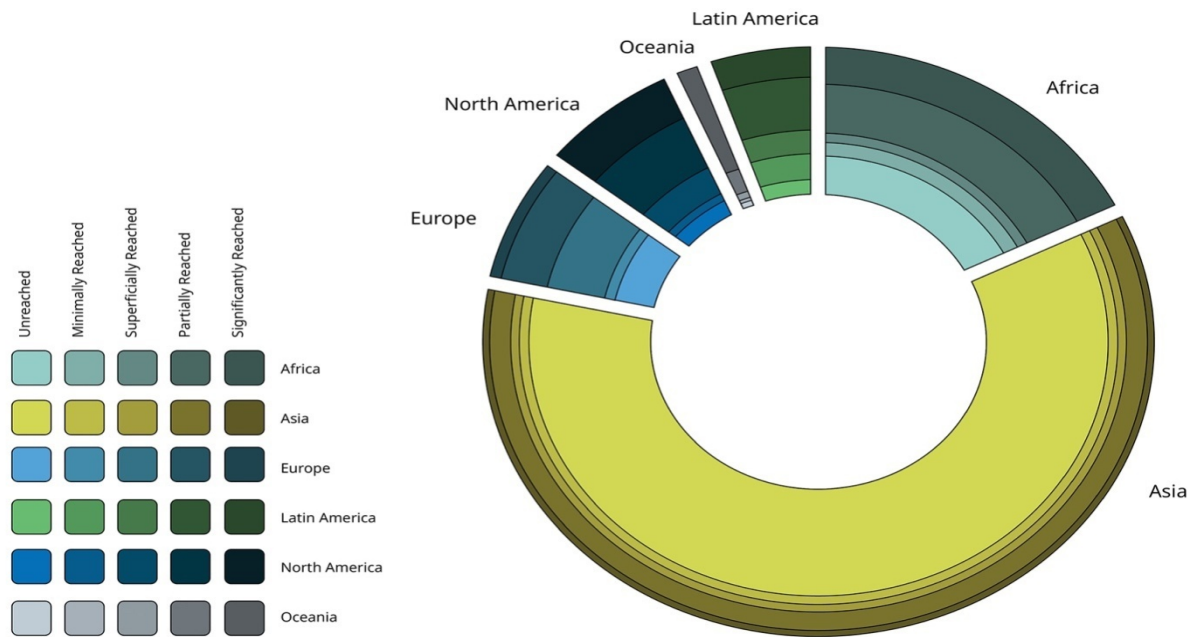

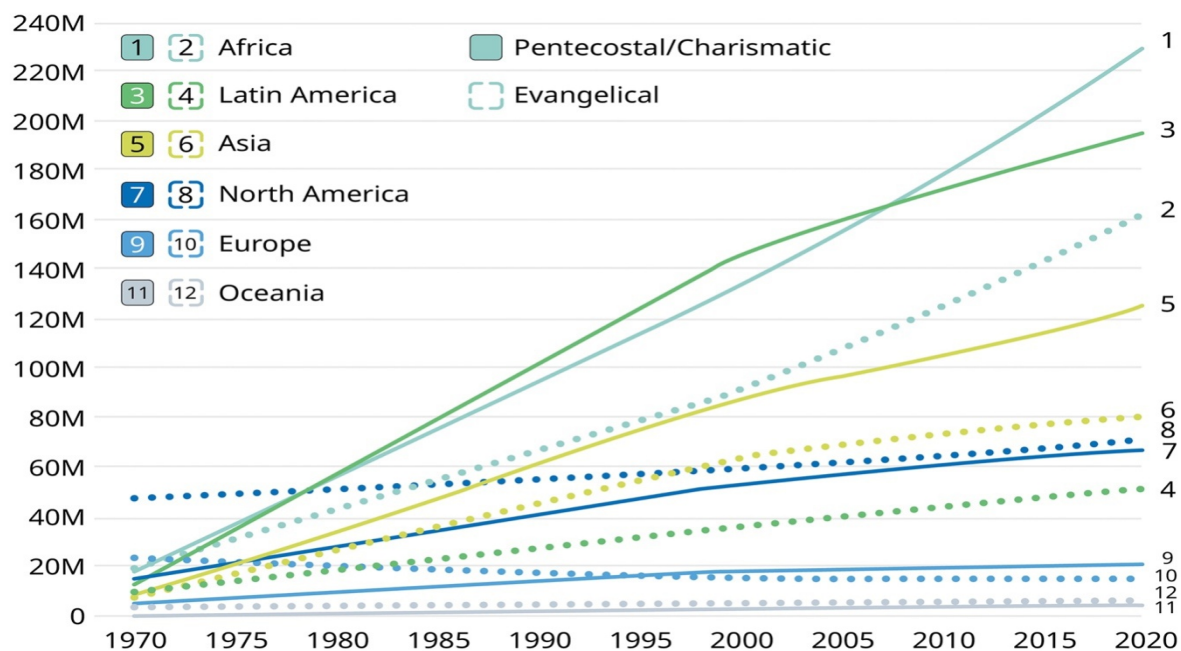
Unreached People by Region- Source: The Joshua Project, 2023

Unreached people groups are those who lack an indigenous church capable of evangelizing their own people. People groups are distinct social groups where shared language and cultural practices create communal belonging.

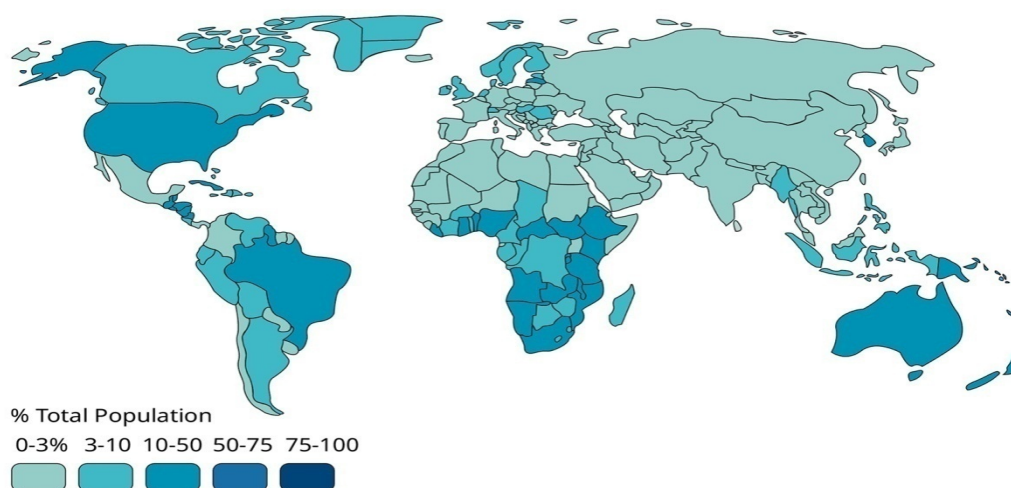
Missionary Challenge

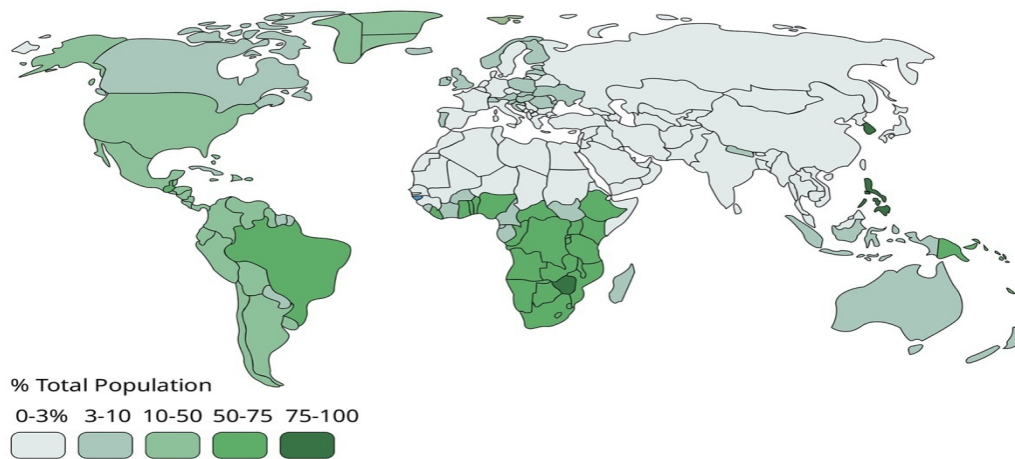
